Meet the Alumni

Lancashire and England T20 Cricketer – Richard Gleeson (1998-2006)



Richard was born in Blackpool in 1987 and attended the school between 1998 and 2006. According to the Speech night programme for that year (2006) Richard left Baines to take up a course on Coaching and Sports

Development at the University College of St Martins. However this was not to be his only job though before picking up the willow rofessionally. According to the BBC prior to becoming a T20 England cricketer he had had a number of jobs including teaching and construction work.

In his cricketing career Richard has played for a number of county teams including Northamptonshire and Lancashire.

He made his first-class debut for Northamptonshire against the Australians on 15th August 2015 and his County debut for Northamptonshire against Lancashire on 8th June 2016 in the Royal London One-Day Cup. He then had to wait a further seven years to make his international debut for the England cricket team in July 2022.

Whilst playing at Northamptonshire Richard was holding down a full-time job coaching in schools and cricket clubs on behalf of the Lancashire Cricket Board. He then signed full time for Northamptonshire and a contract to play T20 cricket for the Rangpur Riders in the 2016 Bangladesh Premier League. But as a Lancastrian there could only be one move and that was to his home county – he did this towards the end of the 2018 season.

At the age of 33 (May 2020), he was named for the England's training squad, which was quite old for a top-class cricketer. Richard said at the time "never give up, keep following your dream and keep pursuing things". On 9th July 2020, Richard was included in England's 24-man squad to start training behind closed doors for the One Day International series against Ireland and was later named as one of three reserve players in England's squad for the series.

On 29th May 2022, in the 2022 T20 Blast, Richard took his first five-wicket haul in T20 cricket, with 5 wickets for 33 runs against the Worcestershire Rapids.

In July 2022, Richard was named for England's T20 International squad for their home series against India. He made his T20 debut on 9th July 2022, taking the wickets of Rohit Sharma, Virat Kohli and Rishabh Pant, for only 15 runs. Recently Richard has been seen playing in the Hundred series.

Sir William Lyons

Thanks to Lesley Robson former teacher at St Aidan's School for this information on Sir William Lyons, founder of Jaguar Cars Ltd., and an old boy of the school. See we spread our net for news even over Wyre. A chance remark at Great Eccleston Show led to finding out information about this forgotten Old Boy.

Whilst I watch the penultimate race of this season's formula E (electric car racing) which was won by Mitch Evens driving a Jaguar we see how far Jaguar cars have come from the idea dreamt up by former pupil William Lyons.



William was born in Blackpool on 4th Sept 1901 He may not have been at the school long before moving to Arnold School but he claims dual citizenship. William stated that of his time at Baines he was, an 'average scholar'

William known as "Mr. Jaguar", working with fellow motorcycle enthusiast William Walmsley, co-founded in 1922 the Swallow Sidecar Company, which after the Second World War became Jaguar Cars Limited. William took a small sidecar manufacturing business and developed it into a prominent World-wide Company in a few years.

William certainly lived up to the school motto – Nil Sine Labore (Nothing without hard work). He was a charismatic man, single-minded and certainly strong-willed. Tremendously hard-working William



expected his staff to do likewise. He surrounded himself with exceptionally talented people who were just as keen on the enterprise as he was. They may not always have agreed with the Boss, but they were loyal, both to him and to Jaguar.

By 1911 his parent's business was doing well and they moved to Red Cottage in Newton Drive, close to what would later become Stanley Park, and they had enough money to send William to Arnold School

On leaving school in July 1917 William was due to become an apprentice at Vickers shipbuilding yard at Barrow-in-Furness, but his father came to the rescue; he knew the Managing Director of Crossley Motors in Gorton, Manchester, and asked if there was a place for his son. The result was that young William took up an apprenticeship with them. Part of the arrangement included studying engineering at Manchester Technical College some of the week. William wanted to get closer to the Crossley cars but production at the time was concentrated on ambulances and lorries for the military.

Secretary: Alumni David J Astall After leaving Crossley's he moved back to Blackpool where he found work with Jackson Brothers and then Jack (John Edgar) Mallalieu offered him a sales job at his new dealership – Brown and Mallalieu. He attended the first post-war motor show in London in 1919 where he helped on the Brown and Mallalieu stand. William was just eighteen-years-old and was now as experienced with motor cars as he was with motorcycles.

In August 1922, William Lyons senior and Thomas Walmsley put up £500 each to fund the enterprise by guaranteeing a £1,000 loan (roughly £30,000 in today's terms) at Williams Deacon's Bank in Blackpool.



They found suitable premises at 5 Bloomfield Road and the partnership agreement was signed on 21st November. This became the Swallow Sidecar Company which was the start of Jaguar Motors. The big break came when the company moved to Coventry and mass

production of Jaguar Cars started. Due to his work in the motor industry William was knighted in 1956.

William died on 8th February 1985 at Wappenbury Hall, his home in Learnington Spa, Warwickshire, at the age of 83.

Passing of Former President (1993-94) Eric Appleby ("Apse"), (1956 - 61)

Eric had been fighting cancer of the oesophagus for 2 or 3 years, and although he had briefly overcome the illness, sadly it returned some 6 months ago. He was able to get away to Cornwall for a couple of weeks with family but on his return contracted pneumonia and sepsis, passing away at 5.30pm on 13th July.

Eric was a tenacious football wing half and a reliable cricket wicket keeper for both the school and Founders teams throughout his time at school. He was a committee member of the FPA for many years and served as President in 1993-94.

On one memorable occasion in the 1980s he somehow managed to assemble the entire under 12 Gazette Cup winning football team of 1957 for a reunion at the Old Boys annual dinner held at The Imperial Hotel that year.

All about boarders

In the early 1900s the school had a number of boarders living in the Headmaster's House [Music block]. The dorms were situated on the right hand side of the building, one downstairs and one up. The one upstairs is one of the current music rooms. Entrance to these dorms appears to be from the back of the building and their canteen was in what is now the house garden.



This image clearly shows the house and the section between the house and the next building (the old school [sixth form]) the dorms. The building to the left of the house is the

shower block with the canteen not shown just to its left.

The boarders were in charge of the 'house' and its grounds and if they wanted things, they did it themselves. We read in Poultonian that the school needed a new cricket pitch so the boarders made a new cricket pitch. A different class of pupil. In 1918 the number of day and boarding school boys in the school was increasing and more activities and food, especially food have to be found.

In front of the school house was a lawn and we read that early in 1918 there was an infestation of rabbits. One or two to start with but then more and more. Unfortunately these rabbits appear to have died out before reaching maturity - the disappointment was that the boarders had lost a source of food.

However, this was a minor setback as later that year they dug up the front lawn and planted potatoes. The headteacher then allocated part of the school vegetable plot to the boarders to plant salad crop and vegetables to help feed them in the house.

In order to improve the colour in the garden the boarders planted 50 Sea Candy [thrift] on the banks of the Wyre and then transplanted these in the garden border.

Currently the Poultonians being posted are very apt in this Jubilee year as they are from 1952 and 1953.


