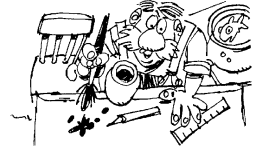

All Change

Well, maybe not quite yet. But March is here, and the birds' behaviour is changing even as I write. Cock Blackbirds are on edge when there are two of them together – only one will be able to hold onto a territory. Our Curlews will be heading north to their breeding grounds in upland England and further afield. That evocative grunting of Brent Geese floating on the breeze from the river will gradually lessen, as they make their way back to Scandinavia and Iceland. Even 'our' Robins may well have been conversing in German or Dutch as they came to sample our food supply, and will be returning 'home' over the North Sea – though I do like to think this one is truly a resident, being so tame as to almost feed from my hand.



Now we can look forward to our summer migrants. I took this photograph of a Whitethroat just before he departed last autumn. He has probably spent the winter in Mediterranean warmth – insects don't hibernate there – and towards the end of the month or early in April will be back, looking to feast on our emerging food supply, and to finding a good nest site, low down in some rough undergrowth. Our true long-distance travellers will already have begun their journey from South Africa - later in March our first Swallow may well grace our skies and start checking out the beams and rafters of the barn – maybe repairing last year's nest.



The true harbinger of summer will be one of the last to put in an appearance. Radio-tagged Cuckoos have started to make their journeys from equatorial west Africa, but we will have to wait until later in April for that soul-lifting call from across the fields, confirming that "Sumer is icumen in".

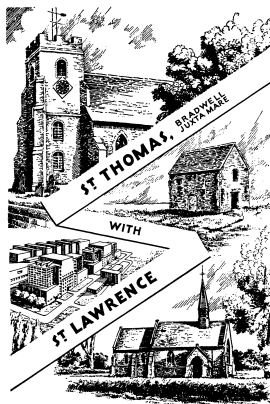

Sylvia has been a professional painter and textile artist for more than forty years and is delighted to be showing her textile art in Maldon where she attended the Plume school in the 1970's.

The works include a wall hanging of a phoenix, over 2 meters high, which was created in 2021 during lockdown. The unique artworks, both large and small, are created with remnants from the Sudbury silk factories as well as kimono silk and are either hand or machine stitched.

Sylvia is member of Art Textiles: Made in Britain, a small group of textile artists who exhibit together throughout the UK. She has had textile pieces accepted for exhibition at the Tokamachi Quilt Festival Japan, Austria in 2019 and recently at The Bankside Gallery, London.

St Lawrence Bay WI

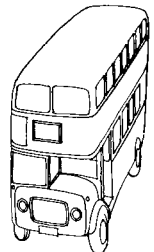

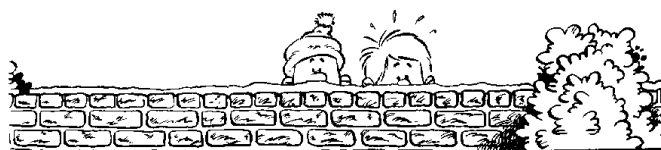
