# **Baines School Golf Society**



# Looking to the future

None of us are getting any younger. The Former Pupils' Association was founded in 1906; a mere 118 years ago. Formed by the 'Father of the School', Thomas D Whittington, former Headteacher. The Association was at its strength during both World Wars binding the family of Baines together, sending out Christmas presents to the front and receiving replies from the 'boys'. Some of these replies are featured in the resource, Baines Brief Lives – the backstory of the boys and masters that fought in the First World War. A copy of this is on the website.

Then it fell into a slow decline as times changed and the need fr a FPA diminished. We have over the past few years fought for its survival. At one point we thought we had lost the fight and that it, like many other FPA, had sealed its fate. But drive, encouragement and enthusiasm has kept it going.

There have always been a number of 'younger' members of the FPA but due to distance it is difficult to form a get together. In the past this would not have been an issue as many pupils stayed in the same area.

Now we must turn to this next generation to help keep the flame alive and hopefully with encouragement they can attract more 'younger' members. With the school entering a new phase in its life perhaps this is the time when the FPA can also have a resurgence.

The Association is now needed more than ever, to bind the family of Baines in a rapidly changing world. There is strength in numbers and if we wish to see the Association to survive, we need to change and enhance the next generation. The FPA needs a shot of adrenalin and then perhaps it will survive for another hundred years.

It was proven in the recent Annual General Meeting that the younger generation injected life into the FPA and came up with the ideas that had eluded us for a long time. We have three new members in David Hoyle, Eleanor and Philippa Parnell. The latter two are part of the next generation. We need to look to these and existing 'younger'

### Ramesh Gandhi



Former governor of the school Ramesh Gandhi died, at home on 20<sup>th</sup> June at the age of 88. I taught his sons, Mark and Neil and therefore met him and his wife, May many times in school.

He was a dedicated Heart consultant surgeon who saved the cardiac unit at Blackpool Victoria Hospital.

Ramesh was born in India and worked in several hospitals around the country, before taking up a post of surgeon at Blackpool Victoria Hospital in 1978. He was the man that put the cardiac unit on the map and made it one of the best in the North West and beyond.

Ramesh retired in 1994 but rather than taking things easy he continued to help the Vic by becoming director of fundraising and raising a massive £2.36m for the Vic's MRI Scanner Appeal. As well as saving the Cardiac Unit he was also involved in the Vic's Macmillan Windmill Suite, a dedicated research and development centre for oncology and haematology trials.

He was a founder member of the Fylde Coast Hindu Society and keenly involved in Water Aid, a charity focused on water, sanitation and hygiene. He even found time to be a councillor in fact the first Asian elected in Wyre. He also became deputy mayor, chairman of the Organ Donation Committee and volunteer health mentor and was awarded the OBE for services to the community in The Queen's Birthday Honours of 2007.

Whilst at Baines Ramesh and his wife May threw themselves whole heartedly in being involved with the Friends of Baines and later in the governance of the School.

Ramesh was a wonderful man a true gentleman. He was so well regarded in his professional field, in the wider community and in school but always with the strong support from his family.' The support from a family is a very rare commodity but it is the cornerstone and support in everything one does.

Condolences to May, Neil and Mark and their families from myself, the FPA and the Alumni.
