Dear Friends,

As we move into August, we continue with our Summer Evening Services at 6pm at St Peter's Chapel in Bradwell on Sea. We have a Confirmation Service on Sunday 3rd August, with local candidates coming to confirm their faith in this special service with the Bishop. If you would like to be Baptised or Confirmed, do please enquire to me. We will end the series with a 'Songs of Praise' service with the Archdeacon of Chelmsford at 6pm on Sunday 31st August, do please come and join us.

On Friday 15th August, the Royal British Legion, in partnership with the Government, will hold a National Commemorative Event at the National Memorial Arboretum to mark the 80th anniversary of VJ Day and the end of the Second World War.

Paying tribute to all those who served in the Far East and the Pacific, a national two-minute silence will be held at midday, followed by a one-hour service at the base of the Armed Forces Memorial. The event will be broadcast live on BBC One and will also be available to view on a large screen within the grounds of the Arboretum.

The commemoration will feature 400 members of the Armed Forces and include music from military bands, as well as a flypast from the Red Arrows and historic aircraft from The Battle of Britain Memorial Flight.

As part of the nationwide remembrance, our church bells will ring at 6:30pm, to honour those who served and sacrificed in the Far East.

This symbolic act of bell ringing echoes the celebrations that swept the nation 80 years ago and offers a moment of reflection and gratitude for peace restored.

News from RAF Bradwell Bay

Next month is the 80th anniversary of the end of WW2. With the final victory of Japan on 15th August.

Did this mean peace and quiet for Bradwell on Sea? Not for some time, the airfield was not to close until the end of November. Air firing courses were to be held using the range. Even with the closure of the airfield on 30th November 1945, the range did not close until 1965, with jet aircraft from other bases using it until then.

The RAF Memorial is noted as a place of peace and serenity and has a sublime effect on all visitors. My research into the names on the memorial is raising many stories. The first plaque reveals the first aircrew losses 2 weeks after RAF Bradwell become operational. 1944 bought the Normandy invasion and the last-ditch effort by the Germans aiming their V Weapons at Britain.

RAF Bradwell Bay was in the battle against these weapons by sending patrols up to bring these rockets down, these patrols were known as Diver's Patrols. The top scoring pilot against these weapons was Squadron Leader Joseph Berry the Squadron Leader of 501 Squadron.

501 Squadron came to Bradwell Bay from Manston on the 22^{nd of} September 1944 with the main purpose of defending against the V1's and V2's. Their aircraft were Tempest V's The squadron was successful in this mission under the leadership of S/L Berry who had a DFC and Bar and was later to be awarded a 2nd Bar posthumously.



S/L Berry is buried in the Scheemda Protestant Cemetery in the Netherlands.

Most of these stories are held in our archives but need to be highlighted and bought to everyone's awareness. Many more stories will emerge as research progresses. A bonus is that this research often leads to contact with relatives, such as S/L Berry's cousin. We are building a contact list of relatives, which is ever growing. There is no distinction between rank or roles, everyone who had a relative at RAF Bradwell Bay should contact us.

The RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group has a Facebook page RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group and our website www.rafbradwellbay.com.

We are recruiting trustees to work alongside our management committee. If you have skills such as business-related skills, we could use them or if you would like to get involved in this local project.

The RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group seeks to preserve the history of the RAF in Bradwell on Sea. We are planning for a museum near the memorial.

Wild Worship! Here, in late July, was the opportunity to stay at, or visit Othona and be enchanted by the chance to dive into the natural world and marvel at the wonders of creation. How about joining the children sliding about in the mud, as the tide goes out at first beach – and wondering at the little crabs and hopping sand creatures left behind as the water recedes. Night falls – lie on the pill box in the deep peace of the night, and count the shooting stars, a



miracle of our clear skies as August approaches. Awake with the dawn, maybe yoga on the sea wall – or perhaps an extra snuggle down in a cosy yurt until the breakfast bell reminds you of tea and porridge, toast and boiled eggs. The Hall relies on grants from various Grant making Bodies such as the windfarm and Magnox to carry out this work as the income from hall hiring barely covers the running of the hall. BRADWELL-ON-SEA COUNCILLOR VACANCY

Bradwell-on-Sea is co-opting to fill a Councillor vacancy. You are invited to apply to become a Village Councillor.

You are required to meet the criteria for eligibility, set out in s.79 of the Local Government Act 1972.

In summary you must be:

A British subject, or a citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union.

On the 'relevant date' (i.e. the day on which you are co -opted) be 18 years of age or over. Also:

Be a local government elector for the Council area for which you want to stand on the 'relevant date'. **OR** have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the council area during the whole of the 12 months preceding that day.

OR had your principal or only place of work in the council area during the same period. **OR** have resided in the council area during that 12-month period.

OR You can satisfy the criteria to be co-opted if you have lived in the council area or within 4.8km (3 miles) of it for the whole of the 12 months preceding the 'relevant date'.

You must not be disqualified, pursuant to s.80 of the Local Government Act 1972. In summary you cannot stand for co-option/election if:

You are the subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order.

You have, within five years before the day of the co-option/election, been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offence and have had a sentence of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) for a period of over three months without the option of a fine.

You work for the Council you want to become a Councillor for (but you can work for other local Authorities, including the Principal Authorities that represent the same area).

Application for Co-option

Applicants should apply in writing:

Confirming that they meet the criteria for eligibility set out in s.79 of the Local Government Act 1972 and are not disqualified under s.80 of the Local Government Act 1972.

Stating why they wish to be a Councillor.

Provide a CV.


