Your Parish Council is just embarking on developing a Neighbourhood Plan for the Parish.


Following on from previous articles in the Bowers Bugle and Bowers Gifford and North Benfleet Parish Council meetings the Parish has successfully been designated as a Neighbourhood Plan area by Basildon Council.

What next? The hard work starts!

In the coming weeks members of the Parish Council, with the help of some volunteers, will be knocking on your door to take your views into account when preparing the Plan. This will help add to Council's draft vision statement and priorities that have been compiled from the comments received at the initial drop-in sessions and Parish Council meetings over the past two years.

Your views are an important to us and are an essential part of developing a successful Plan. The hard work starts here but we cannot prepare the Plan without the help, involvement and engagement of you the community, both residents and businesses.

What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

The Localism Act 2011 introduced new powers for local people to make Neighbourhood Plans with reduced interference from government. A Neighbourhood Plan establishes general planning policies for the use and development of land in a Neighbourhood area.

The plans must however meet the needs of the wider area and the community. Where there is a Parish Council only the Parish Council can undertake developing a Neighbourhood Plan.

Why do we need one?

The Plan enables and allows people and businesses in the community a voice. Currently there are around 1,000 communities working on their own Neighbourhood Plans we are now one of these.

A Plan cannot stop development but it can help to protect our village from **OVER** development and urban sprawl within our Green Belt.

What makes up the Bowers Gifford & North Benfleet a Neighbourhood Area?

The existing Parish boundary is the designated area. You can view a map of the area on the Parish Council website.

Fly-tipping

Over the past 24 months the Parish Council has raised the issue of illegal fly-tipping with the authorities and put pressure on Essex County Council via the Local Highways Panel to obtian agreement to reinstate barriers in Church Road and underpass. In order to achieve this, there has to be a change to the Traffic Highways Regulation Order (TRO) to prohibit motor vehicles.



Essex County Council is now undertaking a consultation with statutory consultees to find o ut if there are any objections to the proposed changes. If no objections are received Essex County Council will restrict access at either end of Old Church Road early in 2017.

The Parish Council will continue to put pressure on Essex County Council to resolve this blight on our community as quickly as possible.

If you see any vehicle fly-tipping or persons acting in a suspicious manner please notify the Police with as much information regarding the vehicle as possible and report the fly-tipped material on the Essex County Council - www.essex.gov.uk or Basildon Council - www.basildon. gov.uk websites.

Essex County Council Community Work Award

Parish and Town Councils across Essex were nominated County Essex Council for Work Award. Community their Annual General Meeting September the Essex Association of Local Council's and Essex County Council the Parish Council took the Runner-Up spot. In giving the award to the Council John Gili-Ross. Chairman said that Bowers Gifford & North Benfleet Parish Council deserved the runners-up award this year for working (i) in partnership to arrange the Youth Bus activity for 13 – 16 year old: (ii) Forging ahead in the development of the Neighbourhood Plan and (iii) arranging the Picnic-in-the Park event to celebrate the Queen's 90th Birthday in addition to other community projects.

The Council was beaten into second place by Hullbridge Parish Council but were pleased to accept the award on behalf of the community of Bowers Gifford & North Benfleet.

Community Speed Watch (CSW) is a locally driven initiative where active members of the community join together with the support of the Police to monitor the speed of vehicles using Speed Detection devices. Vehicles exceeding the limit are referred to the Police with the aim of educating drivers to reduce their speeds. It is a proactive solution to improve the safety and quality of life for everyone in the community, increase public awareness of inappropriate speed and reduce the speed of vehicles to conform to the speed limit.

Volunteers receive appropriate training to use the equipment and record details of the speeding vehicles and are supported by the years, as has the sheer weight of Neighbourhood Policing team (NPT) staff. Where Water Goes

Earlier this year three residents Peter Bates, Jon Spooner and John Pettitt took up the challenge to plot the location of watercourses across the Parish on a map to help Essex County Council Flood Management Team identify where the Parish drainage network is and, working with their partners, to help reduce the risk of flooding.

The trio identified watercourses from Ashlyns on the far side of Burnt Mills Road, across the fields, open spaces and plotland areas to the A127 taking into account as many ditches and culverts they could find on their way.

Their results were then sent to the ECC Flood Team who transferred the results onto an Ordinance Survey Map.

A huge amount of thanks go to Peter, Jon and John for their time, hard work and diligence in taking part in this project.
