A Misleading Name

There's a lovely camaraderie amongst bird watchers. A long weekend in Norfolk gave the opportunity for a spot of birding. It just needed a pair of binoculars around the neck to prompt a chap with a camera and telephoto lens to ask "seen anything around?" We had only just come out of the door of the cottage onto the promenade, so he went on "a couple of purple sandpipers along that way" – pointing eastwards; so eastwards it was. The following day we bumped into him again – was it him? He and we exchanged glances which confirmed - "purple sandpiper....".

Purple sandpipers have no purple about them at all. Their scientific name *Calidris maritima* gives more of a clue – a maritime bird – outside the breeding season they are almost always by the sea. Whilst not rare, they are found pecking around on rocks – rocks about the same colour as themselves, so patience is needed to pierce their camouflage. A careful search rewarded us with good views of the two birds our friend had mentioned. A dumpy bird,

slightly smaller but plumper than a blackbird; although their plumage is somewhat nondescript, they can be identified by their conspicuous yellow legs and feet. Unlike other waders, they don't hide their feet in mud.

They breed in the high arctic, and migrate southwards to avoid the sub-zero temperatures, so are only found in Britain during the winter months. Our two birds clearly found the rocks to their liking – and not at all stressed by our presence only a few feet away. What their avid searches revealed we couldn't see – to us they seemed just to be pecking at bare rock; no doubt they found tiny creatures to satisfy their hunger.



Bird watching is so much more than – well, watching birds! How far had these two little fellows flown, all with a heart the size of a pea? What perils did they encounter on the way? What was the scenery like at their summer residence? Nonetheless, it was good to add a new bird to our list.

The Aim

However, the contribution to the raffle prizes, including the wheelbarrow from Dots and Melons, the individual gifts of wine and spirits, chocolates and other items meant that many villagers played a part in making the Fair a financial success.

The free bus rides gifted by Ford Coaches of Althorne not only brought additional shoppers to the village, but also increased the opportunity to generate publicity. This made a greater number of people aware of the event.

The Curry and Quiz at the King's Head on the evening of 27 November 2021 was well supported and all participants had an enjoyable time. The landlord, Mike, introduced a Joker Card, to be played to increase points awarded. Most teams played their Joker on the wrong round, adding to the entertainment value!

Father Christmas at Santa's Grotto was a huge success and the number of children visiting exceeded the predicted amount of 50, with an additional 50% being seen during the course of the Fair. The landlords, Tony and Christine, had to make a number of changes to plans and find additional gifts for the extra, young visitors, which they did with good humour and generosity.

Mr Greg Bracken loaned his PA system on loan for the Fair. It was put to good use by our compère, Mr Laurie Main, who provided his witty and entertaining services for free.

The Next Christmas Fair

With the return of the Flower Show in August, there will not be another Christmas Fair in 2022. However, Santa's Grotto may return to build on this year's success and the organisers are wished the best of luck.



Afternoon Tea in the Village Hall**





The Royal Household have invited cities, towns and villages across the United Kingdom to celebrate Her Majesty the Queen being on the throne for 70 years with community events. They suggest a 'Big Jubilee Lunch' and planting a tree for the 'Queen's Green Canopy'.

Bradwell-on-sea village will participate with a 'whole community' series of event that engage as many stakeholders as possible over the extended Bank Holiday weekend from 2 to 5 June 2022. It will include a nod to the 'Big Jubilee Lunch' and the 'Queen's Green Canopy'.

The Platinum Jubilee celebrations will not duplicate previous Flower Shows, because there is a Flower Show planned for August 2022.

A small committee of various community organisations is exploring options. The plan is that the backbone of the long weekend will be an Open Weekend at the church with refreshments and other activities, with other key events being the Scarecrow Festival, a 'street party' for the children and a carnival style parade. A display of the 'History of Bradwell-on-Sea' and an Art Exhibition in the Village Hall are also being considered.

It is proposed that the Village Hall fields will host an arena where various activities will take place, including children's fancy dress parade and a display of Home Guard activities. There will be a tea tent, fun fair attractions and various stalls run by local community groups and small businesses.

A raffle is planned with tickets on sale at every village organisation's stall (school, church, Village Hall Trust and WI). It is hoped that the prizes will be by donations from village residents and businesses. Funds raised will be used to cover insurance and other expenditure, such as party food and drink and printing, with anything remaining being split between the school, church, Village Hall Trust and WI.
