

THE WICKERMAN

Friday 20 October



Thriller, fantasy or musical. art house film or horror flick? undisputed cult classic. Call it what you will, there's no doubt that The Wicker Man is a truly great film. In the words of director Robin Hardy, 'there has never been a film like this' - and there probably never will.

The Wicker Man is a 1973 British mystery horror film. It stars Edward Woodward, Britt Ekland, Diane Cilento, Ingrid Pitt, and Christopher Lee. The screenplay centres on the visit of Police Sergeant Neil Howie to the isolated island of Summerisle, in search of a missing girl. Howie, a devout Christian, is appalled to find that the inhabitants of the island have abandoned Christianity and now practise a form of Celtic paganism.

Cinefantastique described it as "The Citizen Kane of horror movies", in 2004 Total Film magazine named The Wicker Man the 6th greatest British film of all time. It also won the 1978 Saturn Award for Best Horror Film and during the 2012 Summer Olympics opening ceremony the film was included as part of a celebrated sequence that British cinema. Apparently Christopher Lee's desire to walk away from Dracula was so great that he reportedly agreed to play the starring role of Lord Summerisle for free. Lee declared The Wicker Man to be "the best film I've ever been in, the best part I've ever had. And -not that I'm a judge at all-the best performance I've ever given."
