The Othona Community

Time was when the Othona Community met for six weeks together over the summer holidays, then closed for the winter with sad farewells between those who had served the Community as summer staff, or



stayed and helped out for much of the holiday period. Gradually, opportunities were grasped, to expand the life and work of Othona as the twentieth century rolled on. A permanent presence was established at Burton Bradstock, West Dorset, in a beautiful setting beside the Chesil Beach.

At Bradwell The Bank was rebuilt in the mid-1970s, a temporary former Nat West Bank (Shepherd's Bush branch) that gave a boost to opportunities to stay for longer periods – but it was still pretty chilly in winter! By the turn of the millennium Othona Bradwell was well established in the L-shaped Norman Motley building you see today, and further buildings and staff accommodation have made it more comfortable to live here. Since the mid-90s Warden/Managers and a resident team have given life to the Community all-year-round – and are now working extremely hard to share the life and love of Othona at all times. Covering all the financial and practical tasks, the planning and response to the unexpected, above all you find a Christian welcome and generosity of spirit that generates from the body of people who live, serve and volunteer with Othona. You are always welcome to share time, or volunteer.

Othona Bradwell had a successful Half Term week for families, with over 50 people staying and half of them under 18 - lots of activities including pumpkin carving, games, crafts, baking and more. We attended the installation of the new Bishop of Bradwell Adam Atkinson at Chelmsford Cathedral and look forward to welcoming him to visit us here. Recent retreat programmes have been well attended including Greening our Souls, by Rev'd Imogen Nay; The Word became Flesh, led by Sister Hilda Mary; and Art and Soul, led by Genevieve Collier. Each of these retreats have been a blessing to all who attended and created a lovely sense of openness and community together.

We continue to welcome many different groups to the community too, including YMCA, Church groups, Environmental Groups and many others too. If you know of a group who would fit our ethos, or wish to hold a family gathering, do make enquiries.

Advent, Christmas and New Year 2023 are busy and will be a lovely time of community, Christian celebration and hope together. 6th December: St Nicholas – a much-loved saint

One account of how Father Christmas began tells of a man named Nicholas who was born in the third century in the Greek village of Patara, on what is today the southern coast of Turkey. His family were both devout and wealthy, and when his parents died in an epidemic, Nicholas decided to use his inheritance to help peo-

ple. He gave to the needy, the sick, the suffering. He dedicated his whole life to God's service and was made Bishop of Myra while still a young man. As a bishop in later life, he joined other bishops and priests in prison under the emperor Diocletian's fierce persecution of Christians across the Roman Empire. Finally released, Nicholas was all the more determined to shed abroad the news of God's love. He did so by giving. One story of his generosity explains why we hang Christmas stockings over our mantelpieces today. There was a poor family with three daughters who



needed dowries if they were to marry, and not be sold into slavery. Nicholas heard of their plight and tossed three bags of gold into their home through an open window – thus saving the girls from a life of misery.

The bags of gold landed in stockings or shoes left before the fire to dry. Hence the custom of children hanging out stockings – in the hope of attracting presents of their own from St Nicholas - on Christmas Eve. That is why three gold balls, sometimes represented as oranges, are one of the symbols of St Nicholas. The example of St Nicholas has never been forgotten - in bygone years boys in Germany and Poland would dress up as bishops on 6th December and beg alms for the poor. In the Netherlands and Belgium 'St Nicholas' would arrive on a steamship from Spain to ride a white horse on his gift-giving rounds. To this day, 6th December is still the main day for gift-giving and merry-making in much of Europe. Many people feel that simple gift-giving in early Advent helps preserve a Christmas Day focus on the Christ Child.


News from RAF Bradwell Bay
