
Stage 12 of the Thames Path started at Wandsworth, just before Wandsworth Bridge.

We came to the Peace Pagoda in Battersea Park.




The next bridge was Chelsea Bridge,

The Houses of Parliament were on the opposite bank of the river.




Lambeth Palace was on our side of the river. Outside it, there was a memorial to the

Up to this point, we had had easy walking with relatively few other people around. From Westminster Bridge to London Bridge, there were dense throngs of vast numbers of people.


We saw the London Eye, with long queues awaiting entrance.
