

### **News from RAF Bradwell Bay**

As we talked about in last months issue, the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of D Day is looming large. RAF Bradwell Bay was not in the forefront of D Day activity, most of which was happening in the South Coast. Two squadrons, 605 and 488 had been transferred nearer the South Coast. Two squadrons were left at Bradwell and were needed to provide air cover to the East Coast. They were 124 and 219 Squadrons.

#### **RAF Bradwell Bay Operational Record Book**

- (a) Mainly cloudy with showery conditions, rain more continuous at 1900-2200 hours. Wind W-WNW moderate to fresh. Visibility good.
- (b) "D" DAY and in this area the weather was very poor. 124 Squadron flew 17 patrols without incident.
- (c) 278 Squadron flew 4 ASR patrols west of the main shipping stream crossing the channel and had no incidents. One patrol lasted 7 hours and the final WARWICK landed at 2310 hours.
- (d) A P.R.U. LIGHTNING landed during the evening having tried to photograph PARIS area, and late at night a LIBERATOR came in on its return from bombing.
- (e) During the night 219 Squadron flew 10 patrols without incident.
- (f) 4 Mosquitos of 2 Group landed during the night having bombed and patrolled the roads in and around the beach-head area.

#### 124 Squadron

15 patrols – a full day in which we do 47 "Operational" Spitfire hours. Excitement from towards evening when at 23.15 hours we are briefed for "D" Day.

"D" DAY dawns. Squadron full of expectation, but as the day wears on and as the patrols come back one after another with "nothing to report" we realise that, as far as we are concerned at any rate, it is not our "D" Day. 17 uneventful patrols were flown, including one by the Wing Commander Flying, and one by the C.O.

53 Operational Hours flown.

#### 219 Squadron

Eleven crews flew on NFT's during the day, and at 2200 hours all the crews on duty assembled at "A" Flight and were informed by W/Cdr BOYD that "D" Day was the next morning. Great excitement and keenness was displayed and 9 patrols were carried out at night but nothing untoward occurred.


The great day had arrived. Eleven NFT's were carried out during the afternoon

and in addition F/Lt PARKER flet the Tiger Moth to ABINGDON. Ten uneventful patrols were flown at night.

The Station Commander at the D Day period was George ffoliat Powell-Shedden. He had been a Flight Commander in Douglas Bader's Squadron and at the time of his posting to RAF Bradwell Bay had been the Commander of 96 Squadron but due to a motorcycle accident was unable to fly. He must have been frustrated to miss all the action.



#### Preparing the way for the Messiah

John the Baptist is famous for baptising Jesus, and for losing his head to a woman. He was born to Zechariah, a Temple priest, and Elizabeth, who was a cousin of Mary, the mother of Jesus. John was born when his mother was advanced in years, and after the foretelling of his birth and the choice of his name by an angel, we hear nothing more of him until he began his mission of preaching and baptising in the river Jordan c27. John was a lot like an Old Testament prophet: he lived simply on locusts and honey in the wilderness, and his message was one of repentance and preparation for the coming of the Messiah and His Kingdom. He went on to baptise Jesus, at Jesus' firm request. When John went on to denounce the incestuous union of Herod Antipas with his niece and brother's wife, Herodias, he was imprisoned and eventually beheaded at the demand of Salome, Herodias' daughter.

John is the only saint to be remembered three times in the Christian calendar, in commemoration of his conception, his birth (June 24), and his martyrdom. When John saw Jesus he said that Jesus was the "Lamb of God", and he is the only person to use this expression of Jesus. In art John is often depicted carrying a lamb, or with a lamb near him.
