I am now on Sabbatical until the beginning of April, so if you have any queries during this time, please contact the Churchwardens on the contact page of the magazine.



## The Communion Cup of Bradwell-juxta-Mare 1626

At the start of 2026 we can celebrate that, for **400 years** this Communion Cup has been in Bradwell-Juxta-Mare.

At the time the chalice came to Bradwell-juxta-Mare the Parson was Aegidius Burie (Giles Bury), who was rector from 1615 TO 1640.



The shape and design indicate a huge change in style of worship in England. In the 1620s, communion chalices were transitioning from ornate Catholic vessels to simpler Protestant "cups" or "goblets". These were often made from melted-down medieval chalices to serve the whole congregation rather than just the priest, reflecting post- Reformation changes towards plainer worship

### In 1626

The Act of Uniformity mandated that all services in the Church of England be conducted according to the Book of Common Prayer, making it the only legal liturgy.

The Coronation Service was changed to an English-language rite and was devised by a commission of Anglican bishops for Charles 1's coronation in 1626. This was the notable liturgical event of that year. Previous Protestant

monarchs had used a Latin rite.

Charles I's coronation in 1626, held on February 2nd at Westminster Abbey in London, marked his formal accession after inheriting the throne in 1625. The event was notable for the absence of his Catholic wife, Henrietta Maria, who refused to attend a Protestant ceremony. It highlighted early tensions over religion and royal authority that would later lead to Civil War. It was the last time the ancient Edward the Confessor's Crown Jewels were used, before their destruction.

## News from RAF Bradwell Bay

### Tales from RAF Bradwell Bay

In the last issue I talked of what happened to the airfield after the war. During the week I had an email from D'Arcy Serrell-Watts whose family had owned the land that the airfield was built on. He was a schoolboy during the war and was adopted as the Squadron Mascot of 488 Squadron.

This was what he told me:

*The airfield returned to our ownership by de-requisitioning after the war.*

*We used the main runway as my father had a Belgian friend who flew from Antwerp to shoot on several occasions, I myself landed a plane (being an RAF National Service pilot) on it in 1958 and Bill McAlpine made regular flights during the construction of the power station. The installation of the overhead cables in about 1961 put a stop to all that!*


*From the end of the war we leased some ex-RAF buildings, to which you refer, to the US Airforce who maintained the range at Sand Beach. The unit was commanded by Colonel Jake Reasonover who was a good friend. I was present with him in the tower at St Peter's when the pilot of an F86 got into a spin at about 6000ft above us from which he was unable to recover and crashed on the marsh a hundred yards in front of us.*

## The Othona Community, at the start of 2026.



You may remember that the Othona Community, Bradwell on Sea, retained 11 acres of land, when the Charity sold East Hall Farm a few years ago to shift financial assets to a more flexible investment portfolio. The changed financial structure has enabled the Community to support the development of both centres, here in Essex and in West Dorset. The retention of this Essex acreage is in addition to the area already in

use for buildings, gardens and wildlife habitats, The Eleven Acres, surrounded now by basic fencing and newly planted hedgerows, is used partly as additional car parking, and a place for people to set up their tents and campervans, so that more people can stay and share time in the Community. The rest is mainly for wildlife: ground habitats, wild flowers, nesting boxes, a new pond area and the potential for much more. Othona looks ever more beautiful as the year unfolds, with glimpses of snowdrops, daffodils, primroses and the joy of new catkins, fresh leaves and bright grasses, and with the cheerful pots and baskets that line the step around the grapevine along the front of the Norman Motley Building.

Idyllic? Yes, but “you should have seen the garden when the Lord had it to himself!” - as the old gardener once said to an admiring passer-by.

Many people in and around Bradwell-on-Sea, Tillingham and St. Lawrence love to garden and enjoy cheerful company. Would you like to join a gardening group starting this spring, to share in maintaining and developing the existing fruit, flower and wildlife garden areas, and to be part of a team to bring some of The Eleven Acres into fruitful use for our residents and visitors, both human, and wild & wonderful? Volunteering your time occasionally, with a regular local gardening group, or as an individual enjoying the solitude of this peaceful place – all are welcome. ## Bradwell Church Cemetery

Bradwell Cemetery is looked after by the Church and is funded by a bequest from Ernest J Gale and Church of England set Fees from Burials and Cremated Remains and from Head stones.

Ernest J Gale farmed Orplands Farm in Bradwell and also owned the market and Auction House in Southminster. Ernest Gale died 100 years ago on Christmas Day in 1925 and was aged 65. In his will he left £3000 to the Rector and Churchwardens for the upkeep of Bradwell Cemetery along with other bequests to the Parish Council for a Village Hall and Recreation Facility and money towards the East window in the church.

The interest on the Bequest brings into the Cemetery Fund about £650 a year, the fees for burials and Cremated remains bring into the Cemetery Fund around £400 - £700 a year (this depends on the number of Burials in a year), and giving towards the upkeep of the Cemetery about £700 a year which is spent on Cemetery maintenance, cutting the grass and maintenance of the trees.



The maintenance of the Cemetery is carried out by an employed person who cuts the grass throughout the year and also volunteers who cut back overgrowing blackberry bushes trimming trees and removing the base of the trunk growth from the Lime Trees and burning this waste. If you would like to volunteer to help this small group of volunteers, we really need more hands to help us do this work. The work can be suited to what you are able to do from pruning Ivory from a tree, removing blackberry growth, removing the shoots from the base of the limes, having a bonfire or painting the fence.

I look forward in hearing from you, I want our Cemetery to look clean and tidy and cared for, please volunteer to help achieve this.




