## Season's Greetings

It's December again and this time last year we were contesting the Council in the Public Inquiry on their Crane Valley proposals. A lot has changed since then and we are pleased to update you on the progress over the last few months.

# **Crane Valley Planning Guidelines**

The council has recently completed a consultation exercise on its revised Crane Valley Planning Guidelines. FORCE submitted a **detailed response** to this and we are aware that many of our members also submitted responses. Last month we met with the Council Planning Officers and they were very responsive to our comments and we are hopeful that many of our proposed amendments to the document will be adopted in the final version when it is published next year.

# **Harlequins Development**

In the meantime the **detailed planning application** from Harlequins was considered by the Council. FORCE attended this meeting and made a number of proposals. We are also pleased to report that each of these were accepted by the Council and Harlequins and are to be included in the detailed Section 106 Agreement for the scheme. The key elements are:

- A strip of land along the Duke of Northumberland's River will be transferred to the Council. This will allow the pathway along this reach to be widened and also increase the potential for the re-introduction of **water voles** to this river.
- A triangle of land, currently in use as part of the training pitch, will be landscaped and provided for public use following the development.
- **Craneford West** playing field will continue in **sole public use** and will not be used as an alternative training pitch for the club.

We shall be working with the Council and Harlequins to implement these components of the scheme.

## **College Proposals**

The College is currently preparing detailed plans for a new campus with associated enabling development. We are in regular meetings with the College to discuss these plans as they develop. We are pleased to say that **Heatham Residents Association** is also taking an active role in these discussions and is looking after residents' interests with respect to broader development and associated traffic issues away from the river corridors. #### Can you tell your Coots from your Moorhens?

We are seeking volunteers to assist with a **water bird survey** along a section of the Crane and Duke of Northumberland's River. The work involves walking a fixed stretch of these rivers (approximately from Twickenham Stadium to the Crane Park Shot Tower) on a number of occasions between mid-March and mid-July. (Ideally, we would prefer volunteers to be able to do at least two such walks). The only necessary skills are to be able to read a large-scale map and to be able to recognise the common water birds likely to be seen along these rivers. Sunday 13 <sup>th</sup> March:	Craneford Playing Fields.	Working on the wall alongside Marsh Farm Lane.
Sunday 10th April:	Crane Park.	Planting reed beds and other native water plants in the river.
