Myself and Kate are delighted to share our news that we are expecting a baby in late April 2025. We are both overjoyed with the news!

December can feel like chaos – lots of social events, services, Christmas presents to buy, never-ending to-do lists and the pressure to create the perfect Christmas. But in the midst of this chaos, our churches can offer an opportunity to find peace during this busy time.

The Church of England's theme for Advent and Christmas 2024, **Follow the Star: Calm and Bright**, draws on the world-famous carol, Silent Night:

*“Silent Night! Holy Night!  
All is calm, all is bright...”*

One of the reasons that this carol is so universally loved is the way it invites us into the still centre of the Christmas story, to contemplate Mary holding the newborn Jesus, the Light of the World.

The angelic messages we encounter in the biblical story of Jesus’ birth typically hold together the need for calm in the present (“Do not be afraid” ... “Fear not”) with the hope of a bright future (“for you have found favour with God” ... “for behold I bring you tidings of great joy”).

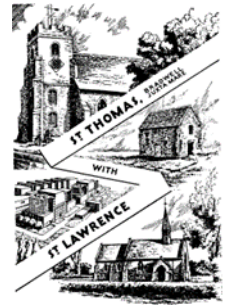

## Othona in December 2024 – and into the New Year!

Bradwell-on-Sea, St Lawrence and our neighbouring Dengie villages may be small and somewhat isolated from the big cities, but we do have a voice, as you may have seen on BBC Essex – and here is an extract from their recent report:

### **A remote Christian community is pushing for a change in the law after having plans for a wind turbine refused.**

The Othona Community said it did not have mains power at its camp in Bradwell-on-Sea, Essex, and had to use an oil generator, racking up an annual £5,000 cost. Government rules state only turbines below 11.1m (36.4ft) high can be constructed without planning permission - but Othona wants this restriction to be relaxed. A government spokesperson said the law was kept "under review" while ensuring local areas were protected. It followed the former prime minister, Rishi Sunak, pledging to consult ministers on changing planning law before he called a general election.

Othona has since called on the Labour government to undertake similar work so it could install a wind turbine without reapplying for permission. Maldon District Council rejected its first proposal in 2022, raising concerns about the turbine's visual impact, a nearby footpath and how it might affect a nature reserve. (There was huge local support for this application, but as the law stands if there is one objection, however unreasonable, the permission is not granted.) The group, founded on the remote Dengie Peninsula off the Essex coast in the 1940s, said it could not afford to pay £100,000 to get connected to the nearest electricity grid. A government taskforce is undertaking a wider study into the onshore wind industry, with the results due to be published after Christmas

Richard Sanders, joint warden of Othona, said upgrading to a 25kw turbine would make a big difference. "We've always been a place where the environment is really important," he told the **Local Democracy Reporting Service**. "The Church of England has plans to be carbon-neutral by 2030, but we can't be carbon neutral until we get this turbine." The call echoes lobbying by the National Farmers' Union (NFU) to loosen the law over turbines. The NFU hoped the government's **Onshore Wind Industry Taskforce, external** would recommend a change in the rules in a report post-Christmas. A Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government spokesman said: "A range of national permitted development rights allow for renewable energy to be generated from sources such as small wind turbines on domestic properties. "These rights are kept under review to ensure local areas are protected."





As a Christian Community, Othona will always be pushing the boundaries of our Christian heritage, whether for the planet's environment or for its peoples. "So what is it that has enabled this Community to survive for more than sixty years when so many others have disappeared? Surely its survival indicates that both centres are fulfilling a need. Also that Othona has been blessed with a number of members whose love and dedication to the Community has been quite exceptional." ## News from RAF Bradwell Bay

Last month we discussed the only grave from RAF Bradwell Bay in the Bradwell Cemetery. We do have information in our archives of where everybody who was lost is commemorated or buried.

In Bradwell on Sea we have a unique memorial to those who sacrificed their lives, donated by Mr George Pryor. There are 121 names engraved around the memorial, although continued research has revealed more names, perhaps in time we can add these names.



The motorcycle group 'It's More than a Ride' has held a memorial ceremony on Remembrance Sunday at the memorial. We thank them for this sign of respect. It is important to respect the ultimate sacrifice made by airmen from RAF Bradwell Bay.

It is important to also remember people who had life changing injuries both physical and mental health. Our archives tell many tales of people who survived but with serious injuries. Combat stress had not yet been labelled as PTSD but many of our people would have suffered it.

On 28<sup>th</sup> April a crew of 3, F/O Askwith, P/O Mapes, and Sgt. Hardy departed RAF Bradwell Bay in BOSTON Z.2240 to attack Leeuwarden in the Netherlands. Their aircraft failed to return. Asquith and Hardy were both killed and are buried in the Bergen-Op-Zoom War Cemetery in the Netherlands and are on the RAF Bradwell



Bay Memorial. Mapes was thrown clear but sustained serious injuries. He was taken prisoner and sent a message back to his squadron, parts of which are shown below.

The pains in my back and neck were terrific and I concluded that I had fractured my spinal column or neck so that it was only a matter of twisting into the right position to place pressure on the spinal cord then all would be over.

I struggle to my feet and by practically carrying my head I managed to navigate at least part of the distance to a farmhouse possibly a quarter of a mile away. The last part of the distance I recall being half dragged; half carried by a man. I was placed in the barn, on a pile of hay and made as comfortable as possible. Later he arrived with a welcome drink of tea (or some such thing) and informed me he had sent for the doctor. In due course the doctor and with him military police arrived to transport me to the hospital.

He eventually ended up in Stalagluft 3, when the camp was liberated Mapes required transport to liberate him and was disabled for the rest of his life.

As I write this The Festival of Remembrance has been on TV, this stressed the importance of remembering everyone affected by war including families.

The RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group seeks to preserve the history of the RAF in Bradwell on Sea. We are planning for a museum near the memorial.

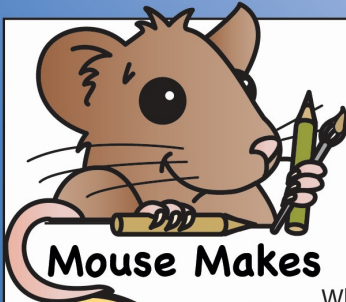

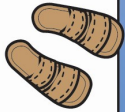
