Reading 2 2 Peter 3.8-15a

⁸ But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: with the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. ⁹ The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.

¹⁰ But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything done in it will be laid bare.

¹¹ Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives ¹² as you look forward to the day of God and speed its coming. That day will bring about the destruction of the heavens by fire, and the elements will melt in the heat. ¹³ But in keeping with his promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, where righteousness dwells.

John the Baptist prepares the way

1 The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God, ² as it is written in Isaiah the prophet:

- 'I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way' –
- ³ 'a voice of one calling in the wilderness,
- "Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him."
- ⁴ And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptised by him in the River Jordan. ⁶ John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt round his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And this was his message: 'After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of

whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸ I baptise you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

Sermon – Change & Re-Set

Today is the second Sunday of Advent where we remember the theme of peace and the person of John The Baptist, as we light the second candle on our Advent wreath.

John The Baptist is a unique figure, who comes out of nowhere with the introduction of Mark's Gospel which we hear today. Let us picture ourselves at the time and place when John bursts onto the scene proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.

As we hear John cry out to us, we are to recall the promises we made in our Baptism as we enter this new Christian year. This year has been one of a kind and our emotions have been all over the place. We haven't had the opportunity to be

together to encourage one another, worship together, embrace one another, pray with each other and minister together as we reach out to others with the love of Christ.

The prophet Isaiah continues to be included in our readings today, saying:-

3 "A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. 4 Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain."

As we hear John The Baptist crying out to us, we are to make that change of mindset that repentance calls for and make our ways straight for the coming of our God at Christmas. This is the way that God comforts us as we hear from the prophet Isaiah. By making our peace with ourselves and with God, this sets us free to serve him as God calls us into the light of his kingdom. As we do this in the coming weeks in Advent, we may want to straighten out our emotions, the type of things we got stuck into during lockdown and re-set ourselves for holy conduct as our reading from Peter exhorts us, for the new year of 2021.

We are to be confessed, be forgiven, be repentant, changed, and ready for the Spirit of God to enter us and lay claim to us. Advent is about preparation, purification, and restoration of our lives and our world. In Hebrew it is called the work of tikkum olam, repairing the world. It is the true work of all believers. It is the concrete expression of how "justice walks before him". This will give us much peace as we come to celebrate the birth of the Christ child at Christmas and seek to make those Baptism promises afresh of following our Lord, as our hopefully our country and world starts to open up again with the coming of the new vaccines.

On this second Sunday of Advent we are summoned by John the Baptist to remember our own baptisms and our commitments to the truth, to the Word of the Lord in the Scriptures, to our role as God's people who serve the poor in the work for justice with them, so that truly there is good news to proclaim from the highest places on earth, **Amen.**

In Baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore Lask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

I come to Christ.

A journalist named Ann Medlock founded an award called "The Giraffe Project" to honor people who courageously spoke up on behalf of others and worked for justice, people who stuck their necks out on behalf of those who were being treated badly, unfairly. We need to look around us, see who should be given the Giraffe Award, encourage them in their work, and stand with them: people who work with immigrants caught in cold-hearted rules and systems that are intent

on keeping people out rather than welcoming them into this country; people who are advocates on behalf of children on the street, laboring in fields and factories, as prostitutes bought and sold in markets around the world; those who work for treaties banning land mines, nuclear weapons, poison gases, and pesticides; those who work for the rights of farmworkers and those struggling in service industries at minimum wage. All these people in their daily lives and their dedication remember the dream of "kindness and truth meeting and justice and peace kissing, truth springing out of the earth while justice looks down from heaven". All of these people have a streak of the spirit of John the Baptizer in their souls and use their portion of spirit to prepare a way for God in our world.

There is a Chinese saying that can teach us in small ways how to remember this dream of justice and peace kissing: "Putting on clothes, remember the weaver's work; eating daily food, remember the farmer's toil. Guide the blind over the bridge and the lame one over the threshold." (Source Advent, Christmas and Epiphany – Megan McKenna).


