NEWS

A digital projector has been purchased and will be permanently mounted in the hall available to hirers. Thank you to all individuals and local groups that made donations towards this project and this will add to a hall that is already a very attractive hire venue. The floor refurbishment is scheduled for August 14th until 21st August and this will include a total sanding and repair of the hall floor followed by polish and sealing. Two full days of non-use will be needed to allow sealant to dry.

The Trustees have also decided to replace the 'cowlings' on the hall roof. These are very dated and in need of repair and it is suspected they leak rainwater when the wind is in a specific direction.

The old air vents on the car park side of the hall have been removed and replaced with matching brickwork. Also, the water heater in the Gender Free toilet has been renewed and is now operational again.

Friday afternoon and Friday evening every other week are the only sessions that are not booked for regular hire during the school term time.

The Munson room can be hired separately and has room for a small group of 10-15 people with toilet and tea making facilities.

The hall offers excellent facilities at very reasonable rates and I encourage those who do not know the hall to arrange a visit and acquaint yourselves with the building.



June was a busy month for us with our annual plant sale and visits to the Little Bentley Show and RHS Gardens at Wisley.

It rained all the way to Wisley and most of the way back but it was dry and bright all the time we were there. The building work at the entrance had been completed and new work started at the opposite end of the site. There was a marquee housing their Specialist Plant Show where there was a spectacular array of plants including delphiniums, sweet peas, succulents, pitcher plants and bonsai. In addition there were demonstrations and short talks with question and answer sessions, covering the upkeep of these plants. In the trial fields the peonies were particularly beautiful, many of them scented with huge double heads, not at all like the lesser specimens I have at home. I also enjoyed their wild flower meadow trials, one of which was the Olympics 2012 mix.

Our second day trip of the year has been scheduled for **22nd September to the National Trust Blickling Estate in Norfolk. This trip is open to everybody** at a maximum cost of £30 per person (there is a £13 deduction for National Trust members and a £2 deduction for our society members). This is a magnificent Jacobean Mansion, once the home of the Boleyn Family, set in 4500 acres. The gardens include a moat, ancient yew hedges, parterre with double borders, garden ornaments, topiary, and a walled kitchen garden. COCKAYNES WOOD AND NATURE RESERVE

The reserve is looking really colourful at the moment as the Summer flowers are coming into bloom. The Cuckoo has been visiting every day but will soon be leaving to fly back to Africa on its annual migration. We have also been very privileged to have Turtle Doves and for the first time in many years a Nuthatch has been seen. There are lots of butterflies and dragonflies about at the moment too.

The annual Activity Day on 30th June was very successful and lots of children enjoyed the usual pond dipping. This year we introduced a new pebble painting activity which was hugely popular too with the children going to find their own stones.



This year we also had an open Moths, Bats and Glow Worms night on 5th July.

We have been monitoring the wild flowers and grasses over the past few years and have now reached at least 170 different species some of which are quite rare. As the reserve develops the numbers of insect varieties rises too.

GLYN'S WILDLIFE UPDATE

As we enter the summer and spring passage of birds abates, there is a short period where insects attract greater interest and where we establish which summer visitors have stayed to breed.

As lucky as we are to have such a breadth and diversity of wildlife, we also have a few rarities in the area.

Turtle Doves are at a critical low but fortunately, we have at least 3 pairs holding territory in the area. Once a common sight and sound, the purring call of the Turtle Dove brings a sense of excitement and relief.



The male pictured was singing and displaying close to the gravel works at the bottom of Ford Lane.

Although its population trajectory is moving healthily



in the right direction, Marsh Harriers are still a rare breeding bird, now spreading across most southern parts of the UK. We have several birds in the area and two established breeding sites. Not so long ago, when I was a

boy, there was only one pair in the entire country at the Minsmere RSPB reserve in Suffolk.

In the last few days a Corn Bunting has also been

heard singing. They are established in small numbers at locations along the Colne and Crouch estuaries where good habitat remains. Although brown and streaky in appearance, their song is a beautiful composition of ringing



notes, recalling a jangling of keys...

Autumn, to all intents and purposes, is under way, with the first few flocks of wading birds returning from their breeding grounds to our important estuarine stop-offs. Many will now be in moult and at times will find it difficult to fly, having flown many miles to be here and with flight feathers compromised by the autumn moult. It is important not to disturb them if possible, as taking flight unnecessarily at such times burns energy reserves to dangerous lows.

Please bear this in mind when enjoying the estuary.





CHAIRMAN'S REPORT from Cllr Frank Belgrove

The object of this report is to keep residents up to date on the current key projects, plans and decisions of Alresford Parish Council and to offer general information on the work of the Council. For full Council meeting minutes please see the Parish Council website, view them on social media or visit the Parish Council office (by prior appointment with the Clerk). Meeting agendas are published on the website, social media and on the two village notice boards.

Grant income:

Each year Alresford Parish Council budgets to fund a range of important projects and to finance everyday expenditure. To supplement money raised from local taxation (The Precept) we try our best to obtain grants. For example, we obtained a grant to finance the Neighbourhood Plan and to help pay for our newly appointed village handy-person. The latest grant we have successfully been awarded is for just under £500 and is for a poly-tunnel for the village allotments. The award is from the Community Initiative Fund Micro Grant arrangement operated by the Essex Association of Local Councils. Last year we received significant income from grants, pavilion rental and re-cycling - this amounted to £38,000.

The Neighbourhood Plan:

Residents will be pleased to know that the long-awaited draft of the Alresford Neighbourhood Plan is to be put before the Parish Council for approval. There is still a little way to go before the referendum and final adoption of the Plan but the excellent work of the Neighbourhood Plan steering group has come to fruition and our policy writer has finalised policies to guide future development in Alresford. An advance copy of the draft plan will soon go to Tendring District Council (TDC) so they can undertake screening for a Strategic Environmental Assessment and Habitats Regulations Assessment (statutory procedures for all Neighbourhood Plans).

Highways issues:

Essex County Council is the Highways Authority with responsibility for roads, pavements and some (but not all) streetlights. Alresford Parish Council will take forward complaints and suggestions on highways matters to Essex County Council but powers of a Parish Council to carry out highways works are restricted. Alresford Parish Council is now engaged in a pilot scheme to take over certain highways tasks from Essex County Council and it will be interesting to see how this arrangement will impact on our village as regards attending to the tasks that seem to

be neglected by the County Council. To be fair to the County Council their central government grants have been cut by millions of pounds.

Tendring District Council (TDC) currently has responsibility for weed control on our streets, however visits to Alresford and many other villages by their operatives is not taking place quickly enough to deal with rapid weed growth. Unattended growth is now excessive and the Parish Council has taken action and has instructed our own contractors to deal with the problem on initially a one off basis. Not every area has been covered and it is hoped the eventual weed spraying by TDC will deal with some of the outlying areas. Likewise, stray branches sticking out from non privately owned hedging on the B1027 will be attended to by our local contractor.

Parish Council roles and responsibilities:

Parish Councils are the first tier of local government and have a range of powers but their role is not to act as a Planning Authority (Tendring District Council) or as a Highways Authority (Essex County Council). It is so important that residents are aware of the responsibilities of the different Councils. Alresford Parish Council owns and operates the village playing field area and the associated infrastructure such as play equipment, hard court, skate park and car park. The Pavilion is owned under lease by the Parish Council. The Parish Council owns almost all litter bins in the Parish and pays for them to be emptied. Most grass verges in the village are cut by Parish Council contractors. Many streetlights are our responsibility as are the allotments and the War Memorial. In addition there are a range of powers available that give us the ability to provide a Police and Community Support Officer and to challenge and scrutinise both Essex County Council and Tendring District Council. The Parish Council is often the first point of call for complaints about a wide range of village issues, the Clerk then has to disseminate from the complaints exactly what the Parish Council can do to help sometimes we do not have the powers to become involved in a matter but we always do our very best for the community whenever we can.

We need your help:

The Parish Council is planning ahead for the next five years and needs input from the community as to what projects in the village require our involvement. If any resident or business owner has ideas that they feel should be put into our five year plan please e-mail the Parish Council Clerk or contact a Councillor (see contact list).

Hedges and Public Rights of Way:

Neglected hedges can soon encroach onto the highway. Enforcement of the law is a last resort so please can we all make sure that if we have roadside/pavement side hedging it does not impede

pedestrian or traffic from passing safely. Complaints to the Council about hedging must be reasonable and proportionate.

Landowners are responsible for most Public Rights of Way that cross their land e.g. Farm land and riverside paths. These must be kept passable at all times.

Alresford Family Fun Day

The Parish Council thanks the Alresford Fete Organising Group for all their hard work in putting together a wonderful event for the village.

Further consultation is important for us to know what you like and dislike in our preparation. We are a small group acting on behalf of the village residents and you will make the final decision as to whether the Neighbourhood Plan is accepted or not in a Referendum as it will have power equal to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) and the Tendring District Local Plan. It is therefore being written by a consultant with expertise in this field and the draft will be delivered to us soon.

This is your village and your Neighbourhood Plan.

It is your opportunity to influence and control how Alresford evolves.






ALRESFORD PARISH COUNCIL COMMUNITY AWARDS
