### **Training For Work - Vocational Training Update**

The Training For Work Team successfully achieved their targets for the recruitment of individuals both in paid and voluntary positions onto National Vocational Qualifications and Apprenticeship programmes in Customer Service, Business Administration and IT during 2+009-10. Keeping the funding close to home they continue close links with RBK, local SME's (small and medium enterprises) and charities as well as extending further afield into Central and Greater London.

Sutton Housing Society (SHS), a new client for KAE signed up all 17 members of staff onto a Customer Service Level 2 NVQ, deciding it a brilliant opportunity to promote excellence in customer care.

Christine Ball, NVQ Assessor was delighted to provide this training combining work place assessments with inhouse workshops over the course of 9 months.

Chris Turton, Chief Executive of SHS explains:

"Sutton Housing Society has been providing rented social housing, mainly for older people, in Sutton for 45 years. As a locally based landlord we pride ourselves on the close relationship we maintain with our

tenants. Social housing has undergone significant changes in the past 20 years - both in terms of its funding and in the way the landlord/tenant relationship is managed. Tenants and prospective tenants are now treated, quite properly, as customers.

The families and relations of those of our tenants who are older or who need more support, although not part of the tenant's household, also

receive a service from us and this effectively expands our customer base.

We are now operating under a new regulatory body (the Tenant Services Authority). This agency, in line with Government policy, want to see tenants given a stronger say in the operation and performance monitoring of social landlords. This new regulatory regime, introduced in April this year, gave us the impetus to put in place customer care training for all of our staff. The training available from Kingston Adult Education is tailored to our business needs both in terms of timing and delivery. The grant funding which came with the training was an added incentive and is particularly valuable to a small organisation such as ours. I think all of our staff,

irrespective of their role in the organisation, have already recognised the benefit of formal training in this area and the increased understanding this gives them of the customer focussed business that we want to be".

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# **Coaching For Success**

Daniel demonstrates how hard work, commitment and a positive attitude whilst on work experience can open up opportunities.

Daniel Harry, who is 20 years old and lives in Surbiton, completed an 8 week voluntary work placement at Fulham Football Club Foundation as part of his Entry to Employment course at Kingston Adult Education's Training for Work unit. Working two full days a week, Daniel assisted with coaching up to seventy 3-14 year olds a week partaking in the Foundation's annual Summer Holiday Courses.

'The placement was very enjoyable and rewarding. I most enjoyed refereeing the tournaments and coaching the 10-11 year olds. Every day we had the cross-bar challenge; a game to see who could hit the cross-bar



from the half way line; I did it once in thirty tries'.

Daniel's highlight was achieving his FA Level 1 Coaching qualification, the first step towards becoming a recognised football coach. Through determination, Daniel has opened up opportunities for himself. After finishing St Phillip's School at the age of 16, he studied at various training establishments to improve his Maths. English and IT. Unfortunately, he had to take 18 months out to recuperate from a serious back operation. He enrolled onto the Entry to **Employment course at Kingston** Adult Education's Training for Work in May 2010. 'I will miss studying at the College and especially all the teachers, they have been very supportive and I would highly recommend this course to anybody. I hope to keep in contact with all the new friends I have made'.

Daniel always knew he wanted to become a full-time coach and this placement has given him vital experience to help him find paid employment. 'Through this placement with Fulham Football Club Foundation, I have improved my communication skills, ability to be patient, confidence and organisational skills. I love everything to do with football both watching and learning the rules of the game. Given that I enjoy working outside and prefer practical work, this is the ideal type of work for

For anybody in two minds about doing a work placement Daniel has the following advice: 'Have a go, you really have nothing to lose. It's simple really, make sure you attend and do what is expected of you and you are bound to have fun and most importantly improve your skills along the way'.



Daniel is due to start his BTEC Diploma in Sport and Leisure at Kingston College in September 2010. He is also hoping to get paid work as a coach.



We are all very proud of Daniel and everyone at Kingston Adult Education Training for Work wishes him all the best for a successful career.
