112/2025 Apologies for Absence Cllr R. Griffiths (Holiday) – Agreed. Unanimous decision.

114/2025 To approve the Minutes of the last Council meeting of Asheldham & Dengie PC To receive and agree the minutes of the A&DPC extraordinary meeting held on 4th. August 2025 Agreed. Unanimous decision.

116/2025 District Councillors Report District Councillor, Matthew Neall was not present at this meeting.	
Colin reported that at the July 2025 meeting it was decided that the parish council would contact Essex Highways about the reflector posts at Asheldham Brook Bridge being obscured by vegetation. Two months on and the situation is still the same. In addition, the hedgerows bordering the road on the Asheldham side of the bridge, especially adjacent to the Pig Field, is now overgrown. It is even touching the white line donating the edge of the carriageway in places. Colin asked if the parish council could please contact Essex Highways about the reflector posts again and the other problem as a matter of urgency. In discussion with the Clerk, Rik Pond and Colin had decided that the ARG representative, Rik, will continue to deal with the ordering of the new noticeboard and they will provide the Clerk with the invoice in due course. Colin continued that, the up-to-date situation about the clearance of the ground ivy on the land opposite Sandlings is unfortunately not available. It will be recalled by the parish council that the general idea is for ARG is to trim some of the sprouting ground ivy and to present the result to the contractors MSJ Garwood to see if they can do the same in the future as part of the present contract. Local resident Trevor Anderson at the request of ARG has kindly smartened up the fence belonging to Essex County Council on the entrance to Rushes Lane, by clearing the overgrown branches and debris from the fence. Tony Lock of Endway is to be approached to see if he will strim the ground vegetation on his side of the entrance to Rushes Lane. Clir L. Brown wished to thank Trevor, on behalf of Asheldham & Dengie Parish councillors, for carrying out the work to the fence so promptly.	Clir L. Brown

Lyn reported that the village hall extension has been approved but trees are required to be planted and bird and bat boxes are to be installed.

119/2025 **Councillor Vacancy**

Following the recent resignation of Cllr D. Henson, Asheldham & Dengie Parish Council are awaiting to fill the casual vacancy by co-option process.

The Clerk updated the council that she had received an email from a resident who was interested in the councillor vacancy. The resident was present at the meeting to view how a council meeting is run and the Clerk introduced him to the councillors.

120/2025 **Locality Funding**

The clerk updated the councillors and public that she was pleased to report that both applications for locality funding had been accepted. The brush cutter and noticeboard for Asheldham could now be purchased.

The groundsman, Andrew Burnett, will order the brush cutter and ARG representatives, Mr Cooper and Mr Pond will order the noticeboard.

121/2025 **Village Gateway Signs**

It has been requested that Village Gateway Signs are installed in Asheldham. Councillors have recognised that grant funding would be required to purchase these.

Cllr S. Russell suggested that the gateway signs could be located on the Foxhall Road and B1021 junction, just opposite the bridleway and the second would be on the Tillingham Road just after the Dengie Straight, heading towards Asheldham.

The Clerk will make enquiries to Essex County Council Highways if a licence for the gateway signs is required.

122/2025 **Dengie Marshes Wind Farm Project**

RESOLVED: Cllrs L. Brown and A. Snowdon attended the public consultation on Thursday 10th July and reported that the consultation left many questions and concerns unresolved, including the negotiations of exiting from the G B Finch quarry to gain access to the wind farm site via Grange Road or Hall Road.

Cllr A. Snowdon reported that there was no commitment as to how the materials and turbines will be brought by road or sea.

Cllr A. Snowdon continued to report that the number of sites has been reduced from 17 to 15 but expects that this may increase again. The heights of the wind turbines have altered, and Southend Airport are not favourable of the larger turbines as there is significant risk to the radar system at the airport.

The Environmental Impact Assessment is yet to be carried out and an additional consultation is planned for later this year but no date has been set.
