Tim Fox, our Manager/Warden for many years is leaving after Easter to start the next adventures in his life. From 1st May our Manager/Wardens will be two people well known to you, Debbie and Richard Sanders. I, Ruth Bull, also step down as Trustee/Director of the Othona Community and Chair of our Bradwell Centre Committee and am happy to tell you that Paul Coleman is filling this position. Paul is committed to the Christian fellowship of the Community, and is looking forward to meeting you and supporting Othona.

When Tim first managed Othona he established our school groups and continued to welcome and increase the number of people finding Othona through many and various groups. As well as keeping up our open programmed events for all-comers, we have seen family celebrations, weddings and memorials. Throughout this time, Tim has increased the number of volunteers we see at Othona, cooking, cleaning, gardening, painting and repairing, and always welcoming with a smile and a cuppa. Essex Green Weekend: THE climate action event of 2022

A unique partnership has resulted in the first-ever Essex Green Weekend this coming April, aimed at empowering and enthusing practical responses to the Climate Emergency.

The Essex Green Weekend is a new and exciting festival to engage communities, faith groups and anyone interested in climate change action. Taking place at Othona Bradwell, on the shores of the Blackwater Estuary between 29th April to 2nd May, the Essex Green Weekend is an amazing opportunity to gain a better understanding of how to take climate action, celebrate action taken, and connect with like-minded people and organisations through networking and a range of activities, workshops and entertainment.

The weekend event is being run by Othona Bradwell in partnership with fellow environmental charities that are also taking steps to improve climate action and awareness. Local environment and mental health charity Trust Links, Diocese of Chelmsford, and Southend in Transition have teamed with Othona to deliver a schedule of engaging talks, activities, debates, art workshops, and entertainment, offering something for both adults and children.

Tickets are available for adults at £25 per day or £70 for the weekend. People are also welcomed to bring their own tent or campervan for a reduced price of £20 per adult per day, or £50 for the weekend. Ticket prices include all meals, which will be vegetarian. The Fascination of Birds

What is it that makes birds such a fascinating study – or even just a passing acquaintance? One thing of course is their immediate availability. Just look out of the window, take a walk anywhere, just listen – and there will be birds. Mammals tend to keep out of sight - at night, underground, hiding up somewhere – and some are not very nice to know – think of those with long

tails trying to steal our food. And insects? Well, they're small, make buzzing noises, some bite or sting, and anyway are nothing like as pretty as birds.

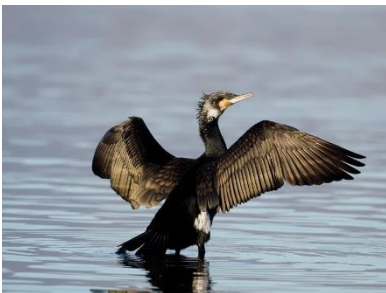
Birds make a wonderful excuse for a bracing walk, through a whole variety of scenery. Woodland, wetlands, farmland, moorlands, mountains – or even just stay at home and sit in the garden. It's surprising how much bird watching can be done by just remaining quiet and still – let the birds come to you.

Some are just so friendly – take a spade to the vegetable patch and within a minute a robin will appear just yards away to see what you might unearth.

I find one other fascination. Birds have been on this planet for so long.

Archeopteryx (ancient bird) was first identified from an imprint of a feather found in the 19th century. At present this is the earliest evidence of a very bird-like creature. More fossils have now been found, dating this species to about 150 million years ago. Birds coexisted with the dinosaurs. Dinosaurs didn't survive the mass extinction of species blamed on the collision with earth of a meteor, some 65 million years ago – but at least some birds did.

The cormorant, for instance, may date back to 100 million years or more – does a cormorant not look primitive? Then think of a blue tit – a much later arrival on the scene, though evolution still took many millions of years for it to reach its present state of perfection.



Returning to mammals, what about our own species? Homo sapiens has been around for something like 300,000 years. We're the new comers. Does not that place a huge responsibility on ourselves to do all we can to conserve our delightful avian friends?
