The nightmare of Flooding in the Parish

The Parish Council has been trying to deal with the issue of flooding for some years, but it cannot resolve the problem on its own it has to be in partnership with the Environment Agency, Anglian Water, Essex County Council and you as a resident and landowner. Landowners, as Riparian owners, have a responsibility to keep water courses and ditches clear. Many ditches have been filled in and therefore the water cannot flow away easily and this adds to the flooding issue.

In 2014, as part of a government initiative, flood prevention was installed in some properties in Osborne Road in consultation with residents.

In 2016, in partnership with Essex County Council, three resident volunteers helped the Parish Council on a project called "Where Water Goes" and plotted the locations of watercourses across the Parish to enable Essex County Council Flood Management Team to identify on a map where the Parish drainage network is with the aim of reducing flooding in various parts of the Parish. The results were then transferred by ECC onto an Ordinance Survey Map and in 2017 the Parish Council met with Anglian Water and the Environment Agency and as a result in 2018 a pumping station was installed in Elm Road and Burnt Mills Road to help reduce localised flooding.



However, as a result of heavy rain earlier in the year which caused flash flooding Councillor Foster, Parish Council Chair, Pitsea South-East Ward Councillor Craig Rimmer and Stephen Metcalf, MP for Basildon and East Thurrock, met with the various agencies in April, virtually via Zoom, to once again discuss the flooding in Pound Lane and Burnt Mills Road.

The Environment Agency is now looking at the problem and gathering information as part of their evidence base and another meeting is planned as soon as investigations are completed.

As part of the review and evidence gathering it is the intention of the Parish Council to hold a meeting with the Burnt Mills Road residents to get some history and photos of the area and how it used to be to see what can feasibly be done to solve the problem and we will be doing this as soon as possible.

The Parish Council Year

The National lockdown in 2020 and Covid – 19 saw lifestyle changes in a way that nobody ever thought of and the Parish Council has tried to provide a "business as usual approach" during this period regardless of the issues brought on by the pandemic.

The past year has been remarkably busy, face to face meetings were not possible but with the assistance of technology, via Zoom and Microsoft Teams, the Parish Council have been able to successfully achieve many of its planned goals.

April 2020 started with the delivery of the Bugle newsletter and letters to the over 76 members of the community with an offer of help with shopping, collecting prescription and anything else needed by our older and most vulnerable residents.

Shopping and prescriptions were collected, transport for doctor visits arranged in the early days and new friendships forged with people we had never or had any contact with before and some even continue to this day.

The Parish Council was successful in applying for grant funding to provide for (i) a handyman/woman service (which we hope to shortly recruit to) (ii) to develop part of the Neighbourhood Plan policy (iii) planters to prevent continuous damage to the verge on the London Road, at Ilfracombe Avenue. Having managed to obtain £3950 for four planters, we are now applying for further funding to complete the project.

The Parish Council is now apply for funding for two defibrillators, equipment for operating the handyman service and to develop a Circular Walk pathway around parts of the village to open up our Public Rights of Way and enable people to enjoy walking and cycling around the village countryside.

The Parish-in-Bloom Event last July was cancelled but each entry received a voucher from Alton Garden Centre. The event is going ahead this year and entry details are in this newsletter.

Improving Play in Westlake Park

As part of Basildon Council's Play Review programme it has been recognised that there are more opportunities to improve play facilities in Westlake Park.

At the Leisure and Environment Committee meeting on 24th June 2021, chaired by Pitsea South-East Ward Councillor Craig Rimmer, £35,000 was pledged towards enhancing the play facilities in Westlake Park.

The Parish Council met with Basildon Council Officers and Councillor Rimmer on 19th July and some ideas were put forward. We would however like to know the views of you our residents and our young people and we are going to consult with you on your ideas from 30th July until 21st August to find out what you think. As always, the Parish Council has been reviewing and commenting on Planning Applications within the Parish and making their views known to Basildon Council Planning Officers in order for the Planning Committee to make the decision.

The BGNB Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group continue to meet to move forward with the Neighbourhood Plan. The residents who have been involved throughout the process deserve **A BIG THANK YOU** for their support in helping the Parish Council develop a Neighbourhood Plan that is acceptable to the community.

In November we carried out a mini consultation to obtain views of residents on the Plan so far and its proposals and the results can be seen on the Parish Council website with the majority of residents who commented giving it the green light.

Neil Homer, our Neighbourhood Plan consultant, after over four years, continues to provide the support to the Parish Council to deliver a successful Plan which will benefit the Parish Council's "One Village" approach and ensure that the changes which have been brought in by the National Planning Policy Framework benefit the community in future years.

Since March progress has been slow due to Basildon Council's Local Plan Examination, to be held last September, being delayed. As it stands the Neighbourhood Plan cannot move forward until the Local Plan has been accepted. The Local Plan Examiner has written to Basildon Council for more information on a number of points. The Borough Council has also recently re-consulted on its Town Centre development plans. The outcome may result in further delays in respect of the Examination.

The Great British Clean Up

Well done to our residents and Parish Councillors who took part in the Nationwide Great British Clean Up on 13th June and collected over 10 black sacks of rubbish. It's hoped to repeat the exercise again before the end of summer.

Planters replace cars!

Parking at St Margaret's School is not directly in the hands of the Parish Council but after the trying through dialogue to stop the indiscriminate and dangerous parking on the verge on the London Road beside Ilfracombe Avenue it decided to act.

With the help of Councillor Craig Rimmer, Ward Councillor and Essex County Council it has been able to take small steps to resolve the problem by installing planters on the verge.

Once the project is completed driving over the footpath in front of pedestrians to get off the verge, damaging the verge and underground utilities will not be able to be accomplished. Funding was secured for four planters and an application has been made for another four to complete the project. The planters also give a focal point on the approach to Bowers Gifford.

John Cole Memorial Stone

A memorial stone at All Saints Church in North Benfleet to commemorate John Cole, a foot soldier who served in the Grenadier Guards during the Napoleonic Wars was vandalised in May.

M & J Memorials offered to replace the stone free of charge and the Parish Council is co-ordinating this with Martin Rees of M & J Memorials, John & Robert Lyons and Father Jakob, the Greek Orthodox Parish Priest of All Saints Church,

The new stone will be made of granite and is currently being shipped from overseas and should arrive at the beginning of August. The stone will replicate the wording of the original and when the work has been completed arrangements will then be made to ceremonially replace the new stone at All Saints Church.

Old Church Road

Early in the year Old Church Road flooded due to contractors blocking a pipe in the ditches alongside the road at the Junction of the London Road. Negotiations took place with Essex & Suffolk Water and contractors came back and cleared the ditch and managed to expose the outlet pipe which should resolve the issue. In addition promising discussions are ongoing with ECC Structural Engineers which will hopefully see the Old Church road underpass refurbished at last.
