

URGENT APPEAL

be a very last resort but never the less could be forced on the Management committee if the very important position of Treasurer is not filled.

It is only a matter of days and Father Christmas will be bringing 2023's must have gadgets and items of fishing tackle.

It is also the time to sort through tackle boxes to remove redundant tackle and unused gadgets to make room for their replacements. I am not suggesting that most anglers are hoarders, but we do tend to carry just about everything bar the proverbial kitchen sink. Gone are the days when our one rod was tied to the bike's cross-bar, or to create a crossbar, with only a float, and hook as tackle and a tin of maggots for bait. Bread was also a multifunctional bait, which was generally eaten by the would-be angler if the fish weren't biting, Luncheon meat being another dietary supplement.

Hopefully you have had just such an idyllic season, where certainly the sun shone every day and the fish were as cooperative. The down side to this season has been the lack of rain which has resulted in the lakes water levels dropping substantially. Thankfully November has certainly started off with some heavy showers which hopefully will carry on through the winter months to return the water table and lake levels back to normal.

All the club's lakes bird-life has started its seasonal swap around. The Cygnets on Alresford Lake, the Arthur Bareham Lake, are now practising test flights up and down the lakes and the young Grebes are being chased away by their parents to go their own way. Kingfishers are still very active on the Orchard and Alresford Lakes and they will remain so throughout the winter and hopefully if the lakes freeze over it will only be for a short time or some spots will remain clear of ice to enable

them to dive for food. The Abbey Lake is now back open, and the Bantams will remind you to feed them by pecking your ankles. The return of Canada and Greylag geese for winter roosting along with several species of migratory ducks and birds are signs that Winter is upon us. Peace has finally been declared throughout the Coot population and this will remain so until the onset of Spring when every inch of surface water will be argued over on daily basis.

Can we take this opportunity to wish all our members and friends a very Happy Christmas and a Peaceful New Year and thank you all for the tremendous support you have provided to enable the purchase by the club of the Grinsted Orchard Lakes to proceed. By the time you have read this, Sir Bernard Jenkins will have visited the Grinsted Orchard Lakes in November and we are keen to impress upon him our intention to create a space free of development where wildlife flourishes and our members can embrace the calm and beauty of the surrounding area.

Hopefully, on the 10th December your name will be drawn out of the hat by Russell Milburn, Chairman from the Village Hall, and you are now in possession of one of the excellent prizes donated by D&P Online Fishing at Brightlingsea or seasonal fare from generous club members.

Ukraine Update

Everything changed on February 24th.

Initially the team supported refugees in Romania and Moldova but in recent months the focus has been delivering aid packages together with messages of hope to families and elderly people who have no other sources of support in the war zone and villages around Odesa.

Alongside this, the team supports other aid work, such as contributing to a church initiative to provide clean water for people in Mykolaiv, where the water supply system collapsed due to bombardments.

In recent weeks the team has reopened some of the Bible clubs, The campaign 'childhood for the children' includes games and craft, but also teaching sessions for those suffering from trauma. These clubs bring a semblance of normality to these communities.

We have received many gifts for Ukraine this year and the largest has been from Christian Hope International, the team in Ukraine join me in thanking you for your amazing generosity. The need is as urgent as ever!

ALRESFORD PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

December 2022 / January 2023

Highways

The scrapping of the Highways Devolution Grant Funding scheme by Essex County Council came as a surprise to all Councils in the scheme, including Alresford Parish Council. The scheme had meant we had delegated powers to carry out non carriageway works and deal with such matters as damaged and missing road signs. All current projects under the delegated powers have been completed, the latest being the fitting of the replacement "Welcome to Alresford" sign with the Tendring logo, this sign was installed outside Mitchell's Farm shop on the B1027.

Alresford Parish Council is taking part in discussions with our County Councillor and Essex Highways to enable certain highway works to be carried out by the Parish Council even without us being part of any designated scheme.

This would mean local financing but at least jobs would be tackled, as ECC Highways can take many months or even years to deal with certain highways issues. We will not, of course, be able to undertake carriageway repairs.

St Peter's Church Car Parking

Potholes and areas of soft ground in the car parking area at St Peter's and the War Memorial have been attended to. Excavation of the car park has taken place; hardcore materials have been used to fill areas of soft ground and a surface dressing of gravel has been put down. The Parish Council is grateful to one of our local contractors for the standard of the works and the scheduling of repairs to avoid funeral parking. We also note the excellent work of our footpath volunteers who have been cutting back excessive vegetation in the area.

Environment

The heading "environment" covers so much in the world of a Parish Council and the latest topic for consideration concerns resident's high fuel bills. Energy debt and the issues raised by the high cost of energy for domestic users is a real concern. The Council has been invited to enter a project financed by Essex County Council and backed by the Essex Climate Change Commission. The Co-operative "Community Energy Colchester" is running the scheme and there are no charges involved for Alresford Parish Council or residents. Free visits and a

supply of energy saving measures to residents is part of the scheme (draft excluder fittings/radiator reflectors/advice on energy debt reduction etc). A small financial donation to community energy Colchester can be made and free consultations can be booked at repairreuse@gmail.com or by telephone on 07799 494 797.

A petition has been received by the Council asking for facilities for the off lead exercising of dogs in the village. One aspect of the petition called for the modification of the 1993 Bylaw that only permits disabled person's dogs being allowed on the village sports and recreation ground. A counter petition has also been organised against any revocation of existing laws. The Environment Working Party will be considering reports and one possible and feasible solution is for an area of land to be made available at some location, other than the recreation ground, for the exercising of dogs off their leads. We are really blessed in Alresford to have so many fine country walks for our dogs and the initial petition organisers have recognised that but would like an open area of land to be made available, if possible.

In October Cllr Sue Hammick cut the ribbon to officially open the electric vehicle charging points in the car park following the successful trial period. Cllr Hammick has been instrumental in negotiating the free installation of the EV points and has worked on many other environmental issues for the community.


