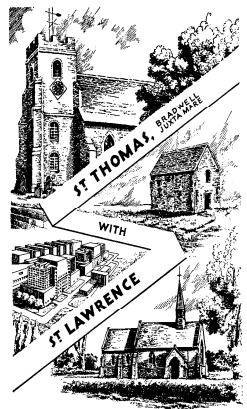

Our meeting this month was our AGM. Secretary Theresa reminded us of everything we'd managed to pack into the past year. She was followed by President Sue, who gave a very emotional speech about the importance of the WI to her and us all, which left a few tears in our eyes!

Once we got through the official business, our guest Kevin Bruce judged our bake-off competition. The winners were Alice for her shortbread and Carol for her savoury biscuits.

The final part of our meeting was a talk from Pat, who herself has been a member since 1968, on the history of our WI. We learnt that we were formed all the way back in March 1925, where our meetings were originally held in the Kings Head! Our first president was Mrs Hurst, and by 1927 the group had grown to 60 members (10% of the population of Bradwell then!). Not a lot could stop us; we carried on meeting throughout World War 2 and even provided teas to the troops working on the seawall during the floods of 1953. Pat was full of so much information, and we loved looking through her collection of pictures to identify our current

members and beloved past members too.



Our next meeting is on the 14th of June in the village hall with Radio Carolines Ray Clark. He'll be telling us all about the true story of the boat that rocked.

This is an open meeting, so anyone can come along. The talk begins at 7:45pm, and tickets cost £5 each on the door.

The Othona Community - Early Summer 2023.

Volunteering brings a community together. Our local villages, Tillingham, St Lawrence, Bradwell on Sea and beyond, all flourish because of those who have the gifts of time, energy and commitment, and who are willing to share these gifts with others. Many do not have these opportunities, as work, home and family responsibilities leave little time to spare, and we all need some relaxation. But for those who have been part of our local communities of volunteers this year, the rewards have been great: from organising events to making them happen, from serving as Councillors to serving tea, all are opportunities to contribute, and to make new friends.



The Othona Community would never have come to being, let alone survived and thrived, without the many hundreds of people who have kept the spirit of community alive for 57 years! In the early days everyone there was a volunteer, from the first organisers with our founder Norman Motley to those who first stayed, helping carry water to the site, cook in a makeshift kitchen area, dig toilet pits and lead challenging discussions in the aftermath of the Second World War. For a while it must have seemed that the world was moving in the right direction, as memories of war faded and we in the West seemed to be heading towards the economic stability that enabled us to develop education, health and social care for all.....or were we?

The Essex Green Weekend, hosted by Othona over the early May Bank Holiday, was a really positive and enjoyable festival of hope...but realistic hope, highlighting many areas where a new direction in life is the only way to sustain our fragile planet. Some 150 people gathered to participate in talks and discussions on ways in which our own lifestyle changes, such as Green Churches and biodynamic farming in harmony with nature, can be small steps to addressing issues of climate change and its consequent global challenges for the world's peoples. Practical demonstrations of scything and hedging, great music from around Essex, and fantastic food cooked by a great team of volunteers, all helped to make the weekend a success.

We have more events coming up in our open Programme – and did you know that outside these times the Community still functions, hosting many groups, celebrations and day visitors, all co-ordinated by our tiny but totally dedicated staff team? Debbie and Richard, our Warden/Managers, need help with all events, from an hour or two helping clean and tidy to regular gardening support as the vegetable plot gets its summer makeover – our meals are always best with our own fruit, veg and herbs. Some volunteers make a regular commitment, while

others are a phone call away from helping as needed. If you would like to take an active part in the rather unusual aspect of our village life – there is only one other Othona Community Centre in the world – do contact Debbie, Richard or Phil by email or phone, More is coming up on our Programme for the summer. 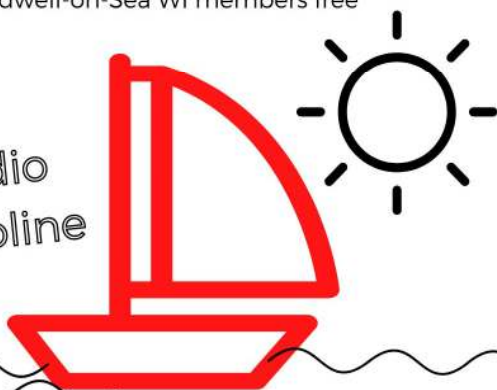

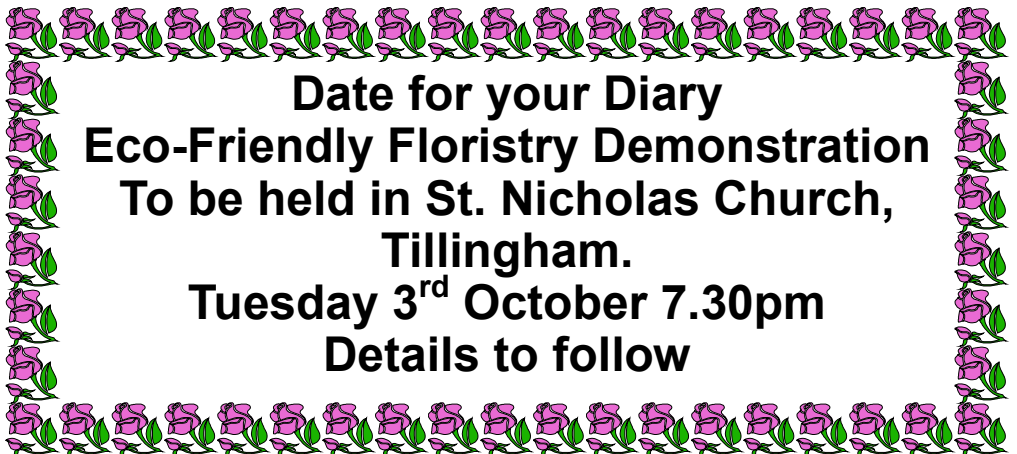
