A resident questioned if the parish council had been granted an extension on the response time regarding planning application ESS/36/25/MAL/SPO.  CIIr R. Griffiths advised that unfortunately, Maldon District Council had sent a response to our request and had said that a decision has already been made and as the proposal was an environmental impact assessment for the site the parish council do not need to be consulted anyway. Maldon District Council did not allow the extension to respond to the proposal.  The resident commented that CIIr Wendy Stamp had sent a response to Maldon District Council and had raised residents' concerns.  CIIr R. Griffiths advised that the parish council anticipates that there will be a forthcoming full planning application submitted.  CIIr A. Snowdon commented that it is noticeable that Maldon District Council planning officers dislike impact assessments and on numerous occasions that the comment 'not required' is often the response made.
