Developing an improved C&YP's Emotional Wellbeing Service - Identifying and defining the problem

- Rising number of children and young people with emotional health and wellbeing needs in B&NES (similar to national picture).
- Why? Unequal materialist society? Exam pressure? Parental Pressure? Future employment prospects – automation, Brexit? Impact of internet re bullying, body image, etc.?
- Nevertheless, since 75% of adult mental health emerges before 25 y/o and given the long term impact lower educational attainment, risky behaviours etc. then there is a compelling moral, social and economic case for change.

- National Response- Future in Mind₁, March 2015, five key themes:
 - Promoting resilience, prevention and early intervention
 - Improving access to effective support a system without tiers
 - Care for most vulnerable
 - Accountability and transparency
 - Developing the workforce





Developing an improved C&YP's Emotional Wellbeing Service – Local Response

- B&NES CCG wrote the first CAMHS Transformation Plan to secure approximately £333k of NHS funding during 15/16. In November 2016 the plan was updated to reflect plans to spend £476K during 16/17₂.
- CAMHS Transformation Plan2 investment in B&NES (2015/16 and 2016/17) with some financial support from Schools Forum funds
 - Improved Eating Disorder Service
 - Primary Schools; Nurture Outreach Service, counselling, FRIENDS CBT
 - Secondary Schools and College; independent counsellors, Resilience Hubs monthly consultation with named CAMHS worker and mental health awareness training offer
 - KOOTH on-line information, chat, counselling and young people forums
 - PSHE resource packs to schools
 - Workforce development across Children Services, including attachment aware training,
 Mindfulness, Theraplay and Thrive
 - Extended CAMHS support for vulnerable 18 y/o's not eligible for adult mental health services



Developing an improved C&YP's Emotional Wellbeing Service – Recommissioning CAMHS

Current CAMHS required recommissioning.

Locally, we asked Stakeholder about their experience of current service (via LSCB).

Thank you to the 44 responses from Education (125 responses overall). Experiences, including satisfaction with referrals, were quite variable.

Re-Procurement of CAMHS Service

- After a competitive tender, Oxford Health NHS Foundation Trust (current CAMHS provider) has been identified as the preferred bidder
- A new model of provision is being promoted which is based on a "Thrive" framework (next slide). Proposed novel features include
 - a Single Point of Access (triaging will include signposting to advice and guidance as well as Early Help and
 - self referral by CYP and their families
- We are now developing Oxford Health's proposal and need to test and refine model with stakeholders
- Schools will need to play a part in the new system wide service. How would schools like to be involved in developing the model? (All responses to LSCB survey will be considered during service development).
