# **Asheldham & Dengie Parish Council**

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Minutes of the Asheldham & Dengie Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 6<sup>th</sup>. October 2025 at 6.30pm in Dengie village hall

**ACTION** 

Present: Cllrs R Griffiths, L. Brown, S. Russell, A. Snowdon and Kelly Andrews (Parish Clerk). 10 members of the public were also present.

112/2025 Apologies for Absence

None.

### 113/2025 Declaration of Interest

RESOLVED: Cllr L. Brown declared a non-pecuniary interest in agenda item 126/25 b), planning applications 25/00845/ESS, 25/00848/ESS and 25/00849/ESS. Agreed. Unanimous decision.

# 116/2025 Dispensations

None received.

117/2025 To approve the Minutes of the last Council meeting of Asheldham & Dengie PC RESOLVED: To receive and agree the minutes of the last A&DPC meeting held on 1st. September 2025. Cllr L. Brown proposed to agree the minutes received. Cllr S. Russell seconded this motion, Agreed. Unanimous decision.

# 118/2025 Questions from the Press and Public -

(This session will not exceed 15 minutes – unless otherwise directed by the Chair - no individual to speak for longer than 3 minutes on any one issue) An opportunity for members of the public and press to speak about items on the agenda and to raise other issues.

- A resident and ARG representative requested that the parish councillors seriously consider the planning applications 25/00845/ESS, 25/00848/ESS and 25/00849/ESS taking into account the issues of transport and that the quarry have not considered the transport documents as part of the planning application. Also, the two trees which are on the southern boundary need to be taken into consideration. The resident will make his own representation in response to the planning applications but wanted to make clear that he is not in support of another four and a half years of operating in addition to the existing operations.
- A resident, who lives in a neighbouring property to the quarry processing plant, disagreed
  with the air and sound quality reports and explained that her experiences of the extreme
  amount of dust and noise, especially during the summer months. The resident reported that
  there is a continuous noise all day, Monday to Friday and they have to keep their windows
  and doors closed.
  - The resident raised further concerns regarding the poor quality of the roads without the increased amount of heavy traffic that the increased operation will bring.
- A resident reported that he had been unable to gain access to the information through the Maldon District Council planning portal to view the drawings and therefore is unsure where the quarry extension would be located. Another resident advised him that the documents can be viewed through Essex County Council.
  - Cllr R. Griffiths informed the resident that the proposed quarry extension will be opposite the Dengie Crop Dries on Hall Road.
- A resident and representative of ARG raised concern that the local roads are unfit for purpose to carry the large lorries and passing is extremely difficult on the roads through Asheldham. He hopes that the applicant will be put in a position to produce a transport assessment as it presently stands as part of the environmental report. The road system is inadequate.

The resident explained that a qualified surveyors should be appointed to carry out a proper consultation regarding the number of lorry movements before a decision is made.

# 119/2025 District Councillor Report - Matthew Neall

District Councillor, Matthew Neall reported that the local government reorganisation plans had been submitted to the UK government, and four different plans have been proposed for greater Essex.

Essex County Council has proposed three different unitry authorities and Thurrock, along with Rochford, has proposed four unitry authorities. Maldon District Council has proposed five unitry authorities and has been backed by twelve councils.

District Councillor Matthew Neall explained that we now have to wait until we are advised of the outcome by the UK government, but it looks like Maldon will be linked with Chelmsford and Brentwood as a base as the three unitry authorities.

District Councillor Matthew Neall also reported that the Dengie Wind Farm project continues to be proposed and that a meeting was held recently to look at the revised plans and that they have reduced the wind turbines. They propose to bring these turbines in by sea.

District Councillor Matthew Neall addressed the topic of agenda item 126/2025 1) regarding the Dengie Manor application MDC Ref. 25/00012 and advised that he had been chasing one of the planning officers for a report but has not received a response yet. However, he advised councillors to be aware of section 5 of the officers' report before sending the proposed letter.

Regarding the Dengie Wind Farm project, Cllr S. Russell asked District Councillor Neall how the radar system at Southend airport will be affected by the wind turbines.

District Councillor Matthew Neall advised that the proposed plan is only at the consultation stage and until the plan is at planning stage, Southend airport would then be invited to respond. The planning application is expected to be made in November or December.

Cllr A. Snowdon asked if the proposers have confirmed if the aggregate for the project will be brought in by marine transport.

District Matthew Neall advised that as the planning is only at consultation stage there is no confirmation.

Cllr R. Griffiths asked that when the planning application for the Dengie Wind Farm comes to council for consideration, would District Councillor Matthew Neall attend the parish council meeting. District Councillor Neall advised that he will although the application will go to a District Council meeting.

# 120/2025 ARG Report – Colin Cooper

Colin Cooper reported that the Tree Warden, Jo and family, have recently kindly planted up the planters opposite Sandlings with spring flowers so it is important for all on the watering rota to continue their work during the winter months.

Colin also reported that it appears that the mowing contractors Garwood's have not taken the hint provided by Jo mowing a little further into the ground ivy and following her lead. The PC may consider it appropriate for it to specifically request Garwood's to do so otherwise the burden of doing this will continue to fall on Jo or other ARG volunteers.

Colin also advised that at the time of writing, Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> October, the overgrown vegetation concealing the reflector posts at Asheldham Brook Bridge continues to be ignored by Essex Highways (EH) despite the PC bringing the matter to its attention 3 months ago. The same goes for the overgrown hedgerows and verges in the area particularly on the pig field side of the road.

Colin reported that ARG continues to await the long outstanding Essex Highways report on the integrity of the bridge and any plans for replacement.

Colin continued that, recently the Bridle Path running north from the Asheldham end was seen to be completely blocked in a couple of places by fallen tree trunks and branches. In liaison with Linzie, ARG member, Tim Parker has kindly cleared the first blockage sufficient to allow horses to pass and it is understood the same further north with the other blockage. The bulk of the tree trunk in respect of the first blockage remains across the bridleway and is partly caught up in nearby trees. The responsibility for keeping bridlepaths and public footpaths clear is understood to be that of Essex Highways and the Parish Council may consider it appropriate to bring the matter to their attention as they might well be unaware at present.

Cllr R. Griffiths proposed that the Clerk requests that MSJ Garwood & Son cut back the ground ivy further. Cllr L. Brown seconded this motion. Agreed. Unanimous decision.

Cllr R. Griffiths proposed that the Clerk reports the blocked bridle way to Essex Highways. Cllr S. Russell seconded this motion. Agreed Unanimous decision.

## 121/2025 Village Hall Report – Lyn Moull

Dengie Village Hall representative, Lyn Moull, reported that the hall hire to the Caravan Club had now come to an end due to it being the end of the season. Deansbrook will continue to book

throughout the year, and the Dengie Pantomime Group is about to begin their rehearsals, therefore they will have frequent bookings of two bookings per week for a period of three months and a half months.

Lyn continued her report by advising that she had contacted the builder regarding the village hall extension but unfortunately, he is unable to work with the wooden frame building. However, Lyn is contacting another builder for a quotation.

## 122/2025 Councillor Vacancy

RESOLVED: An applicant had been invited to attend the meeting to take part in a formal transparent interview to co-opt as a councillor.

- Cllr R. Griffiths asked the applicant why they think they would be successful in the role as councillor and what skills they can bring to the parish council.
  - The applicant responded that having lived in the area for five years they really care for and like the community and has joined ARG. They continued that they have had a lot of involvement with caretaking for schools and has enjoyed a career in operations, which meant organising people.
- Cllr R. Griffiths further asked what inspired the applicant to apply for the vacancy. The applicant informed the councillors that he had shown interest in a previous vacancy however, that position was filled. They explained that they are retired and have more time to help within the local community.
- Cllr A. Snowdon asked the candidate if they were aware of the local authority requirement of commitment to attend regular monthly parish council meetings throughout the year. The applicant replied that they already have responsibilities during the year to assist with community work and would arrange their holidays around the dates of the meetings.

The councillors all voted by private ballot and the Clerk informed the room that the councillors had voted unanimously that the applicant should be accepted for the vacant councillor position. Graham Chandler was invited to join the councillors and take part in the remainder of the meeting as a councillor. Agreed. Unanimous decision.

## 124/2025 Village Gateway Signs

RESOLVED: Cllr S. Russell reported that she had obtained quotations from Village Sign suppliers and there were some considerations to be made before purchasing the signs with regards to location and who the land belongs to of the proposed locations.

Cllr S. Russell suggested that the village sign could be located at the junction of Foxhall Road and Tillingham Road so that the sign is visible from both directions approaching Asheldham.

Cllr S. Russell advised that for the location of the second sign, when approaching Asheldham from Tillingham the road is not a 30-mph road until G B Finch quarry receive an update regarding the installation of Village Gateway Signs in Asheldham.

Cllr A. Snowdon suggested that he would look at the proposed site with the landowner to see if it is suitable.

The location of the Gateway Village Sign will be deferred for decision until the next meeting. The Clerk will request guidance from Essex Highways.

Cllr R. Griffiths proposed that at this stage the councillors could decide on a design of the Village Sign for the purpose of the Essex County Council or Solar Park grant funding to fund the project. Cllr L. Brown seconded this motion. The white, sloping picket fence design was favourable. Agreed. Unanimous decision.

RESOLVED: BSR had sent a response to the letter regarding the Community Benefit Fund and requesting that the increase in the amount of funding be considered.

Cllr R. Griffiths advised that BSR had responded that they will consider the request and required information regarding the proposed community projects that they could fund.

- A resident queried that the deadline for responses relating to the planning application 25/00706/OUTM had already passed, therefore does the parish council have an influence on this decision.
  - Cllr A. Snowdon advised that the council had received a statement from Maldon District Council planning authority that decisions and responses are still accepted up to the point where the application is sent to the planning committee for consideration.
- Lyn Moull wished to confirm if the grant funding from BSR would go to Essex Community Foundation for agreement.
  - Cllr R. Griffiths confirmed that the grant funding is ring fenced for the Asheldham and Dengie community but the applications need to be sent to Essex Community Foundation and BSR will send £19,000 to ECF but the parish council are trying to enter into negotiation to increase this funding.
- A resident informed the parish council that there is no internet connection in Asheldham and perhaps this could be a suggestion for the grant funding.

  He also advised that the environment report for the scoping project, regarding the quarry applications, recommended a transport document. However, the applicant scoped this out and the environment application stated that 'no trees are effected by the southern boundary extension'. The resident's letter of objection will highlight this issue and similar concerns that he has.

- Colin Cooper reported that the wooden finger posts on the junction of Foxhall Road/Southminster Road/Tillingham Road require repair and the giveway sign is shorter that it should be.
- A resident enquired who they report the flooding to on the junction of Southminster Road/Hall Road.
  - Cllr A. Snowdon advised that all highway defects should be reported to Essex Highways. Cllr G. Chandler reported that the new repair on Foxhall Road is already showing signs of deterioration.
