### New Testament Reading

### Acts 10:34-43 - Gentiles Hear the Good News

<sup>34</sup> Then Peter began to speak to them: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, <sup>35</sup> but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. <sup>36</sup> You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. <sup>37</sup> That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: <sup>38</sup> how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. <sup>39</sup> We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; <sup>40</sup> but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, <sup>41</sup> not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. <sup>42</sup> He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. <sup>43</sup> All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

### Matthew 28:1-10 - The Resurrection of Jesus

When the gospel is announced the reader says Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *Matthew* 

## Glory to you, O Lord.

28 <sup>1</sup>After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. <sup>2</sup> And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. <sup>3</sup> His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. <sup>4</sup> For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. <sup>5</sup> But the angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. <sup>6</sup> He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he

lay. <sup>7</sup> Then go quickly and tell his disciples, "He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him." This is my message for you.' <sup>8</sup> So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. <sup>9</sup> Suddenly Jesus met them and said, 'Greetings!' And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshipped him. <sup>10</sup> Then Jesus said to them, 'Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me.'

### **RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS**

In our baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

We renew the promises made at our baptism, affirming our allegiance to Christ and our rejection of all that is evil.

Therefore, I ask these questions

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins? I repent of my sins.

Do you renounce evil? I renounce evil.

May almighty God who has given you the desire to follow Christ give you strength to continue in the way.

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess together the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father? I believe In God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ? I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day be rose again; he ascended

into heaven,

he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church,

the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen

As we affirm our baptismal vows let us renew our commitment to Jesus Christ. I answer the call of God my creator I trust in Jesus Christ as my Saviour I seek new life from the Holy Spirit

May Christ dwell in your hearts through faith, that you may be rooted and grounded in love and bring forth the fruit of the Spirit.

#### Sermon

Let us begin with a prayer. Heavenly Father, give us your grace and spirit and speak to our hearts and minds, so that we may draw closer to you, through Jesus Christ our Lord, **Amen.** 

The words which come at the end of our Gospel reading are those famous words we find in the Bible 'Do not be afraid'. We do not need to be afraid of the current times we live in and the damage, sin and death can do to us, because by Jesus being raised from the dead, he has defeated them. It is this, which we celebrate on this Easter Sunday, that our Lord reigns in Heaven and that he has overcome the things we are unable to overcome ourselves.

Jesus has finally bridged the divide between heaven and earth, so where there was division between humanity and God through the turning away of humanity from God, Jesus has broken that divide, so we do not need to be afraid, God has come to us and made all things well and as we hear from our reading in Acts, God shows no partiality, he has been raised for everybody.

It is through this Easter Sunday excitement when the two Mary's where sent to the disciples to say that Jesus has been risen from the dead and that a new beginning and a new life has begun with the disciples. May we know this excitement afresh for ourselves today and may it help lift any gloom we have during this of pandemic, that we may rejoice today and celebrate the resurrection.

The resurrection shows us that God loves us with an everlasting love by sharing his eternal created life with us, he does not hold anything back from us, but gives us everything that he created and lives within. The resurrection shows us a continuation love from our creation to him redeeming us which shows us the faithfulness of God, that his promises are true and that he fulfils them.

On this day, like Mary, we can look up to see the risen Christ which helps us recognise God's eternal life. We see the Lord of life standing before us, who then sends us back into the world to proclaim his resurrection. We are to go and share this presence of the risen Christ with those we meet on our journey through life and rejoice with the two Mary's that Jesus has been raised from the dead and new life and the forgiveness of sins is available to all. This gives us great hope and positivity, things we need, especially at this time.

May I wish you a very blessed Easter, Amen.


As we are fed with the bread of heaven may we know your resurrection power; through Christ our risen Lord. **Amen.**
