Do you know? the Travelling Library is parked in Pound Lane, near to the Garden Centre from 11.15 -11.45, every third week. The next visit will be on 10th January 2020

(You can reserve any book you want online and reserve it at the Pitsea Library, Northlands Pavement, Pitsea and pick it up from the library bus on its next visit.)

Bus timetable: the NO. 21 Bus run by Nibs leaves the lower end of Pound Lane on the hour between 7 am and 5 pm every day except Sunday.

The Parish Council is a member of the Bus Transport discussion group and seeks every opportunity to ensure the Parish retain its bus service.

How is the Parish council working on your behalf?

Our bus shelters have been cleaned! Essex county council do not clean the bus Shelters and a window contractor has been engaged to clean our bus shelters along Pound Lane periodically. It will be two cleans a year to start with but could increase to three.

The verges were cut back at the top of Pound Lane in the summer by Basildon Council's Pride Team at the request of residents and now the vegetation encroaching on the foot path on the London Road has been cut back.

The entrance to the park has been swept recently to remove the leaves that were causing it to be slippery. The Parish Council has engaged with residents to take part in Essex County Council Fire and Rescue Speed Watch Project.

Many other issues have been lodged with Essex County council highways. Your Parish Council continue raise the profile of the village to try to improve the neighbourhood and here's one way we can all help by making sure -



Moving forward with the Neighbourhood Plan



You will be aware from previous editions of the Bowers Bugle newsletter that the Parish Council is preparing a Neighbourhood Plan for the whole of Bowers Gifford & North Benfleet to get the best deal for new development in our area. Saying "No" to development is not an option!

The Bowers Gifford & North Benfleet Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group, which includes both residents and Parish Councillors, are looking at where development can go which will create a vision of "One Village," compliments existing housing and which remains separated from Basildon by our Green Belt instead of Basildon Council deciding for us.

Having fought hard to reduce the numbers of homes for proposed developed in the Parish from 2800 to 1350 Basildon Council's Local Plan now gives the Parish Council and the community, a definite say and control over where these 1350 homes will be built and where infrastructure improvements should be shaped. The Parish Council and Steering Group are working hard on the Neighbourhood Plan to have it ready for the Local Plan examination in the spring/summer of 2020.

Basildon Borough Council is working towards the conclusion of its Local Plan process and as such the Neighbourhood Plan needs to finalise its priorities too.

After a long process which has taken nearly 4 year the Parish Council will be carrying out a series of consultation events on their proposals at the end of January 2020.

These consultations may be the last opportunities, before Basildon Borough Council Local Plan examination, to have your say and air your agreement or your disagreement to the detail being proposed in the Neighbourhood Plan.

The dates will be published early January so please take every opportunity to come along to the drop-in sessions or meetings and give the Parish Council your views.

Welcome to our new Councillors

At the Parish Council meeting in September two new Councillors were co-opted on to the Parish Council to bring the number of Councillors to six with just one vacancy to be filled. The Parish Council works on behalf of you, its community of Bowers Gifford & North Benfleet, to help make the village a better place to live.

GEORGE'S STORY - Living in the plotlands in the 70's



George and Doreen Outen live in Osborne Road as they have done for more than 50 years. George was born in 1934 in Pitseaville Grove, Pitsea but moved away to Rainham after marrying Doreen who lived in Romford at the time. In 1971 they purchased their house in Osborne Road which at the time was called "The Nook" and was one of only five properties in the road. It was originally

built in 1896 by Frances Charlton Whitmore and was part of the North Benfleet Park Estate. The house was later renamed "Woodside" They moved in with their two children of 5 years and 3 years old and put a caravan on the site to live in whilst renovating the bungalow. Like most of the plotland properties of the time it was originally a weekend cottage for people from London and built of timber and rough caste concrete. There was no mains water or electricity supply and the toilet was a bucket. A stand - pipe a few yards along the road provided the water and in the Summer the coal was delivered for the Winter. Pound Lane in the 70's was the main commercial route from Canvey Oil Refinery to the A127. George had no building skills and had to learn quickly and had many disasters whilst trying to rebuild the house for his family to live in. Once he got a £200 grant to build a cesspit in the garden and when he dug deep down the ground was thick yellow clay and when he went to shore-up the sides of the hole the frame collapsed, the hole caved in again and they had to re-dig it. After that he set about rebuilding the house and Doreen went out to Pitsea market and came back to find half the house missing and open to the elements. George would leave his muddy boots at the Mission in Pound Lane to go to work and collect them in the evening on the way home. Doctors would not come out when anyone was sick, so you made sure you were never sick.

However, all in all things have turned out well and he can now sit and watch the many different kinds of birds in his back garden with Doreen from the comfort of his conservatory.

Community speed watch gets off the ground



Community Speed Watch is a scheme to help people reduce speeding traffic through their community. The scheme enables volunteers to work together to raise awareness of the dangers of speeding and to help control the problem locally. Residents have come forward to volunteer to help the Parish Council to reduce the speeding traffic in Pound Lane. The volunteers recently underwent training with Essex County Council Fire and Rescue, who manage the scheme, and are now ready to alert Police to drivers who do not respect the speed limit through the village. The Parish Council have replaced the memorial tree in Westlake Park which died during the summer due to the heat. The original tree was planted in 2017 to commemorate William Gallant, a soldier who lived in Bowers Gifford and served in WW1. The new tree is an **Acer Crimson King**, which when fully grown has deep red leaves and will complement the existing landscape in the park.

FREE Winter Salt

The Parish Council is again taking part in Essex County Council's Winter Salt Scheme. The collection point, to pick up the rock salt, is **The Green Barn on the A130** between Sadlers Farm and the Fairglen Interchange.

The Salt is in 25kg bags and **FREE** to residents who live in Bowers Gifford & North Benfleet who are able bodied and can spread on the roads and other areas not covered by Essex County Council gritters. Please note: The salt is not for personal use.

Please ask the shop assistant for the salt and provide proof of your address when collecting when collecting your bags of salt.
