December 2023 meeting- John Harper "Tools with a Mission (TWAM)"

"Tools with a Mission" (TWAM) are a Christian charity that collects unwanted usable tools, refurbishes them, sorts them into trade tool kits and sends them to countries in the developing world to help enable training and livelihood creation. Our December speaker, John Harper, illustrated his talk with some inspiring stories and examples of how TWAM had changed the lives of families in Zambia and Uganda with tool kits costing an average of just £45. As well as helping families in the developing world, the charity is making a significant contribution to environmental sustainability by reducing waste and carbon emissions in the UK.

One of the examples that John described was Levina, in Kasese, Uganda, where she and her husband were struggling to support their family. Her husband was an agricultural day labourer, and Levina was only surviving by digging local fields. She could not afford to send their children to school. Levina heard that there was a Skills Centre in her community, and she trained as a tailor on a TWAM sewing machine that had cost just £25 to supply to the Skills Centre. When Levina finished her training she rented a market stall to make and repair clothing. She worked hard, built a good reputation, and now employs three people. Levina can now send her children to school and pay for their uniforms and books. And it all began with her training and a TWAM sewing machine costing just £25.

Typical tool kits include electrical and manual sewing machines, carpentry tools, computing equipment, plumbing, agricultural, motor mechanic and electrician tools.
