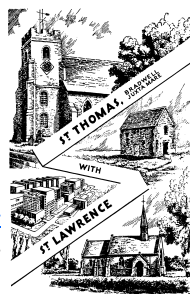

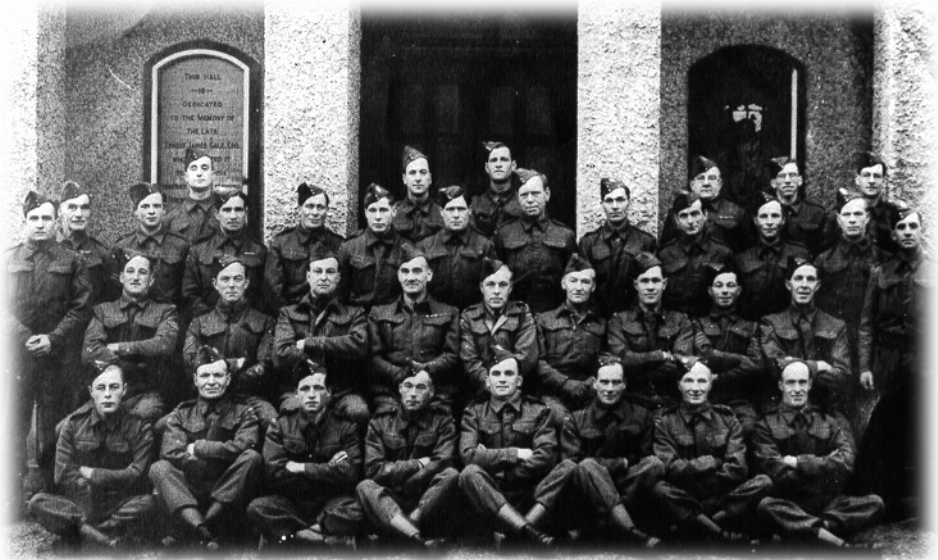

News from RAF Bradwell Bay

The Dengie Peninsular has many WW2 pillboxes, especially near the beaches. They must have been built so strong as they have survived about 80 years, but what were they about. Of course, they were defences primarily against the real threat of invasion. The beaches around the Dengie appear to be a good point for an invasion. However, the Germans had done an enormous survey on Britain and the best prospects for invasion. East Anglia was not favoured by the Germans, as mostly there it was agricultural with little of military value, especially in Essex, Harwich being the only harbour that would have been of use to them. The main distraction point was that the ground was very soft on which to land vehicles, the famous Essex mud and marshes.

However, defence had to be made and the land behind the seawall was mined and the beach covered in barbed wire. There were times when cattle stood on mines and become 'off ration meat'! Who manned the pillboxes? This was shared between the regular army and quite a lot by the Home Guard. For a small village I find it amazing that the home guard had so many members.

As well as local defence there was also the airstrip which could be used to land aeroplanes and gliders on. The solution to this was the RAF bought in many old cars to be laid out on the runway. Most were scrapped, although a few were able to be driven on. They were all immobilised. Just think what a haven this would be today for collectors of vintage cars!

Was this still carried out when the new aerodrome was being constructed, the answer is yes but the runway was obstructed but not sure what with.

On 22nd September a Photo Reconnaissance Unit Spitfire was returning from a mission and suffered engine failure near to RAF Bradwell Bay. The pilot, F/O Rashleigh, reported:

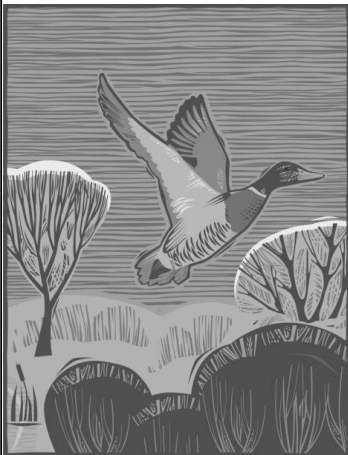
Glided down from above cloud and haze and made a semi-B approach on a runway on Bradwell Bay aerodrome. Saw runway clearly at 1,000 feet observed it to be completely obstructed. Speed and height too slow and low to allow turning steeply onto another runway.so flew straight on and force landed in a field about 300 yards long. Touched down 50 yards inside at about 95 m.p.h. and struck a house at far end of field still travelling very fast.

This was of course while the new aerodrome was under construction. RAF Officers started moving into Bradwell Bay, but the base did not become operational until April 1942.

The RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group seeks to preserve the history of the RAF in Bradwell on Sea. We are planning for a museum near the memorial. You can help by donating via our website www.rafbradwellbay.co.uk

Ivan Moody: born June 11, 1964; died January 18, 2024

Many people in the village will not remember Ivan Moody but we knew him when we moved into Bradwell in 1982 and joined the church choir. We sang together for many years, even performing some of his early compositions.

Ivan went on to become a renowned composer, conductor and musicologist. He was drawn to the music, spirituality and liturgy of the Orthodox Church, whose music and faith was to play a foundational part in his own compositions and life.



Ivan held various academic posts, including Professor of Church Music at the University of Eastern Finland from 2012 to 2014, and worked extensively as a conductor. A onetime member of the choir of the Russian Orthodox Cathedral in London, he subsequently served as cantor in both Greek and Bulgarian parishes in Lisbon. In 2007 he was ordained to the priesthood, becoming rector of the Serbian Orthodox Parish of the Transfiguration in Estoril, Portugal.

Ivan’s mother, Maude, died last year and our thoughts are with Maddy, mourning the loss of both brother and mother.

An introduction to Beatrix Potter with Andrew Wiltshire

For our February meeting, we were joined by Andrew Wiltshire, our speaker from the Beatrix Potter Society, for an introduction to the much-loved writer, illustrator, and conservationist. We all learnt so much about Beatrix and the inspiration behind her works. She was not only the author of 'The Tale of Peter Rabbit' and other classics but also a landscape and natural history artist, diarist, farmer and preservationist. She was responsible for preserving large areas of the Lake District through her gifts to the National Trust. Naturally, we also heard about the Peter Rabbit books themselves. Beatrix wrote illustrated letters to the son of her governess, who had been very unwell, to cheer him up. In those letters, she told the story of 'four little rabbits'. She was encouraged to turn the series of letters into a book, and 'The Tale of Peter Rabbit' was born. It has never been out of print since it was first published in 1902, has sold over 100 million copies and has been translated into over 36 languages!

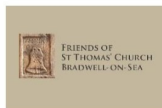


Our next meeting is on the 13th of March in the village hall where we will be introduced to decoupage by our very talented member Carol.
