

After a wet and windy start to the year March has opened with sunshine, although still frosty. Some of our stalwart match anglers have had to crack the ice before commencing fishing. Match weights have been down at present due to low water temperatures but should start to pick up as the water warms although the Abbey has produced some nice 1lb+ Roach. Pike have been few and far between from Alresford Lake but they were mostly double figures and in good condition. The Close season for Pike will end on the 15th March and will include all lure fishing on Alresford Lake only.

The lakes have had their water quality tested and show an average ph value of around 8 which is good, Bramley was slightly down on the other lakes, but this is down to leaf fall in the water.

The club's AGM will be held on the 2nd May at 20:00hrs (8pm in old money) at Alresford Village Hall. Membership renewals will be due in May and the new season starts on the 1st June.

The new season's match list will be entered onto the web page along with the amended competition rules. Please watch notices for date and venue alterations.

Most of thee major clearing has been completed now, in time for nesting. Pathways, swims etc, will continue to be managed through the oncoming season and again any help with this will always be appreciated.

REFLECTIONS

Our garden is very long and quite thin, shielded on the southern side by our neighbours' very tall conifers. This is no problem in the summer, but we are immersed into nuclear winter after mid October, with no sun touching a blade of grass, and the moss in the lawn really coming into its own. On the rare occasion that it snows, once the thaw sets in, all the back gardens of our road are green and promising, whilst ours alone still looks like Narnia. Now, here we are in April, and what a difference the arrival of spring has made; the washing blows in sunshine on the line; the sun shafts through the windows to be tracked by an ecstatic dog as it pools on the carpet; warmed green shoots emerge through the soil and from the branches of the trees. I don't mind winter at all, because this is what is waiting after it, laden with the promises of lunch outside, and resonating with the fragrance of cut grass.

It seems to me that everyone I know has been through periods of darkness, when light seemed limited, and the end too far away to be clung to. The reasons may be varied, but the feeling is the same: desolation and disbelief, with an inability to see hope. But warmth does return, and life does rebuild: sometimes so slowly and hesitantly that we don't notice, occasionally turning into a slightly differently shaped reality. At Easter, we think of that space between Good Friday and Easter Sunday, when all seemed lost and no one could believe that Jesus was gone, when winter seemed to have triumphed. But the sun will always be stronger than the dark. Sometimes we just have to wait for it to arrive.

ALRESFORD BIKERS -SEASONAL LIGHTS TURN GREEN

It seems like ages since I last wrote to tell you all about our coming year. This Winter seems to have dragged on even longer than previous ones, and never-ending rain and endless gloom hasn't helped at all. But, as you will remember it takes a lot more than a spot of damp to stop AB riders from having some fun, and we've been riding all over the place already this year, indeed some of us never stopped. Year-round riders are a pretty tough bunch, but it has been at times quite difficult, and not just because it has been cold. Mud has been a major issue this Winter. If you think it feels sketchy in a car, imagine how we're feeling as a tyre lets go on the stuff.

Still, we have had some good news! Several lovely cafes have been visited, and many of the more local roads traversed by the AB crew, all safely too. Another thing that we get regular reminders of (by the mud!) is the massive range of cleaning products that are now available. The huge span of newer kinds of cleaners and lubricants, including some very specialised ones, is mind-boggling, and some more have been added in the past few years too. But out of all that, some new breeds of protectants have become available and we can firmly recommend some, having tried them out over the past Winter, with good outcomes. Come meet with us and find out which are worth the money!

So, what else is happening with the bikers? We're not always wobbling about on the filthy, potholed moonscape; sometimes we're ogling new machines, or watching others testing them, and looking forward to seeing them in the flesh. There are hints among us of at least one new bike in the wind, and we're looking forward to going riding together too. And it turned up this morning for a ride. See picture! But, since I last pounded



out an article for you dear reader, not a great deal has actually happened. It's more about considering what we want to do this year right now. Many of us are planning our Summer trips, and we'll be spreading out all over the country, and on the continent too. As well as that, we're still mulling over which events to go to this year, as there are more events in the calendar than we can participate in already, and thanks to our members alerting me as well, they are still coming! It looks like we'll be going to the Suffolk Classic Bike Show, on 6 April and if this is out after then, you've missed it! Or maybe you'd like the White Horse Custom and Classic Charity Bike Show on 13 April, or perhaps St Georges Day Bike Show at Kesgrave? Contact us for further details of these few events, they're all run for charity. We'll be visiting some new establishments, trying out their tea and bacon sarnies too.

Apart from these events there are all our regular Sunday Rides, Mid-week rides for those of us who have retired, (contact me to join in the loop) where we visit places that are closed on Sundays, or maybe to try out new ones before inflicting the AB riders on them. These rides tend to be a little bit more

explorational and we often go test out places we haven't been before first to ensure we can actually park there, as I know of at least two that are difficult for bikes. One involves a Ford, which is permanently green slime at the bottom and is always lethal to bikes, and the other has no off-road parking so we avoid it. There are some that have proper parking with cameras and so on, good site security if the bikes are actually out of eyeshot for us, which is always reassuring. Others are just nice, quiet and relaxing places to visit that we enjoy. Anyway, we are getting more and more out and about now, and as car drivers will have lost the habit of looking out for us over Winter, now is the time to start keeping that extra eye out for us!

Twitchers Paradise

Who would have thought that our little Alresford Village would become a twitchers paradise. But over the months of January and February, Ornithologists have flocked to our village from all over the country to observe what some have described as the most spectacular aerial displays that they have ever seen.

The person we must thank for this is Farmer, Noel Tinneveld who planted a crop of special seed the latter part of last year in Church Meadows. The fields at both sides of St Peters Church were planted with seeds which have been described to me as Cereals, Brassicas and Oilseed. By January and February of this year, wild birds started to gather. I understand that some of the species of birds have not been seen in Alresford since the early 1970's.

I managed to spear to several numbers of birdwatchers who had gathered on the Meadows together with their binoculars and cameras. The excitement I gleaned from them was something you had to be there to behold. The joy on some of their faces was absolutely mind boggling. Some had never seen some of the species that were present.

I spoke at length to a local birdwatcher called Richard who came from Kirby le Soken who explained to me what he and his colleagues had witnessed over the last couple of weeks in Church Meadows. He said he had seen Goldfinch, Greenfinch, Thrush, Reed Bunting and Corn Bunting but what had taken his breadth away were the flights of 600-700 Linnets and between 200-300 Chaffinch, also spotted were Bramblings that had flown in from Scandinavia. It looked as if there were a lot more in flight, but Richard explained that from a distance both Linnets and Chaffinch look the same.

Another thing that Richard explained was that Greenfinch are becoming a dying breed; this is because humans are killing them by trying to be kind. He went on to explain that we put out bird feed in our garden feeders but because we fail to clean the bottoms of the feeders a deadly fungus causes their death.

So please join me in thanking Noel Tinneveld for making this possible.

ALRESFORD PARISH CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Chairman Alresford Parish Council: Cllr Frank Belgrove

Awards

A quite outstanding result for Alresford in the Essex Playing Field of the Year Competition (run by the Essex Playing Fields Association). Alresford Parish Council has won the competition for the Best Kept Village Playing Field in Essex, for the third year in succession. The award covers all the Council provided provisions on the playing field site. The judging included the Pavilion, football pitches, play area, skate park and hard court. An individual gold certificate was awarded for the standards of maintenance and the diversity of the play equipment found in the children's play area.

The mainly volunteer-maintained football pitch received a runner-up award. There were just over one hundred entries to the whole competition. The Council thanks staff, contractors and volunteers for all their amazing hard work. Awards are nice to have but providing top quality facilities for residents is the main goal and the award is a recognition of this.

Toilet Block

A new public toilet block has been installed near the entrance to the playing field.



Highways

The railway bridge (the viaduct!) weight restriction on the B1027 continues to cause issues as HGVs divert along Wivenhoe Road and also use Coach Road. Both Essex County Council Highways and Network Rail have been approached on a number of occasions but to date they cannot give a completion time-scale when safety works are to be completed. The proposed relocation of concrete batching works to Lufkins Farm, Great Bentley should mean fewer heavy vehicle movements through Alresford so there is some good news on the horizon for residents of affected roads.

Parking issues have been discussed many times at Full Council meetings and research carried out. Almost all sizeable villages are affected and schools inevitably have problems at dropping off and picking up times. At our Primary School parking safety is a major concern and it has been disappointing to see vehicles parked, albeit briefly, on the zig zag markings and also on the street corner of Ford Lane. Police and our PCSO have been in attendance on a number of occasions. It is the case though that further highway restrictions may be needed, especially at the junction of Ford Lane and Church Road.

Planning and Development

Tendring District Council are responsible for planning and development in our area. I have included here details of the

Local Plan Review:

The Tendring District Local Plan 2013-2033 and Beyond was adopted in two parts: **Section 1** (which was prepared jointly by Tendring District, Colchester City, and Braintree District Councils, and contains strategic policies that are common between all three authorities) was adopted January 2021, and **Section 2** (which contains policies that are specific to the Tendring District) was adopted in January 2022.

To ensure Plans remain effective, they are required to be reviewed and updated at least every five years. Tendring District Council has begun the process of reviewing and updating the Local Plan, in order to plan for and manage development in the Tendring District up to 2041.

The Council hereby gives notice of the first stage of public consultation that will be part of this process: 'Issues and Options'.

The consultation period for 'Issues and Options' and the 'Call for Sites' runs from **Monday 3**rd **March 2025** until **5pm on Monday 14**th **April 2025** – a period of just over six weeks.

Paper copies will also be available at public libraries around the District and at Clacton Town Hall, during usual opening hours. It is important that you have your say, either online or in writing. Those engaging in the consultation process should contact Tendring District Council and not Alresford Parish Council!

Public Open Space Acquisition

Documents have been signed for the transfer of the public open space land and allotments at Staunton Gate from Taylor Wimpey to Alresford Parish Council. We now await completion of the transaction. It is important to the Council that all parts of the village with open public spaces are maintained by the Parish Council so that there is uniformity in the standard and it also gives residents a single point of contact regarding open space issues.

VE DAY 80th Anniversary

The Anniversary of the ending of the second world war in Europe is to be commemorated on the 8th of May. The Parish Council will lay a wreath at the War Memorial at 11am on the 8th of May. On Saturday evening the 10th of May the films shown in the Village Hall will have a 1940's theme (tea and cakes to be provided). Bunting/Flags will be placed at suitable locations and it is hoped that there will be some appropriate music available to mark the occasion.

Youth input

The Council has put together a working party in order to obtain greater input into Council decisions from younger members of the community. Selected Councillors will work with local schools to engage with young people and survey opinion. Previous youth involvement has led to improved local facilities and a more rounded picture of community needs.







CONSIDERATE PARKING TICKET

JANUARY 2025: 3 x CPI were given out this month FEBRUARY 2025: 2 x CPI were given out this month

A large van was given a considerate parking ticket after being reported numerous times for obstructing the junction in Coach Road.

Drivers are reminded **NOT TO BLOCK FOOTPATHS**, to avoid pedestrians having to walk in the road.

FOOTPATHS are for pedestrians. **Please leave enough space** for people to pass on the footpath, **IF** kerb parking is your only option. This can be extremely dangerous and inconvenient for all pedestrians.

Fixed penalty notices can be issued to those that **block the footpath as an obstruction**.

Is it Legal to park on the pavement?

Parking on the pavement is not illegal outside of London. You can, however, still get a fine for doing so in some instances, which makes the law quite a grey area.

Since 1974, Highway Code rule 244 has stated that drivers "MUST NOT park partially or wholly on the pavement in London and should not do so elsewhere unless signs permit it."

The key things to note here are the words *must not* and *should not*. In London, you *must not* park on the pavement, the *must* indicating there is legislation behind this rule and you could receive a fine for breaking it. However, outside of the capital or "elsewhere", the Highway Code states drivers *should not* park on the pavement meaning it is advisory and not therefore, backed up by any legislation.

Rule 242 is where it gets a little less clear, stating: "You MUST NOT leave your vehicle or trailer in a dangerous position or This is a *must not*, again, meaning if your car is reported or seen by

a police officer and judged to be either in a dangerous position or causing an unnecessary obstruction of the road, you could receive a **Fixed Penalty Notice**

ZIG ZAGS

Vehicles are parking on these, especially at the school. Please **DO NOT** park on these or any zig zags as you are putting children and pedestrians in danger. Excuses will not be valid when it comes to issuing a fixed penalty – The issuing of a fixed penalty will take longer than finding somewhere safer to park - **IS IT WORTH IT?**

SCHOOL PATROLS:

Numerous school patrols were carried out this month. **One** driver was advised about the law of parking on zig zags.

NITROUS OXIDE CANISTERS

A fair amount of nitrous oxide canisters were found in the village. Some still has some gas left in them. Please be reminded that being caught with this or using it, could lead to a fine, not to mention extremely dangerous to your health.

DRUGS

Drugs are a concern in every village, this is a regular reported problem in Alresford. Do your children come home smelling of cannabis with large dark pupils, even in the light?

Drugs can ruin your life. What starts out as a bit of harmless smoking, can lead to stronger addictive drugs and being vulnerable to county lines. Once this path is taken, it is very hard to break. Dealers will not allow you to walk away without consequences.

Be aware of recruitment - Recruitment of young people into County Lines activity can happen anywhere, with young people being targeted at fast food outlets, shopping centres and parks to online platforms and gaming sites. Young people are also known to self-recruit, contacting the criminals directly, usually online.

Some serious organised criminals have exploited taxi drivers/ private hire drivers to transport their 'runners', drugs and/or money. The incentive is usually the offer of easy cash-in-hand money in exchange for transportation. This working relationship often also includes coercion, intimidation, violence.

For more information and help, if you suspect your child may be involved with drugs.

It is important to report dangerous potholes when seen, they will then usually be assessed within 4 days and dealt with www.essexhighways.org/using-tell-us-andappropriately track-it You can also track the status of reports and check if one has already been reported.

It is vital that if you come across a pothole that is extremely dangerous, DO NOT REPORT IT ONLINE, but ring the Emergency number 0345 603 7631 If a pothole is not reported, it never happened, so awareness needs to be made.

NETWORK RAIL

Faulty Barrier

Please call emergency 24 hour helpline on 03457 11 41 41 if there's a safety threat to you or to others such as:

- people, animals, trees or objects on or near the track
- damage or fault at a level crossing
- a vehicle has hit a bridge
- a broken fence or open gate allowing access to the track.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCES

If you see anything that does not look right, report it.

Try and get as much information as you can, including registration numbers, which are key to a lot of activity.

The more you have, the more chance we have of a positive investigation, with results.

WHO TO REPORT TO FOR PARKING ISSUES/ VEHICLES

DVLA: Report an untaxed vehicle - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

Deal with Vehicles with No MOT OR TAX on the public highway. DVI A can remove them.

Police will intervene when the vehicle is being driven with a fixed penalty notice.

Reporting dangerous / illegal parking:
