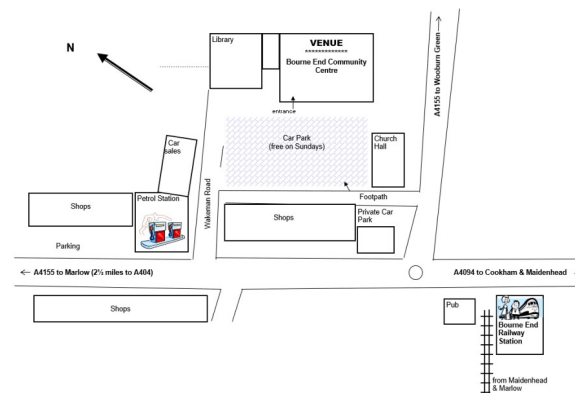

One-day five-round rapid play tournament for
players of all strengths.

The Congress will be divided into sections of
between 12 and 20 players of a similar playing
strength (based on current ratings).

Based on previous years the top section is likely to be
for players with ratings of 2000 or above, whilst the
lowest section would be players rated under 1500.

Each player has 40 minutes to make all moves.

Regular participants should note the revised start times and move rate.

Results are forwarded to the ECF for rating purposes.

If not staying for prize giving, please ensure we have your address or bank details.

RULES

The FIDE Rules for rapid play events apply.

Particular note should be taken of the following rules.

- a) Mobile phones and other electronic devices should be completely switched off whilst playing.
- b) If a player makes an illegal move the board is re-set and two minutes will be added to his/her opponent's time. If a player makes two illegal moves he/she forfeits the game.
- c) Checkmate ends the game without the clock being stopped. No claims can be made after checkmate.
- d) If a player notes that the flag on the clock of his/her opponent has fallen, the player may claim a win provided his/her own flag has not fallen and he/she is able to win by legal moves. Flag-falls should not be pointed out by anyone other than the players in the game in question. If a player points out that both flags are down the game is drawn. If you are a spectator, please do not interfere by pointing out a flag fall.
- e) During the last two minutes on a player's clock, a player may claim a draw on the basis that his/her opponent cannot win by normal means, and/or that his/her opponent has been making no effort to win by normal means: If not agreed, he/she should summon the controller who may declare the game drawn or instruct that the game continues with two minutes added to the opponent's time and a clock with five second increments substituted. A player may not claim a draw after his/her flag has fallen except as stated in d).
- f) For any query requiring the controller, clocks may be stopped.
- g) There is no requirement to record moves, but a completed score sheet may be necessary to validate any claim for either a win or a draw under b) or e) above.
- h) By entering the Congress players undertake to play in all 5 rounds, players withdrawing after the first round may not be eligible to play in future congresses.
- i) Rapid play rating, where available, determines initial ranking.

Competitors are requested not to re-play or analyse in the Tournament Hall. Please reposition pieces and reset clocks once your game is finished.

Acknowledgements and receipts will only be sent if a stamped addressed envelope, is enclosed with entry, or an email address is advised.

Entries close on Wednesday 6th April.

Entries after this date may be accepted, subject to payment of a Late Entry Fee of £3.00.
