


#### ST ANDREW'S REFLECTIONS

Hopefully you have all enjoyed a relaxing and productive summer of fishing. All the lake levels have remained up, despite the long dry spell during August.

The amount donated to St Helena Hospice was £500 in total, which included raffle money raised from the charity angling match and further donations made by the club and members toward this worthy cause. A big thank you to all involved.

The Arthur Bareham Lake at Alresford has had an influx of small Carp supplied Tony Wignall of Houchins Farm Lakes. Tony has large Carp and Catfish in his lakes and the fish supplied came from a stock pond. There was a selection of Commons, Mirrors and Fully Scaled Mirrors. All the fish were inspected by the Environment Agency and will make a welcome addition to the lake's stock and should start showing next year onward.

The club has introduced a Close Season for Pike in the Alresford lake. This will stop all pike fishing from 15<sup>th</sup> March through to the 15<sup>th</sup> October but will be dependent on weather conditions. An early Spring could result in the season ending early and a late summer could result in the season starting later. The rules surrounding Pike fishing are displayed in the web-site and also on the club's Clubmate page.

The maintenance team will soon be commencing repairs to swims and access paths along with trimming back vegetation and shrubs. Volunteers are always welcome and whatever task you take on will be well within your capabilities. The Club has been in contact with the Essex Nature Partnership to gain advice and assistance with the increase of wildlife and habitat around our lakes as an ongoing project.

Please ensure you clear up behind yourselves and take any litter away that has been left by others. The car park at the top of the Alresford Lake seems to be a hot spot for dumping plastic bottles and containers. This is not left by anglers but picked up by them!

As always, enjoy your fishing, stay safe and look out for one another

#### **HEARING LOSS**

In 2023 I wrote a short article on being hard of hearing, at that time I only had 16% hearing which made my life very difficult.

I was referred by my GP to the local ENT department at the Primary Care Centre, and following a consultation I was referred to Addenbrookes Hospital in Cambridge. Here I was given numerous hearing tasks to assess my hearing levels, it was at this stage I was identified at having lost 84% of my hearing. This was quite a shock. My hearing loss was then discussed at a later meeting of ENT Consultants and Audiologists, where it was agreed I would benefit from a Cochlear Implant. These implants are costly, approximately £20,000 per implant but are available on the NHS. There is no age limit to these, children and adults of all ages are considered. Some 90 plus year olds have benefited.

The surgery is a day case, Two weeks after my surgery I had my implant activated, for the first time in a very long time I could hear speech quite clearly. Four further appointments took place following activation, where my implant was finetuned as I began to adapt to hearing once again. It takes the brain time to relearn hearing; ass a result of this, I now have 78% hearing. Not perfect but it has given me my life/confidence back.

I can now hold conversations and not have to rely on someone helping me. Telephone calls are now my latest challenge and finally it will be music. I will always have areas where my hearing could be better, but I am grateful to have 78%. It all takes time and patience.

As stated in my previous article, please seek help, it really can improve your quality of life and those around you. It is a health problem and nothing to be ashamed of.

#### ALRESFORD BIKERS -RACKING UP THE MILES IN THE SUN

Following the Spring we had, and all the rain that seemed to fall every day, the weather has improved dramatically lately. Our activity was a little suppressed at the time, owing to the constant monsoons. But, recently it has been nice, sunny, and hot, so we're out riding!

We have enjoyed a number of Sunday Rides, and some midweek rides for those of us not at work (retired). We call them "Shirkers not Workers Rides". We sometimes use these to check out places kindly suggested to us by friends as potential Sunday Rides, so that we don't turn up in numbers and find them unsuitable. Almost always they are lovely places and we've found some really nice hidden gems, but just occasionally there is somewhere with too many issues for our riders - for example a great place but nowhere to stop and park half a dozen bikes, or worse. I myself checked out a cafe recommended to me, some way away, that receives great reviews on line, and it would have been great except that just before the place itself, there was a ford, full of green slime and weed, with no grip at all. No problem in a car, out and out lethal on a bike. Dang, that water was cold too! Several of us have just today returned from another Shirker's Ride, via a previously unused route (not lost, "exploring"), and what a lovely ride that was! Bacon stick, with the bread baked this morning in Lavenham, not to be missed!

A few Sunday Rides ago we visited Parham Airfield too, where there is a museum jam packed with so much stuff we're going to have to have a repeat visit. A great place, lovely ride to it, and the tea and cake were lovely too! Another lovely surprise one Sunday was at Orford, where we were moseying to the tea room (make that bee-lining!) across the car park when in drove a completely unrestored Model T Ford! Its number plate said 1913 on it. It was lovely and drew a crowd in no time, including us.

We try to ride out to places and events of some kind every week, and last weekend as I write this was Copdock Bike Show. An annual event, there is something there for everyone, and even non-bikers would probably have a great time. Several of us went, early in the morning just to avoid the crowds later. The show itself has grown massively since it started more than 30 years ago, and this year was even bigger than last.

There were traders of all sorts, and everything that you can imagine was available for sale. There is literally everything anyone could ask for, with a suitable variety of food outlets, bike dealerships with all the latest machines, displays and exhibitions of classic and modern machines, stunt riders, trials display riding, riding school demonstrations with "have a go" bikes. Imagine thinking to yourself "I want to ride a bike" and having the opportunity to have a quick try out? Doing that with 5,000 riders watching takes some nerve! I watched a young lady have her first ever ride; the instructor guided her around in a big circle several times, she started and stopped several times, she didn't fall off, and I could see the smile on her face inside the helmet from a hundred vards away. For my friend Chris and I the place took so long to walk round that we had to stop

a couple of times for ahem, tea, homemade sausage rolls, etc. Rumours of me hitting the Pie and Cheese van twice in a day are quite untrue. It was three times. Anyway, it was a great day, and every time we go to that event the sun comes out, and we have a great time.

So, what's next? We have Sunday Rides, some to the seaside, some away from it to avoid the tourist congestion. We still have Shirker's Rides to do, and we still have our meetings. So, if you want to join in, or just talk about bikes, bikers, biking, or anything related, just turn up! We meet on the second Friday of every month in HQ, The Pointer Inn, where we are always welcomed by our hosts Neil and Sam.

## ALRESFORD PARISH CHAIRMAN'S REPORT October/November 2024

#### **Update on Projects**

In the last report (August/September) in the Alresford Advertiser I mentioned that the Parish Council had applied for an £8,000 grant from the Rural England Prosperity Fund in order for our Solar Panel project for the Pavilion building to proceed. We now have that grant and the Council thanks our Proper Officer, Mr Matt Cooke, for his work on the application documentation. Generating our own electricity for the community building will save the local taxpayer money in the long term.

The other project we wish to progress is the installation of a publicly accessible modular toilet block for the playing field and the Council has instructed a specialist company to lay a new sewer in preparation for delivery of the toilet bock. Again, we are fortunate to be able to use grant money towards the preparatory works.

Maintaining our facilities on the playing field to a high standard is so important and in this regard the Council is considering upgrading the fenced hard-court area. The playing surface needs replacing, and equipment requires upgrading. A Council Working Party will discuss options and report back to the Council. The intention is to use Planning Gain monies for these works.

#### Highways.

The Parish Council has intervened twice to carry out kerbstone repairs in the Coppice Road area (although it has no duty to do this) and we have now formed a Council Working Party to carry out investigations into what progress can be made at County level on this issue.

Essex Highways has received Government money and has purchased new machinery for roadside hedge and vegetation cutting and is to undertake a comprehensive programme of roadside hedge cutting across Essex. Hopefully this will improve roadside footpaths for pedestrians in Alresford . In the case of hedges owned by landowners (farmers etc) one letter will be sent by Highways giving notice to trim any obstructive hedging — if the landowner does not comply then Highways will cut the hedge and send invoices to the landowner. The Parish Council has voted to also instruct our Clerk to send advice letters to landowners if hedges are not attended to. We do not send letters during the off season for landowner hedges. September to March are the months farmers and other landowners roadside hedges should be cut back.

#### **Litter and Litter Bins**

During the summer months it was apparent that at times some of the litter and dog waste bins were not being emptied in a timely manner. Tendring District Council (using Veolia contractors) carries out the majority of bin emptying. There is an issue on the Staunton Gate estate due to the protracted hand-over period and once the Parish Council has full oversight of the area we hope to organise bin emptying more promptly. It is disappointing that some residents leave waste on the ground when bins are full.

The Parish Council continually presses for a better service but thanks our Handyman, Jason, for his interventions to clear overflowing bins.

A replacement bin has been installed at The Creek as the previous bin was fire damaged by vandals. We hope visitors use the bin.

There are some amazing volunteers including parents with children that carry out litter picks in the community and we are all so grateful for this, how good it would be though if everyone respected our village and did not drop litter in the first place!

#### **Horse Riding**

We only have one bridleway unfortunately, and so in the main, riders are using the roadways and lanes for their rides. Safety is so important and the Council has been approached to see if improvements can be made. Signage can help with awareness and the Council is looking at possible sites where they would be useful. In addition, the Council will position advisory posters asking vehicle drivers to be horse rider aware. It is so good to see horse and rider out and about but they do need other road users to treat them with caution — so low speeds and no sudden noises!

#### **Policing**

The PCSO/Policing page of this magazine deals with all policing matters however as a partnership worker with the police Parish and Town Councils have significant input into law and order. There have been one or two recent events that have caused concern — anti-social behaviour and aggravated burglary have been reported on more than one occasion. It is worth noting though that arrests have made and charges have followed. We are grateful for the work our PCSO does and thank Essex Police for their recent interventions.

#### **Planning**

When considering a home extension or other major building work it is often worthwhile discussing the matter with the owner of any nearby property that might be impacted, this can save time, money and peace of mind in the future. Planning consultants will assist with the design and legalities but so much can be smoothed over by a neighbourly discussion. Alresford Parish Council is contacted by the TDC Planning Dept for comment on most planning applications and we hopefully give fair and lawful consideration to planning applications. Issues though that can lead to legal challenges later between parties could often have been dealt with by a friendly chat over the garden fence!

#### **Allotments**

Those on the waiting list for Staunton Gate allotment plots have all been contacted and the first eighteen residents listed will soon be allocated plot numbers now that the site has been laid out. Although formal handover to the Parish Council has not happened yet the Parish Council has started managing the allotment area.

#### In conclusion

The Parish Council does what it can to maintain and improve facilities and the public realm of the village. If anyone has suggestions for further improvements or indeed if some matter needs addressing then please contact a Councillor or the Clerk. A public forum at the start of each main Parish Council meeting is useful for long term matters but for most maintenance matters or general queries an e-mail or phone call to a Councillor or the Clerk should be adequate, and the matter will be responded to.




