BACK TO THE FUTURE - UPDATE

A message from the Chairman

You may recall in our summer issue "Back to the Future" I explained the reasons for the Parish Councils change of direction from working towards a Neighbourhood Plan to Neighbourhood Development Orders as we believe most of the village would prefer limited development.

The £96,500 we managed to obtain to fund the NDO Feasibility Study has been allocated to various experts who are producing the documents needed to support our case. As a result, if successful, we will have effectively reduced development in the village from 3500 dwellings to less than 500.

The findings of the studies completed so far are being discussed with the Parish Council Steering Group, comprises of Parish Councillors and Residents who have been with us throughout the Neighbourhood Plan process and continue this journey with Neighbourhood Development Orders process. The Parish Council have met with Basildon Council to determine the level of support we can expect from them.

The main aim of Neighbourhood Development Orders is to create a safer and healthier environment in the plotlands for those who want it and we will be looking to talk to all interested parties, for and against, regarding our proposals. In addition, there will also be some limited other areas of development within the village to help with sustainability and infrastructure needs, as well as trying to give some bias to local resident purchases. We are also looking to try and create green passages to connect the village safely.

As the Feasibility Study starts to evolve, we will consult with residents on progress and ask for your comments in the same way as we did with the Neighbourhood Plan.

Our aim will be to retain the rural aspect of the village, protect against future large-scale development and continue to challenge traffic concerns, although this outcome will lie with Essex County Council. More information will be in future Parish Council newsletters.

CHURCH ROAD SUBWAY TO GET NEW LIGHTS



After nearly four years of raising the issue of the poor condition of the subway some minor works were completed last year. We have now been notified by Essex County Council that more refurbishment works are due to be undertaken in Spring 2023. The subway will be closed for the duration of the works and a diversion route will be in place for pedestrians and equestrians. Refurbishment works will consist of:

- Concrete repairs to reinstate the fire damaged internal surfaces of the subway.
- Cleaning and painting of all internal subway surfaces.
- The existing damaged lighting system will be replaced.
- Concrete bollards will be installed at each end of the subway to prevent future vehicle ingress.

FREE WINTER SALT

The Parish Council is again taking part in Essex County Council's Winter Salt Scheme.

The collection point to pick up the rock salt is **The Green Barn on the A130** between Sadlers Farm and the Fairglen Interchange.

The Salt is in 25kg bags and **FREE** to residents who live in Bowers Gifford & North Benfleet who are able bodied and can spread on the roads and other areas not covered by Essex County Council gritters.

Please note - The salt is not for personal use.

Please ask the shop assistant at The Geen Barn for the salt and provide proof of your address when collecting your bags of salt

PARKING ON THE PAVEMENT

There is not much room on Pound Lane or the roads of the parish to park but be aware that taking up too much room on the pavement is not only illegal it is also dangerous for members of the public who have to go around your vehicle and into the road.

If you must park on the pavement leave enough room for a pushchair/buggy or mobility scooter to pass. **Don't use all the pavement leave room to pass and park sensibly!**

SAVE LIVES, SLOW DOWN

The speed of traffic in Pound Lane and many of the side roads in the village is increasing. Keep our roads safe and **SLOW DOWN** you will still get to where you want to go in good time and in one piece.

RECYCLING AND RUBBISH COLLECTION

Changes to the Borough's Recycling & Rubbish Collection Service came into effect on 3rd October 2022 with separate collections for food and garden waste

The smaller 25Itr Green Waste Bin is for all Food Waste, Black sacks are for household rubbish, pink sacks for recycled materials. The Large Green Bin is for Garden Waste but not food waste. Garden Waste and glass are collected fortnightly. Food waste is collected weekly via your green caddy.



Don't forget to put your property number or identity on the green food waste container to avoid getting it mixed-up with your neighbour's bin. If your large Green Waste bin is broken it be replaced – free-of-charge.

MORE CHANGES TO COME

Basildon Council's Cabinet met on Tuesday 6th December and agreed improvements to the way they will collect waste and recycling in future to make the service more sustainable and environmentally friendly, A wheeled bin service for black sack waste, plus two reusable sacks - one for paper and card and one for plastics and materials will be introduced. The improvements will help the Council to meet the Environment Act, reduce the amount of waste going to landfill by around 20%, and increase the amount recycled to help reach the target of a 65% recycling rate by 2035. COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH SCHEME IN SPRING 2023

The Parish Council is looking to revive the Community Speed Watch (CSW). This is a scheme to allow volunteers to monitor the speed of passing vehicles using a hand-held speed detection device.

SPEEDING THREATENS LIVES

Volunteers record the details of vehicles which are exceeding the speed limit by around 10%. It is designed to alert drivers of the perils of speeding with the use of camera guns. The Parish Council can't operate the CSW scheme on its own, it needs volunteers to help. THE it can make all the difference to having safer roads.

THE PARISH COUNCIL YEAR

2022 has again been a very busy year for the Parish Council, the easing of lockdown has meant we are now able to hold Parish Council Meetings in public again and all are welcome to attend and we continue to be the voice of the community and raise your concerns with Basildon & Essex County Council.

Footpaths, potholes, parking and speeding are always on the top of the agenda for discussion. At every opportunity, the Parish Council seeks to raise concerns about the condition of our footpaths, roads and speeding traffic with Ward Councillors and Essex County Councillors to pressure Essex County Council. With the support of our Ward Councillors, potholes have been filled in and some footpaths repaired but there is still a long way to go.



Our part-time Handyman Service has flourished with areas not covered by Basildon or Essex County Council tidied up or improved. The Handyman Service project and equipment was funded by a grant from the Essex Association of Local Councils Community Initiatives Fund. The community has also played their part in helping and providing wheelie bins for the green waste to be recycled. Areas which were dumping grounds have been tidied and shrubs pruned and grass cut but to continue with the service the Parish Council will need to seek more funding or it will have to be discontinued.

Another four planters were installed on London Road this year funded by resources acquired by Luke Makenzie, our Essex County Councillor. Geraniums provided a splash of colour in the summer months and Wallflowers and Bellis will provide Spring colour next year.

Our two Defibrillators have been installed outside The Benbow Club and The Mission this year thanks to the generosity of the community and fundraising. However, we hope they will never be used but if they are they will save lives.

Our Parish in Bloom Event in August was cancelled due to the hot weather, but we hope the weather will be kind to our garners in 2023
