Work starts in Westlake Park

Works on Phase II of improvements to Westlake Park have started.

After more than 18 months of consultation, asking residents for their views and obtaining grant funding of £80,500 from Veolia North Thames Trust, Essex County Council Community Initiatives Fund and Basildon Borough Council, the Parish Council can at last move on with the improvements to West Lake Park.

Over the next weeks a path will be laid around the Park to make it more usable for everyone, before summer and winter. An Outdoor Gym for all ages and new gates will be installed, the car park and access road leading to the park will be resurfaced and some bins and seating will be introduced. It is also anticipated that there will be some planting to make the park more enjoyable for everyone all year round.

The Parish Council asks Park users to be patient while this work is going on and apologise for any inconvenience caused.



An Inspector listens

Developers, Meridian Strategic Land, arguments against the decision by Basildon Council to refuse planning permission to allow Nottinghamshire County Council to build on Little Chalvedon Hall Farm were heard by the Planning Inspector in a week long hearing at the end of February. During that time the Inspector also visited various locations around the Parish to see for herself what the area is like.



Basildon Council expertly stated their case for refusing the planning application and the Parish Councillors and Residents Association spoke eloquently in support of the refusal and cross examined the developers.

The Planning Inspector listened to the arguments from both sides and is due to report her findings as this newsletter goes to print. She will make a recommendation as to whether Nottingham/Meridian's Appeal to build on our green belt will be allowed or rejected and gave no indication of this decision at the hearing.

However, the final decision will lay with the Secretary of State who will issue his decision on or before 27th. June 2014.

RSPB Veolia Bowers Marsh nature reserve



Spring has sprung, and now is a fantastic time to visit RSPB Veolia Bowers Marsh, which can be found at the end of Church Road, past St Margaret's Church. Listen out for bearded tits 'pinging' away in the reedbed and

watch for marsh harriers flying overhead. The best places to see the first butterflies of spring are alongside the hedgerows, especially the old elm drove track alongside the public footpath heading down to the Old Saltings viewing point.

As waders and wildfowl return to their breeding grounds after winter it won't be long until we welcome summer migrants such as 'purring' turtle doves, an increasingly rare bird, but fortunately still found in this area of Essex.





MOBILE LIBRARY SERVICE

EssexWorks. For a better quality of life

The Mobile Library Service in Essex, which came into effect on the 4th July 2013, are proposing to make some changes to the Mobile Library routes and timetables in light of their experience so far and the feedback from users and other local stakeholders. The use of the service fluctuates current stopping patterns need to reflect demand in communities across Essex.

HOME SAFETY CHECKS



Essex County Fire and Rescue carries out free home safety checks and fits smoke alarms in homes across the county every year. Smoke alarms are proven life savers; they give vital early warning at the first sign of fire giving everyone time to get out to safety before

calling the fire service. The alarms are fitted by trained technicians who will also carry out a full home fire safety inspection.

There is no cost to the people receiving the visit and they are left safer in their homes and secure in the knowledge that they are as safe as possible from the risks posed by fire.

Throughout the winter the hard working wardens have been out on shingle islands in both the freshwater lagoon and the saline lagoon, removing vegetation to create large areas of bare shingle. This is perfect habitat for breeding birds such as little ringed plover and terns. A pair of oystercatchers have already been seen scouting out one of the shingle islands, so fingers crossed the hard work pays off!

With 6 km of accessible footpaths, a car park and public footpaths leading to Benfleet and Pitsea train stations, now is an excellent time to go for a stroll, enjoy this special reserve and look out for the wildlife that calls it home.

A Letter from the Parish Council

The Parish Council, like all organisations, is very conscious of costs and to this end the Parish Clerk is employed by the Council on a part time basis, 15 hours a week, Parish Councillors are not paid.

The days the Clerk works vary and you may experience some delay in receiving a reply to any telephone call or email, but you will receive one. Please just leave a message for her.

The Clerk, is the first point of contact for all Parish Council business, but your Parish Councillors are happy to receive texts or emails from you at any time. Please copy the Parish Clerk into any email.

A full list of Councillor contact and Parish Clerk's details are available in this newsletter.

We would ask that phone calls unless urgent be limited to normal daytime office hours 9 am – 5 pm Monday – Friday.

Please bear in mind that the Parish Council carries out no work directly, except in the case of some projects and have to place requests with the appropriate authority in the same way as any resident.

The Parish Council monitor responses from the authorities and try to achieve speedy action when possible but please bear in mind that departments such as Highways have a very heavy workload and can take a long time to respond to problems, so there is not always a quick solution.

In relation to this they often respond best when many people contact them on specific issues and so you will find links on our web site to allow you to report things such as potholes, lighting, dangerous pavements etc and we would urge you to use them. If you send an email to the Clerk to say that you have reported something and can supply any reference number we will monitor progress.

FLY TIPPING

Fly tipping is not acceptable at any time and the roadway leading from the London Road past the allotments leading to the Church Road underpass seems to be a favourite spot by someone who just doesn't care what problems are caused.

In the last 6 months this area has been cleared numerous times and the padlock removed from the bollards that are in place to stop this kind of anti- social behaviour.

To qualify as a Parish Councillor you must satisfy certain criteria and this information is on the Basildon council website. Follow the link on the Parish Council website www.essexinfo.net/gbnb-parishcouncil for more information.

Parish Council's are the 1st tier of local government and represent the people living in their local area at the closest level to the community. When decisions are made Councillors are there to put the views of residents across. Councillors represent the whole community not just their own views. Being a Councillor does not have to be time consuming, it depends on how much you want to get involved.

Bowers Gifford & North Benfleet Parish Council have 5 councillors at the present time but have the capacity for seven.
