



Headteacher Update – 10th January 2022

Dear Parents, Carers, Students, Family and Friends of Baines School,

Happy New Year and welcome to 2022, I hope you all managed some quality family time over the break. This is the first update of 2022, I am not sure what the next few weeks will bring but I want to thank you for all your support for school and your children. I have no doubt there will be many more updates and changes to government policies that I will need to keep you informed about (some are bound to be at short notice). A personal thank you for your understanding with regards to the everchanging situation with staff (and student) absence, and as you know I have been recovering myself from Covid, I still am finding I have very little energy and need to re-charge at night before the next school day. This is resulting in a slower than usual response time (and me not getting quite as much work done as usual).

My section in this HTU is dominated by Covid, I hope that the next issue will be more focussed on learning and education development.

Thank you to all our testing volunteers and to parents and carers for bringing children in to school for the mass testing last week. We had a number of positive cases and this reinforces the importance of regular lateral flow testing at home, so please do continue to test at home twice weekly and report the result to the NHS and the online Baines School Report Form: https://forms.office.com/r/hnMkL9rC3k

The students have responded so well to the re-introduction of wearing masks in classrooms as well as communal indoor areas. I really am proud of their positive and supportive response. We have reintroduced wiping down tables and hand sanitising on entry and exit to rooms. We do have an increased number of positive cases at the moment, similar to the last 'outbreak' we had in October. I will be monitoring the numbers and may need to seek guidance from the PHE if numbers continue to rise. We are struggling (like most schools are) with securing supply staff to cover for absent staff and I am seriously concerned that we may see a situation in the very near future when we cannot fully staff the school. I am preparing our contingency plan should this situation occur and will send it out soon so that you are all aware of what we would do should we need to trigger a tiered system in school. This would very much be a last resort and I will do everything possible to keep school fully open. As part of the contingency plan, please ensure that you and your child regularly check Class Charts in the evening for messages and that they have their log-in details for Class Charts, Google Classrooms for each lesson, Hegarty Maths, GCSE Pod and the online library.

Temperatures in classrooms

As you are aware, we are required to keep windows and doors open to aid ventilation. At this time of year, this results in classrooms and school in general being much colder. Students are allowed to wear an outdoor coat over the top of their uniform in lessons to keep warm if they wish. Many students are wearing school jumpers now, which is pleasing to see, please be reminded that a school jumper is in addition to the blazer and provides an extra layer for warmth (it is not instead of the blazer). I recommend that students who wear skirts to school, now also wear think black or brown tights at this

time of year to aid keeping them warm too. Keeping warm is important but it is not a relaxing of uniform rules, I still expect our students to wear the uniform correctly and have a smart presentation.

Other Covid updates:

You will be aware that the self-isolation rules have changed so students (and those fully vaccinated) can now carry out a lateral flow on day 6 and the morning of day 7 in order to return to school.

From 11th January, the rules regarding needing to get a PCR will change temporarily.

The NHS are now making contact with schools to plan when they can come to deliver the second vaccine to those eligible 12-15 year olds. As I know more, I will let you know. In the meantime, if you wish your child to have their second vaccine sooner, details are in the update below.

Mr Cropper has given full details of the latest information and links to useful information below:

Update from Mr Cropper

A huge thank you to all our families who participated in the return to school testing this past week. Whilst we had fewer students attend testing, we did unfortunately identify significantly more students who were positive than we have before. We would like to encourage as many families as possible to participate in twice weekly testing using the kits provided by school. Thorough this, mask wearing and increased ventilation, we hope to maintain face to face learning for as long as possible through these difficult few weeks. We have a good supply of test kits in school for our students, and until the next batch are handed out, students can request more kits as needed from Mr Cropper. Many families now need to test daily, so it is expected that they may request more Lateral Flow test boxes.

We thank you for your ongoing support in our drive to maintain face to face learning at Baines. Below is an update of current testing guidance, but please do not hesitate to contact: covid@baines.lancs.sch.uk if you have any further questions.

The new testing kits broadly follow the same process as before, but with a couple of differences:

- -The testing swab is a nasal swab only: both nostrils instead of tonsils and nostril.
- -Test fluid is already in the test vials and sealed a separate unit, saving a little extra time and fuss!
- -The swab should be soaked in the testing fluid for 30-60 seconds before transferring to the testing cartridge.
- -Results can be read after 15mins, but no later than 30mins.

If anyone has any questions about the new kits, please do not hesitate to contact school.

- -Students who have had their COVID vaccine can still continue to test twice a week the vaccine will not affect the test results in any way.
- -Any students who missed out on having the vaccine in school, or are looking to book their second vaccination, can contact their local GP or use the NHS booking

If positive, please stay home, report your result via the gov.uk website and the school report form.

Please can parents/carers also contact school via covid@baines.lancs.sch.uk, informing us of the positive result.

The updated guidance for isolating is:

- -If you have tested positive on a lateral flow test and have symptoms you must book a PCR test to confirm the result
- -If you have tested positive on a lateral flow test, but have no symptoms, you must isolate straight away (this is a temporary government change from 11^{th} January and there is no need to book a PCR test during this time).
- -If you have tested positive, you can return to school on the 7th day of isolation If you test negative on an LFT on the 6th day, and again on the 7th day. These tests must be 24 hours apart.

Take care, especially during these uncertain times. Stay positive and help the students to focus on learning and their education.


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Rohan - Karate Youth League Venice 2021

A total of 18000 questions have been answered correctly over the past fortnight which is awesome.

TT Rockstars:

We will be relaunching the use of TT rockstars as a homework platform and pushing all pupils in year 7-10 to improve their multiplication and division facts. From next week each student will be given their log ins and competitions will be running through the course of the year between classes to see who can answer the most questions, prizes will be given to students and classes who are putting in the time and effort to improve their numeracy skills.

I am hoping that all students get involved as having the underpinning knowledge of timestables makes the work done in exams not only easier but quicker for students so they can spend more time focusing on the more complicated work in the exam and less time working out multiplication and division facts.

Literacy Update - Mrs Streetly and Mrs Simmons Root of the Week

In a slight change to word of the week we will now be doing 'root of the week'. This is where students will be introduced to common affixes from Latin and Greek that will help them to decode unfamiliar words in an easier way. It will be hoped that students can learn these common roots to help them across the entire curriculum. For example, the root this week is 'aud' which is Latin for 'to hear' - the students will then explore the different words which use the affix 'aud'. The following week is the affix 'bene' meaning 'good'. The idea of using this system is to get students to be able to decode meaning independently.

Reading Plus

Lily, Ruby and Cameron in B1 are all completing lessons really well and are making some excellent progress. In our ILC group Thomas, Miles and Aaliyah are doing brilliantly too!

Read around Science

This month we are reading around the topic of science - we have some wonderful reading available for students to borrow in the ILC that links science with both fiction and non-fiction texts. We have some great activities for our KS3 students to complete in their ILC lessons.



Year 11 Elevate Education – Becoming a Study Sensei

Tabitha joined us on Thursday 6th January to lead sessions with Year 11 to explore what common features of successful young people can be replicated over the coming weeks and months as we prepare for the mock exams and, looking further ahead, to the main exams in the summer.

We looked at the little wins that will make us stand out against others whilst keeping things in perspective in a busy and noisy national situation.

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This included using the specification and/or revision guides to structure revision and identify gaps in knowledge. Tabitha discussed making notes during the week, every week, so that the task of revision becomes smaller as we approach the exams. This included tips on keeping tabs on what students had done and how to write a revision timetable.

Tabitha gave our students some top tips regarding how to use organised revision notes to improve memory, including trigger words, using colour and dual-coding. (Dual coding is a technique we use in lessons across school and involves using a strong image to trigger a memory). She also talked about the importance of revisiting, revisiting until knowledge is embedded, but keeping revision sessions short and sharp to maximise productivity.

The main theme of her session was that students can control and should control how they prepare for an exam. Excuses later won't improve a situation that was in their control in the first place and that now is the time to get organised!

Elevate Education will be back after the mock exams to lead a further session to support Year 11 in getting ready for the summer exam season.
