Jo Hull started her horticultural career growing micro-greens in a shed and selling them to local hotels and restaurants. She and her partner progressed from the shed to a small farm, still growing micro-greens but expanding to include regular vegetables and flowers. Following the Covid turmoil Jo turned all of her attention to cut flowers, and moved to Benton End Farm in Hadleigh, where she started Benton End Flower Farm with her business partner. Jo favours the no-dig method of cultivation and has achieved spectacular and beautiful results. For general garden use Jo had some easy to implement flower combinations such as, tulips with honesty, dahlias with marigolds, Greek cress with snapdragons and peonies with cosmos.
