BACK TO THE FUTURE

Basildon Council's decision to withdraw its Emerging Local Plan and placing a greater emphasis on protecting the Green Belt for current and future generations meant the Parish Council can no longer move forward with its Neighbourhood Plan in its present form. The decision to review the Local Plan doesn't mean there will not be any development in the village but the decision will now reduce this amount.

To overcome large scale development in the future the Parish Council is intending to bring forward Neighbourhood Development Orders, aimed at encouraging and controlling housing development on the edge of the village and in the plotlands. The proposed Neighbourhood Development Orders will cover Bowers Gifford and the North Benfleet plotlands.

The Parish Council has secured a grant of £96,500 from Locality. a national network supporting Neighbourhood Planning and will now work with its consultants and the BGNB Steering Group, to carry out a Feasibility Study to identify smaller sites that are most suitable for new homes. Once completed residents will be consulted on the results and this consultation will determine if the Parish Council will move forward with Neighbourhood Development Orders.

However he remained an integral part of the Parish Council until the May elections. Councillor Potter joined the Parish Council in 2016 and has played an integral part in the Parish Council's decision making on a variety of issues.

Both will be missed as Parish Councillors and are sincerely thanked for the part they have played in raising the profile of the Parish to where we are now.

DEFIBRILLATORS SAVE LIVES

Members of the Parish Council and Andrew Rickard, a resident, took part in the Annual Fun Walk Trust's 5K Walk on 4th September to raise money for two Defibrillators.

Due to Covid restrictions they walked 14 times round Westlake Park to complete the 5K distance. A total of £1270 including a £400 sponsor from the family of Chris Wilks, who sadly had a heart attack and died at last years Picnic-in-the Park event in August. The Trust then increased the amount by a further £381.

Memet Mustafa of TML then donated £500 and Jan Baldwin and her daughter, Jane, set up a Facebook Just Giving Page in memory of Charlie Baldwin, who sadly passed away last year and collected a further £1277. The Defibrillators have now been installed but without the support of you, the community, this would never have happened.

PARKING PERILS

Are you one of many that park on the pavements?

We understand there is not much room on the roads of the parish to park, but please be aware that taking up too much space on the footpath is not only illegal, it's also very dangerous for those members of the public who have to use the pavements and have to go around your vehicle and into the road.

If you have to park on the pavement leave enough room for a person with a pram, buggy or mobility scooter to pass **don't use** all the pavement space, park sensibly!

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH HELP REDUCE SPEEDING IN POUND LANE

Speeding through the village is becoming more of a concern, with Pound Lane increasingly being used as a cut through for traffic at all hours of the day and night. The Parish Council and Essex County Councillors have asked Essex Highways for a Speed Survey to be carried out to demonstrate the need for speed reduction measures. In October 2019 the Parish Council set up the Community Speed Watch Project but it was then suspended due to Covid. We are now aiming to revive the Project to alert drivers to the need to reduce their speed through the village, but it can't do this without residents volunteering to help collect the evidence.

JOHN COLE HEAD STONE



The Parish Council has been liaising with M & J Memorials who are replacing the headstone of Grenadier Guardsman John Cole which was vandalised at all Saints Church, North Benfleet, last year. It is anticipated the headstone will be back in its place by the 18th June, the date of the Battle of Waterloo. John Cole was a thirty year-old footsoldier in the Second Battalion of the **Grenadier Guards**.

In 1815 he was marching towards

Waterloo (in present day Belgium) and during the Battle he was wounded by a musket ball but carried on until the victory was won. He returned home to Essex but later died in the Parish of North Benfleet, Wickford, in 1836. A huge amount of thanks goes to Martin Rees of M & J Memorials who has replaced the head stone free of charge.

A YEAR IN THE LIFE OF THE PARISH COUNCIL

Despite Covid restrictions over the past months the Parish Council has been very busy.

The Neighbourhood Plan has taken up many hours of research, discussion and meetings with long suffering Steering Group members including residents and developers. The NP has been moth balled for the time being but the work does not stop. £96,500 of funding has now been secured to look at proposals for Neighbourhood Development Orders and these proposals will be consulted on with residents in the Autumn.

A grant of £4,160 was obtained via the Essex Association of Local Councils Community Initiative Fund to pay for a part-time Handyperson to carry out many tasks not covered by external contractors and a further grant of £2500 was obtained for equipment in connections with the work generated. To continue with this service the Parish Council will have to seek more funding. With the help of Pitsea Essex County Councillor, Councillor Luke Makenzie, funding was secured for the Planters which we have been installed on the London Road.

Funding of £5,000 was secured from Basildon Council during 2021 to support the Neighbourhood Plan prior to the Council's decision to withdraw the Local Plan.



A BIG THANK YOU goes to the Lottery Community Fund for a grant of £3840 to support our Jubilee Event on 5th June.

We took part in the Keep Britain tidy Spring Clean-Up in June 2021 and with residents we collected 16 bags of rubbish and hope to take part in this year's Summer Clean-Up.

The Parish-in-Bloom Event in July was once again a success and standards were very high.

The Parish Council discussed Planning Applications and forwarded their observations to Basildon Council and Essex County Council.

During the Covid pandemic the Parish Council collected prescriptions and shopped for residents who were unable to get out during this period and made new friends as a result.

A consultation was held with young people to determine the type of additional equipment they would like to see in Westlake Park. The overwhelming choice was a Zip-wire and a Climber of sorts, with a trampoline for the play area. Basildon Council have pledged £35K to the project and discussion are ongoing to find ways to fund raise for any short fall. Any overall profit from the Jubilee event will be set aside for this Project.

WHAT IS A NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT ORDER?

A Neighbourhood Development Order can grant planning permission for specified developments in a neighbourhood area. Once established there would be no need to apply to Basildon Borough Council for planning permission if it is for the type of development covered by the Development Order.
