From the Vicarage

Happy Easter!

Alleluia. Christ is risen.

All He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

Our Diocesan Bishop Guli says in her Easter Message:-

“Once again, the message of Easter hope and resurrection life breaks into a world that is full of sorrow, conflict and pain. How can we possibly make sense of this central event - the one that everything else in the Christian faith hangs on - when all the evidence seems to point away from it? When much of the time it feels like death and hatred and evil have the final say, rather than life and love and hope? Both on a global scale, but perhaps personally too, for there is so much suffering and loss.

Well, if you rely on your emotions, on how you feel at any particular moment and in response to any specific event that might make you happy or sad - if you rely on your feelings, then faith is indeed a fickle thing. For sometimes God can feel close and other times far away. But the truth at the heart of the Gospel is that God, through Christ, is ever present, whatever is going on and whether or not we experience that closeness or not. I have these words of Karl Jung hanging in the hallway of our home, and I look at them every time I come in or go out: “Bidden or not bidden, God is present.” God was present on Good Friday, just as much as on Easter Day. The important thing is not to confuse our experiences and emotions - whether we feel the nearness of God or not - with the reality of Easter resurrection.

There’s no denying that embracing this requires a leap of faith. No logic or experiment will prove the existence of God or convince you of the Easter story. But faith knows more. In the words of the French mathematician and philosopher Blaise Pascal, The heart has reasons, of which reason knows nothing. On Easter morning, Christ rose from the dead and broke the power of death and hatred through the strength of his love and sacrifice. As Christians we try to embody that in the way we live our lives, in the service of others, speaking out against injustice, seeking to respond in love wherever there is hate. This is the Easter story, and it is ours to tell. It is challenging, mysterious and life changing. It offers light and hope in the midst of darkness, and I commend it to you wholeheartedly.

For, Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia. I wish you a joyful and blessed Easter.”

I am taking a holiday throughout April, along with the school holidays, so I hope to see you later in April. God bless₃

The Othona Community in April 2024

Easter is just passed, with the spirit of joy and celebration still in our hearts, and April begins with Easter eggs shared, rolled and enjoyed. The eggs will not last for long, but as the spring flowers flourish beneath increasingly greening trees, we hope the spirit will remain, and that Othona, at its Centres here and in Dorset, will play our part in upholding and sharing it.



Some people think of Othona as a retreat centre, and certainly retreats here bring comfort and reflective times. March saw the most interesting Lithuanian Church Retreat, and sharing of some very different Lithuanian food. Church groups often book their own events, but retreats that are open to all bring in small groups such as that led by Brigid Main, "Into the Wilderness" which went really well.

Other activities need a bit more muscle-power: the St Ethelburgh group, including people from variety of different, and sometimes disadvantaged backgrounds, step in with a will to continue planting new hedges to provide shelter for wildlife in years to come. Working in a different way, traditional to the ethos of Othona, we have Reverend Dan Pierce on sabbatical. Whenever you visit, you will always meet a range of people, from old hands to youngsters on work experience, from volunteers to those taking a well-deserved break from the stresses of life. Don't forget, even our dedicated Warden/Managers and resident team need some down time to refresh and renew their energy, so local Volunteers are welcome, and soon feel part of the Community!

Are you baptised?

Have you been confirmed?

There will be a Confirmation and Baptism service at St Peters Chapel on July 14th 2024 at 6pm.

Baptism is an important step in one's life, whether it was as a child or as an adult, but the next step in our Christian life is often forgotten as our lives get so busy with collage, work, relationships families etc.

So many of us find that it is later in life that we start thinking about the spiritual aspects of our life and our Christian heritage, having a desire to reconnect with God.



Have you ever thought about having a closer relationship with the Lord? It may be growing the faith you had as a youngster at school or this may be the first time you may be thinking about your spiritual life?

We often do not know how to make this step, starting to go to church can be a frightening experience, just getting through those doors can be a challenge, and that's before you meet

the people inside! I remember when I was in my late twenties, and due to difficult issues in my life at that time, I was being drawn to the only support I knew that I could trust, that was the small Christian faith I had as a child. I started to go to evensong at 6:30pm on Sunday evenings, I would go in late and sit at the back and be out before anyone spoke to me. The saving grace was that I had Christian friends that I could talk to, whether in the Cricketers or at late night

coffee after the pub had closed. This enabled me to build up my faith and confidence in Christian worship.

Times have changed and life is so different now. Peoples Christian journey is different from the past, they come to the Lord at different times in their life and in different ways that reflects our modern age.

What about you?

I have not been baptised can I be Confirmed?

No problem the baptism is done at the same Confirmation service by the Bishop.

I do not go to church; can I be Confirmed?

Confirmation is not the end of your Christian journey it is a start, after the service you can take Holy Communion when you do come and hopefully you will find Christian worship an important part of your life.

What preparation do I need?

The way that churches help people get ready for Confirmation may vary, but all will encourage people to grow in their Christian faith, talking about prayer, the Bible, going to church and living out their faith in their communities. It really can be quite fun to discuss these issues in an open setting.

Can I attend these discussion groups without committing to Confirmation?

Of course you can, it is a way of finding your individual way to Christ, after the meetings you can decide if you are ready or not.

News from RAF Bradwell Bay

By 1944, 80 years ago, RAF Bradwell Bay was established as an active aerodrome. On June 6th, 1944, the allies landed in Normandy as part of the invasion and taking back of Europe. Did RAF Bradwell Bay take part. Yes, but not in a direct role. Some squadrons were moved further South, 605 squadron for example. Bradwell did some patrols in the area just to maintain a defensive watch. The nation is celebrating with a lighting of beacons at 9.15pm, across the country.

The Bradwell Bay Preservation Group is planning to commemorate. There is a Childrens play being performed, watch out for details. This is being organised by “our Jean”.



On 6th June, Churchill will narrate through the day’s events at The Green Man followed by a lighting of a bonfire on the sea wall.

On 8th June there will, be a festival of military and civilian services in Bradwell During WW2.
