Essex County Council Youth Bus



On three occasions in October, working in partnership with Essex County Council Youth Workers, the Parish Council brought the ECC Youth Bus to Westlake Park, Pound Lane, with a view to engaging with younger members of the Parish.

The Drop – In sessions for teenagers, aged between 13-16 years, were a success and the Council propose to continue the project on alternate Thursdays. The next one will be the 4th December in Westlake Park, Pound Lane behind Wilton's Pet Shop from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. The Bus gives the young people the opportunity to meet friends, chat, have a coffee, watch videos and play video games and other activities in safety.

Where Does Water Go!

The Parish Council has been invited to take part in Essex Flood & Water Project *"Where Water Does Water Go?"*

The purpose of the project is to map ordinary watercourses such as culverts and ditches to find out where they go. Ordinary watercourses play an important part in reducing local flood risk and are often missing from maps and over time are forgotten. By understanding where they are a better understanding can be gained of the local drainage network. Local knowledge plays a vital part in obtaining this information. The project is running until April 2016.

What is the LHP?

What is the LHP? by Councillor Bernie Foster

As part of the Localism Act in 2011 and following the pretence of diversifying power Essex County Council set up Local Highways Panels (LHP's) in all 12 Essex Council districts in 2012.

Some districts embraced the challenge by establishing a group of County, Local and Parish Councillors fully participating at all levels Basildon Council chose not to do so. Their first meeting in May 2012 was a closed meeting and by the end of that first year despite their remarkable depth of knowledge the allocated budget for small works was underspent and the money went back to County Hall. In 2014/15 this has changed and the budget has been spent.

Currently Highways has a £1million budget and from this £130,000 is taken per District /Borough to cover small works across the County that make a huge difference to the appearance of the area. What it does not cover, however, is road maintenance schemes or parking schemes.

In 2014 I was elected as the Association of Basildon Local Councils observer on the Panel. Although I don't have a vote I can make suggestion and comments and I have taken the opportunity to comment on issues for many Parishes as well as the problems for our Parish at Sadlers Farm, dumping in Old Church Road and the need for a footpath near the bus stop in North Benfleet. As a result, subject to a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) being implemented, £4, 000 has been allocated to install bollards in Old Church Road and the sum of £55,000 has been allotted to install the path in North Benfleet.

Flooding

Grants to help protect your property against further surface water flooding are now available for residents to apply for. Application can be found on the Essex County Council website: *www.essex.gov.uk* or residents can email *Essex@aquobex.com* or contact *0844 798 1261* to find out if you are eligible for a Property Level Protection grant of up to £5,000.

Eligible grant recipients will be residential homeowners who have been flooded internally from ordinary watercourse; groundwater and surface water flooding and can provide demonstrable evidence of the impact of the flooding event.

In 2012 The Parish Council managed to obtain grants of this type for some residents living in Osborne Road. If you feel you might be eligible to obtain funding give Essex County Council a call.

Your complaint will be redirected to the Flood & Water Management Team who will investigate. You can also report any issues to the Parish Council Clerk who may also be able to help with information. Recently there have been some alleged incidents of landowners, as riparian owners, being responsible for flooding and these matters are being investigated.
