Fom the Vicarage

Dear Friends,

Happy New Year!

2025 is year when the wider church celebrates a Jubilee. A Jubilee or Holy Year is a special year of forgiveness and reconciliation, in which people are invited to come back into right relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation.

How often is a Jubilee Year?

A Jubilee Year is celebrated by the Church every 25 years. This has been the case since 1470, when Pope Paul II changed it from every 50 years.

What is the theme of the Jubilee Year in 2025?

The theme is Pilgrims of Hope. This is to renew our hope and discover a vision that can "restore access to the fruits of the earth to everyone". We are also invited to rediscover a spirituality of God's creation in which we understand ourselves as "pilgrims on the earth" rather than masters of the world.

At the Bradwell Pilgrimage this year on Saturday 5th July 2025, we are going to celebrate this theme with "people of hope", as we look to come together from across the different church denominations to share what we have in common and pray for hope in the future.

What is the Biblical background for the Jubilee Year?

The word Jubilee comes from the Hebrew word *yobel*, which is a ram's horn. This wind instrument is blown to mark the start of a Jubilee Year in the Bible (Leviticus 25:9).

In the Bible the Jubilee Year occurred every 50 years and involved the cancelling of debts, a period of rest for people and the earth, and land being restored to the landless.

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus makes clear his own mission is to bring Jubilee. In the synagogue at Nazareth he reads from the scroll of the prophet Isaiah, proclaiming the year of the Lord's favour:

The Spirit of the Lord has been given to me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim the Lord's year of favour." (Luke 4:18-19)

After reading, Jesus announces: "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." Jesus shows us what God's Kingdom of justice, compassion and freedom looks like. He invites us join him in making it a reality.

The Othona Community - moving into 2025.

To write for village View is to think both backwards and forwards, as we write in the middle of the month before our readers see what we have to say. There is some guesswork, too, as we write about an anticipated Christmas 10 days before the event. So it must have been for Jesus's mother Mary, ten days before the birth of her child, waiting in anticipation and expectation and indeed for Mary a certainty, a fulfilment of a promise given by the Angel Gabriel. Because of that day, the birth of Jesus and the dawn of Christianity, the



Othona Community is here to continue that message of faith, hope and love for all humanity, for all God's creatures even the sparrow that falls, and by extension of that message, to care for the planet that sustains all of creation.

Epiphany

On 6th January we celebrate Epiphany - the visit of the Wise Men to the baby Jesus. But who were these Wise Men? No one knows for sure. Matthew calls them 'Magi', and that was the name of an ancient caste of a priestly kind from Persia. It wasn't until the third century that they were called kings - by a church father, Tertullian.



Another church father, Origin, assumed there were three - to correspond with the gifts given. Later Christian interpre-

tation came to understand gold as a symbol of wisdom and wealth, incense as a symbol of worship and sacrifice, and myrrh as a symbol of healing - and even embalming. Certainly Jesus challenged and set aright the way in which the world handled all three of these things. Since the 8th century, the Magi have had the names Balthasar, Caspar and Melchior.

The Israelites camped across the river Jordan from the kingdom of Moab. King Balak was sure they were going to invade






God said Balaam could go but must do what he was told




