News from RAF Bradwell Bay

Of course, WW2 was not completely over, that didn't happen until VJ day on 15th August 1945. In the evening, there was a fairly large gathering of the boys in the "Green Man" – one of the local pubs. At midnight, the Prime Minister, Mr. Atlee, broadcast to the nation, and were told that Japan had surrendered. A bonfire was lit on the sleeping site and those in bed were pulled out. In the end, quite a decent fire was got going. Luckily nothing very important found its way into the blaze!

Did this mean that RAF Bradwell Bay returned to peace and quiet? Squadrons did get moved about preparing to disband but the aerodrome did not finally close to all operations until 30th November 1945.

Wing Commander G.D. Stephenson arrived from Tangmere to take over command of the Station. He had been a prisoner of war since Dunkirk and had been in Colditz with his old friend from Cranwell and 23 Squadron, Douglas Bader.

The immediate fate of RAF Bradwell Bay was in a change of function. Bradwell Bay was to become No. 2 Armament Practice school, detailed orders for this change of function were received on 4th July 1945. Bradwell Bay being the ideal choice for this sort of change as since 1938 the Dengie Flats firing range adjacent to the aerodrome had been in operation. After the closure of RAF Bradwell Bay No.2 A.P.S. moved to

RAF Spilsby.

Wednesday, 17th
July, saw the commencement of an
intensive programme of training
comprising, air to air,
air to ground, cinegun, and practice
dive bombing. The
weather for the first
ten days was brilliant
though somewhat
cloudy but thereafter
there was a general



tendency for the weather to close in. Nevertheless, on only one morning was there no flying.

The Dengie firing range continued in use, without an aerodrome and finally closed on 25th August 1965, hopefully bringing peace and quiet to the village.

The RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group has a new Facebook page rafbradwell bay preservation group and our new website www.rafbradwellbay.com.

We are recruiting trustees to work alongside our management committee. If you have skills such as business-related skills, we could use them or if you would like to get involved in this local project.

The RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group seeks to preserve the history of the RAF in Bradwell on Sea. We are planning for a museum near the memorial.

24th June John the Baptist, preparing the way for the Messiah

John the Baptist is famous for baptising Jesus, and for losing his head to a woman. He was born to Zechariah, a Temple priest, and Elizabeth, who was a cousin of Mary, the mother of Jesus. John was born when his mother was advanced in years, and after the foretelling of his birth and the choice of his name by an angel, we hear nothing more of him until he began his mission of preaching and baptising in the river Jordan c27.

John was a lot like an Old Testament prophet: he lived simply on locusts and honey in the wilderness, and his message was one of repentance and preparation for the coming of the Messiah and His Kingdom. He went on to baptise Jesus, at Jesus' firm request. When John went on to denounce the incestuous union of Herod Antipas with his niece and brother's wife, Herodias, he was imprisoned and eventually beheaded at the demand of Salome, Herodias' daughter.

John is the only saint to be remembered three times in the Christian calendar, in commemoration of his conception, his birth (June 24), and his martyrdom. When John saw Jesus he said that Jesus was the "Lamb of God", and he is the only person to use this expression of Jesus. In art John is often depicted carrying a lamb, or with a lamb near him.

There will be children's activities taking place during the day.


The day will finish with a short service before the Pilgrims make their way home at 3.30pm.




