## From the Vicarage

Dear Friends,

As we move into April, we prepare to celebrate the great feast of the resurrection

of our Lord. Easter Sunday comes and goes with all the celebrations, but I wonder if, this year, we could continue to think and reflect beyond Easter, about the resurrection and what this means for us.

Please come along to celebrate Easter with us at any of our services. We will begin on Maundy Thursday at 7pm at St Thomas' Church in Bradwell, as we remember the Last Supper. On Good Friday, there will be a Holy Communion Service at St Lawrence Church at 11.30am, then at 12.45pm a walk of witness from St Thomas Church in Bradwell to St Peter's Chapel in Bradwell, followed by an hour of meditation from 2-3pm.



Our Easter Sunday celebration begins at 6am at St Peter's Chapel, with the Bish-

op of Chelmsford; afterwards sharing breakfast at the Othona Community. There will also be services at 10am at Bradwell, Tillingham and St Lawrence Church and Church Centre, and a service at Dengie at 3pm.

There are events for children in Holy Week on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> April in St Lawrence with the Woodland Walk from 11am-1.30pm and on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> April at 3pm with Messy Church in Tillingham. We will have held our Easter School Services in the previous week.

As we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord, let us give thanks for Jesus' sacrifice on the cross which he did for us, so we can live in eternity with him.

He is risen, Alleluia!

## Palm Sunday & Holy Week

The events of Easter took place over a week, traditionally called Passion Week. It began on Palm Sunday. After all His teaching and healing, Jesus had built a following.

On the Sunday before He was to die, Jesus and His followers arrived at Jerusalem. The city was crowded. Jewish people were arriving to celebrate Passover. This commemorates how they had escaped from slavery in Egypt nearly 1,500 year earlier.

Jesus rode into the city on a young donkey. He was greeted like a conquering hero. Cheering crowds waved palm branches in tribute. He was hailed as the Messiah who had come to re-establish a Jewish kingdom.

The next day they returned to Jerusalem. Jesus went to the temple, the epicentre of the Jewish faith, and confronted the money-changers and merchants who were ripping off the people. He overturned their tables and accused them of being thieves. The religious authorities were alarmed and feared how He was stirring up the crowds.

On the Tuesday, they challenged Jesus, questioning His authority. He answered by challenging and condemning their hypocrisy. Later that day Jesus spoke to His disciples about future times. He warned them about fake religious leaders; the coming destruction of Jerusalem; wars, earthquakes and famines; and how His followers would face persecution.

By midweek the Jewish religious leaders and elders were so angry with Jesus that they began plotting to arrest and kill Him. One of Jesus' disciples, Judas, went to the chief priests and agreed to betray Him to them.

Jesus and the 12 disciples gathered on the Thursday evening to celebrate the Passover meal. This is known as the Last Supper. During the evening, Jesus initiated a ritual still marked by Christians – Holy Communion – which commemorates His death. Jesus broke bread and shared it and a cup of wine with His disciples.

Judas then left to meet the other plotters. Jesus

continued to teach the others and then went outside into an olive grove to pray. He even prayed for all future believers. He agonised over what was to come but chose the way of obedience. The Bible book, Luke, records Him praying, 'Father if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will but yours be done'. Minutes later Judas arrived with soldiers and the chief priests and Jesus was arrested.

## Tales from RAF Bradwell Bay

A little-studied part of the infrastructure of WW2 is that of requisitioned properties. The government had the power to seize and use properties, mainly larger properties for war purposes such as Headquarters, training, and hospitals for example.

Bradwell on Sea was not immune from this, The MP for Maldon. Tom Driberg, had to move out of Bradwell Lodge so his house and grounds could be used as an officer's mess. He moved to a house called Riverview on Bradwell Waterside. A total of 10 Properties were requisitioned:

Peverills Officer's Quarters

Down Hall Officer's Quarters

The Holt **WAAF Officers Quarters** 

Tudor Hall WAAF Quarters & MT Yard

WAAF Quarters - 2 Nissan Huts

Bradwell Lodge Officers Mess & Quarters (100)

Highfields Sick Quarters (20 Beds)

East Wick Squadron Headquarters

Weymarks House Squadron Headquarters

St Cedds Senior NCO's Quarters

wanted vacant possession in 1 month.

Yacht Club R.A.F. Regiment Headquarters Tudor Hall, (now known as New Hall) in the High Street, was taken over, a uniformed RAF Officer and a civilian from the Air Ministry visited the house without notice and told the resident, Mrs Anna Child, they wanted to view the property. The RAF Officer, after viewing said they wanted to take the whole property and

Tudor Hall was a large house with grounds and gardens of 2.5 acres and a 6 Acre pasture. The occupants were Maurice Child and his wife Anna, Anna's mother aged 81 and Anna's Sister, Dorothea, aged 41 and an 8-year-old girl (details obscured on the 1939 Register), and a 28-year-old servant, Jetha. The animals consisted of poultry, 2 pedigree milking goats, a horse and dogs and cats.

The family moved to Surrey, claims for the upheaval went on until 1947. The family did not return to Bradwell on Sea.

## Can you count quickly?





Moving to North Somerset a few weeks ago I knew I would be close to where huge numbers of starlings regularly gather at night-fall throughout winter and perform spectacular flying displays. These take place over suitable roosting places, such as extensive reed beds. Shapwick Heath, just over half-an-hour's drive away from my new home, Clevedon, is a National Nature Reserve, and well-known for such gatherings, known as "murmurations".

So at the end of February a Saturday afternoon's birdwatching was planned. The walk to Shapwick from the RSPB carpark at Ham Wall is along an old railway track, through old peat workings — a wonderful area of shallow lagoons, reed beds and woodland. There were many rewards. Several species of duck fed in the lagoons — along with coots and egrets. A male marsh harrier quartered a reed bed. My companion was certain she heard the 'ping' of bearded tits - certainly prime territory for them, though they didn't put in an appearance.

Then as dusk fell the starlings began to gather. Flock after flock swept in from all directions, building up to one huge gathering, the noise of their wings in the air heard over the marsh as they swept left and right, swirled back and forth, just one immense organism containing – how many individuals? Well into tens of thousands – some murmurations have been estimated at over a million birds. The display continued for over half an hour, eventually the birds moving lower and lower and settling for the night into a long bank of trees and reeds a few hundred yards away.

It was some weeks later that I discovered that a murmuration had taken place just two days before I moved into Clevedon – yes, right over the edge of the town, indeed would have swept time and time again over my new home. I shall be all hopeful when next winter comes. 




