



News from RAF Bradwell Bay

Time flies like a Bradwell bay aircraft! Can't believe this is issue 24, plenty of stories to fill the next 2 years.

Continuing our theme of D-Day we look at 150 Wing which had been formed at RAF Bradwell Bay as part of the 2nd Tactical Air Force. They were training to be a mobile force and work in close co-operation with the army in the movement into Europe. To be a mobile force they had to be ready to move to new temporary airfields at short notice. 150 wing was separate to the main aerodrome at Bradwell, they had to be acclimatised to living under canvas, including cooking. The Wing Commander, 'Digger' Aitken had previously been the Station Commander at RAF Bradwell Bay, he had also been the Squadron Commander of 3 Squadron who became part of 150 Wing. 150 Wing arrived at RAF Bradwell Bay on March 8th 1944. Their stay at Bradwell Bay was to be about 6 weeks. Towards the end of April, the Wing moved to a temporary airfield in Newchurch Kent.

28th April the main party of 150 Airfield proceeded in convoy from Bradwell to New-church. A total of over 80 vehicles and 12 motorcycles left Bradwell at 08.30 and arrived in Newchurch at 17.30.

Most of the aircraft would have flown to Newchurch, a much faster journey!

This must have been a logistical nightmare; I wonder if there were any hold ups on the QE II Bridge.... err that and the tunnels didn't exist! I wonder how they crossed the Thames. I estimate that the convoy must have been 1/3 mile long. I can only see three options available at the time. The Woolwich Ferry, The Blackwall Tunnel, or one of the Thames Bridges, maybe Tower Bridge. The route was not recorded in the 150 Wing Operation Record Book.

Keep an eye on our Facebook page for a more detailed article on this, hopefully in the next week or so.



News from the Bell tower

During July our bellringing team have been fairly busy.

Our first public event was to ring a quarter peal for the Bradwell Pilgrimage pilgrims as they set off on their walk down the road to St Peter's Chapel. Now this may not seem much to you as reader of the magazine but, to us in the tower it was quite a challenge. We rang a method called Bob Doubles where each bell changes place with the next bell but to a set pattern.



Every now and again we get told to 'Bob' and the pattern changes slightly and we follow a new path. (The same pattern but starting in a different position). And to achieve the quarter peal, this goes on for about \% of an hour, we have to complete 1260 changes without stopping or going wrong. Well, we did it, thanks to: Jean Allen; Daniel Howell; Laurie Main; Stuart Hodges; Philip Saunders (C) and; John Pryke.

Following on from that we held a private event for the ringers but a very public event for the village. We had a training day on Saturday 20th July where about 8 of the top ringers in our area came along to teach us how to improve our ringing techniques and to ring our bells up and down without crashing into each other. Bell ringing is very much about timing, observation and listening. Learning how to work together as a team. When you are in the tower, all you have in front of you is a rope connected to a bell which weighs anywhere between 3 & 8 cwt. No computers or smartphones to work it out for you, it's just you and a rope! Get it wrong and it's up to you to sort it out with the support of the team working around you. Once again, we got through the day, but, as the saying goes, Rome wasn't built in a day, we still have some way to go to get it just right.

Lastly, on the 3rd Sunday every month, when there is no morning worship in our church, several of us go across to Tillingham to support their ringing instead. It's always a good idea to ring bells in different towers as all towers are different and it teaches you a different skill so that if you visit a tower when on holiday you'll stand a chance of not getting caught out.

On that note I'll finish for now, but if you're interested in seeing the bells or having a go at ringing, then give one of us a call.
