Dear Friends,

This Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday which is Wednesday 5th March, we are encouraged to put down deep roots of hope by connecting with God who is with us at all times.

The Church of England's Lent theme for 2025 is **Living Hope**. In Lent we journey with Jesus on the difficult and thorny road that leads all the way to the cross on Good Friday – and beyond, to the transformation of Easter Day.

God invites us to bring to him our own journey through everyday life. In the disappointment of daily setbacks and the pain of deeper hurts, we discover that God is present with us. And God promises a future where all things are healed and made new.

Living Hope offers us the opportunity to deepen our hope in God and be part of what God is doing to bring hope in the world.

The readings and reflections explore how we can have hope in times of frustration or uncertainty; the hope found in joining with others; the invitation to notice signs of hope around us; the courage to face reality and pursue a hopeful future; and the ways God transforms death into life at Easter.

The reflections have been written by **Cathrine Fungai Ngangira** and **Belle Tindall** – both contributors to [*Wild Bright Hope: The Big Church Read Lent Book 2025*](#) (SPCK) – together with **Victoria Mason**, Everyday Faith Editor for the Church of England.

These reflections will be available in a Church House Publishing booklet (published in January) and also in the [*Everyday Faith app*](#).

There will also be a daily challenge for children and families available as a booklet and in free digital form from February 2025.

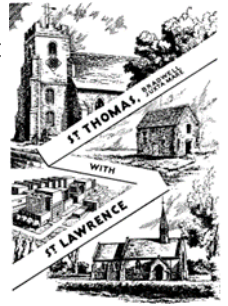

The Othona Community

When you walk round the sea wall from St Peter's Chapel towards Bradwell Waterside, you will climb a few steps, then have the mud flats to your right and a thicket to your left. Much of this thicket was planted in the 1970s and 1980s, with other planting around the upper field to provide screening from wind and weather, and habitats for birds and other wildlife. Walk a little further and you will see the 'old field' where the first Othona huts were built in the 1940s and 1950s, these old buildings now restored and repurposed, and surrounded by yet more planting, winding up towards the First Beach through the Othona Coastal Park. Now, something even the most frequent sea wall ramblers may not yet have seen: as you continue, look back and you will see the new boundary of Othona's eleven-acre addition, just now planted with young native trees, soon to be a hedgerow to further increase opportunities for birds, mammals, reptiles and insects to join this diverse Community.



As we welcome new arrivals, both human and animal, so must a sad goodbye be said, too. David James died on 29th December, aged 83, leaving his widow Terry. Dave was more than just a Community member of almost 70 years, he was part of Bradwell, the village he loved. Blind since childhood, this never stopped Dave enjoying life to the full, playing his guitar and singing in the Chapel, the pubs, Othona concerts, and fundraising at the Lifeboat fetes. His memorial service is at St Peter's Chapel and Othona on the afternoon of 22nd March, for a fuller picture of his life do look at the Othona Essex website.

January has been a fairly quiet month at Othona as usual, giving the resident team and volunteers a bit of a break after a lively Christmas and New Year celebrations, and before the start of another full-on year of activities and events for all. Coming up in February:

News from RAF Bradwell Bay

Bradwell on Sea can be proud of its history with the Royal Airforce. RAF Bradwell Bay was a base in fighter Command but was not a Battle of Britain station as it didn't open until 1941 and became operational in 1942. However, Bradwell played its part in the Battle of Britain as the Dengie Flats firing range, opened in 1938 and was to train many pilots who went on to fly in the Battle of Britain.

Once operational RAF Bradwell Bay played its part in many well-known operations during the war. This included Dieppe and the Normandy Invasion. The bases went operational at a time when Fighter Command was changing from Defensive tactics to Offensive.

Around the time of the D Day invasion Hitler started his fight back by introducing his secret weapon, the flying bomb or V1 rocket. These were pilotless aircraft, the first attack was on 13th June 1944, one week after D Day. Britain's defence against this new weapon was Anti-Aircraft guns, Barrage balloons and fighter Aircraft.

Aircraft from Bradwell Bay flew what was known as Diver operations in which aircraft would try to shoot down the V1's before hitting London and other high population areas. Sometimes pilots would also try tipping the V1 off course with their wing, this must have taken some nerve!



In September the next development of the Vengeance weapon was launched, that was known as the V2. The V2 was expensive but was a last-ditch effort by the Nazi's to win the war, which in fact they had already lost.

The V2 was harder to chase as the speed and altitude of the rockets was beyond any conventional aircraft the RAF had then. The V2 was reaching towards the outer limits of the Earth's atmosphere.

RAF Bradwell Bay did have a visit from a V2 rocket which hit runway 2 on 30th January 1945. The Station Operational record Book states:

“d) A V2 landed on the NW/SE runway at approximately 1534 hours making a crater 25 yards wide and approximately the same depth. No casualties were caused, and only slight damage to buildings nearby. The Works Flight began immediate repairs and worked through the night under very trying conditions (i.e. wind and snow). P/O GREEN, i/c Works Flight tackled this job in a praiseworthy manner.

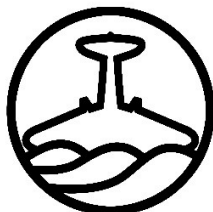
(e) All personnel on the Station were engaged in clearing the main runway of snow which was serviceable for night flying at 1630 hours.”

In fact, the repairs to runway 2 kept collapsing and the runway was never reinstated. A line of trees was planted to mark the spot.

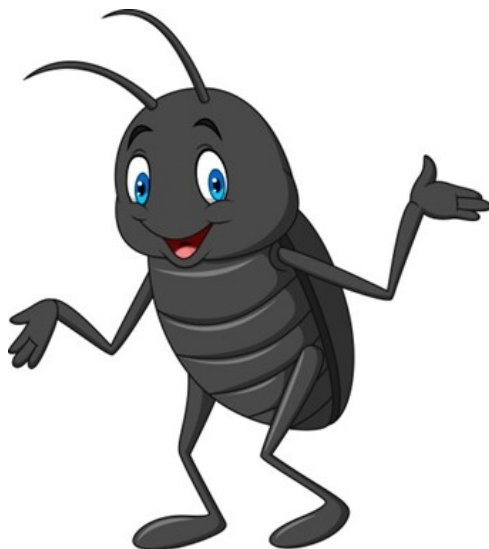

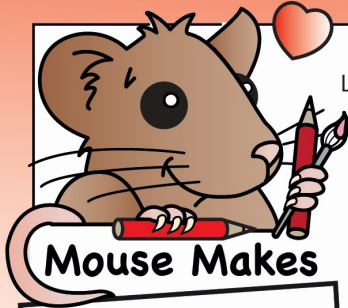
