



Butterflies of Curry Farm with Stephen Dewick

This month we were joined by Stephen Dewick for his beautifully illustrated talk, "Butterflies of Curry Farm." It quickly became clear that Stephen's interest is far more than a hobby, his meticulous record keeping and attention to detail showed real dedication, and his love for butterflies was evident.

He showed us images of a wide variety of butterflies including speckled wood, marbled white, red admiral, gatekeeper and peacock. Some species have only the subtlest differences between them, requiring a very keen eye to tell them apart. The rarest butterfly Stephen has recorded at Curry Farm is the scarce tortoiseshell, a particularly special sighting!



There have been trials and tribulations along the way, as capturing the perfect photograph is rarely straightforward! Butterflies often vanished at the crucial moment, and on one memorable occasion Stephen even found himself hanging precariously over the pond in pursuit of the perfect shot!

It was a fascinating and thoughtful evening, leaving us with a greater appreciation for the delicate creatures we so often see fluttering around our gardens.

Our next meeting is on the 11th of March in the village hall, where we will be joined by Eric Simonelli who will be talking us through the Dengie in World War One.

Kevin and I shared a couple of expeditions to the National Archives in Kew, which were long days out, but I treasure the memories. You will be missed Kevin. Condolences to Pat and Family.

The RAF Bradwell Bay is going through some positive change. We are working towards changing from a CIC to a CIO, basically this means we will leave companies house and become a charity. This will give us more governance, and we will have a board of Trustees. More about this on our Facebook page and website. The website is currently being redesigned and although I have put the address below it is not published yet...

We thank the Othona Community for hosting our exhibition for the last few years, they are rearranging their accommodation, which unfortunately means we are homeless. We plan to attend the memorial, with our Gazebo as much as possible. We still have the intention of having a museum near to the memorial.

The history of RAF Bradwell Bay must be remembered and respected, we have an extensive archive and are currently researching all the names on the memorial and are working with the Parish Council to update the area.

At Othona we have had the muddiest February anyone can remember, as we've had overflowing land drains coinciding with rising ground-water so there is a loyal group of people in wellies operating pumps, diggers and shovels to sort the problems before the half-term holiday week. Yes, that week will have happened by the time you read this Village View, with sun shining, faces smiling, new friends made and old friendships renewed, sharing time together in Work, Worship, Study and Play - plus plenty of homely meals and many a cuppa and a natter. Passers-by, including local readers of our "Village View," often pop in to catch up with the Othona side of village life: and there is only one other village in the world where you can do that, Burton Bradstock, West Dorset.

A quote from our founder Norman Motley exactly fifty years ago speaks of the need for strong prayer for the work of the Othona Community: "the supreme end of prayer is so to cleave to Him that we begin to identify with His mind.....*prayer does change things*.....God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself. It must be said that the Community will stand or fall at this point." Still it stands, and although we must move forward from Norman's original vision, in a changing world, still his first Christian principles stand. 

World Day of Prayer 2026 Nigeria

Our sisters in Nigeria invite us to join them for the World Day of Prayer on Friday 6 March 2026. The service they have prepared reflects on the theme, "I will give you rest."

The World Day of Prayer is an international, women-led, ecumenical movement that shares the hopes, concerns, and prayers of women from around the globe. Each year, women from a different country craft a service, sharing their unique spiritual journey and culture. For 2026, the women of Nigeria have created a service that speaks to our need for peace and solace, drawing on their faith and experiences in a world filled with struggles and anxieties.

The preparation for this day is extensive. The writing country and theme are chosen years in advance, and the service then travels to the international committee in New York for translation and dissemination to national committees in over 120 participating countries. From there it is adapted and shared locally, culminating in gatherings at hundreds of churches every March.

This day is a powerful demonstration of global solidarity. It begins in Samoa and moves across the world in a continuous wave of prayer, finishing 38 hours later in American Samoa. It truly is a worldwide day of prayer!

This year our service will be held at St Nicholas Church Tillingham at 10.00am and all are welcome.
