Local Area Energy Plan Survey: City Hall's Infrastructure team has created a survey to gather Londoners' thoughts about greener ways of heating homes. The information gathered will help to create Local Area Energy Plans. Short summary	We are delighted to share that we have received £120,000 funding to provide three larger and more accessible Changing Places toilets in the borough.
	Changing Places toilets are larger accessible toilets with equipment such as hoists, privacy screens, adult-sized changing benches, peninsula toilets (where there is space on both sides of the toilet) and space for carers.
	Three sites have been carefully chosen at Latchmere Recreation Ground, Canbury Gardens and next to the Hook Centre. Members of the community with a Radar key will be able to use them.
	An <u>online changing places survey</u> is open until 29 February 2024 for people to share their views to help us finalise our plans.
	The toilets will be in use by the end of June 2024. You can also find out more from Kingston's Disability Champion Councillor Sue Ansari in this video.
