Scunthorpe and District Choral Society Health and Safety Policy and Procedure

The Scunthorpe and District Choral Society will:-

- 1. Provide adequate control of the health and safety risks arising from its activities by undertaking risk assessments
- 2. Provide and maintain safe equipment and conditions
- 3. Ensure safe handling and use of substances
- 4. Ensure members are competent to do their tasks and give them adequate training
- 5. Try to prevent accidents and cases of ill health which may be related to membership of the Society
- 6. Review and revise this policy as necessary at regular intervals

All members have a duty to ensure their own safety. Overall and final responsibility for health and safety is that of the committee.

Members should:-

- a. Co-operate with the committee
- b. Adhere to any safety rules set down for the building in which a rehearsal or concert is held.
- c. Not interfere with anything provided to safeguard their health and safety
- d. Take reasonable care of their own health and safety
- e. Report all health and safety concerns to a member of the committee

Findings of risk assessments will be reported to the committee which will check that the implemented actions have removed/reduced the risks.

All new equipment should be checked to ensure it meets health and safety standards.

This policy will be reviewed every two years.
