Dear Friends,

As we move into May, we continue the Easter season in the Church until Pentecost, which is on Sunday 19th May. In the run up to Pentecost, there is Ascension Day on Thursday 9th May, where our new Area Bishop Adam is going to Bless and Dedicate the new clock at St Thomas Church in Bradwell on Sea at 5pm.

Also, over the past few years during these 10 days, an initiative called Thy Kingdom Come (TKC) has started, which is a global ecumenical prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray from Ascension to Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus.

Every person, household and church are encouraged to pray during the 10 days in their own way. Specifically, we again invite each and every Christian across the globe to pray that God's Spirit might work in the lives of people who have not responded with their 'Yes' to God's call. Whether you have joined in 'Thy Kingdom Come' before or not, we invite you to take part & join in.

Tabitha used the pieces to illustrate her story about an elderly lady that has discovered her childhood doll in the loft and was recalling the wonderful childhood she had with her sister. Tabitha explained that she had completed the work when she was in the midst of losing her dad and used it as an outlet for her grief. News from RAF Bradwell Bay

Unfortunately, our planned commemorations of the 80th anniversary of D Day have had to be cancelled due to a lack of support. The only part of this commemoration is the event on D Day. On 6th June, Churchill will narrate through the day's events at The Green Man followed by a lighting of a bonfire on the sea wall. Watch out on Facebook and posters to get more details.



Research into RAF Bradwell Bay continues. As well as the RAF presence I am also researching the wartime history of the village. This includes the local civil defence organisations, such as the Home Guard, ARP services, observer Corps. The 1939 register of Bradwell on Sea is useful as it tells who lived there and families, ages etc. The enumerator was helpful in the fact that they have unofficially recorded organisations such as the above, in the margins.

Essex Record Office has the civil defence records for the Eastern command, which I am currently copying, and will tell of some fascinating incidents in the area.

Another little know source is the 1941-43 National Farm Survey. Each farm in the parish had to fill in forms giving

the land usage, number of animals farmed, and mechanical vehicles used as well as conditions of farm buildings. This will show how Bradwell supported the war by food production.

Another source is that of newspapers, events such as dances held in aid of various groups and Spitfire funds. These will all lead to a picture of life and war

in Bradwell on Sea.

I intend to publish this in a book which will combine the story of the RAF at Bradwell, including the Dengie Flats Firing range as well as the building of the large aerodrome that became know as RAF Bradwell Bay, so hopefully the book on RAF Bradwell Bay, will not just be a story of bombs and bullets, but

the whole story of Bradwell's contribution to the war.

The RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group seeks to preserve the history of the RAF in Bradwell on Sea. We are planning for a museum near the memorial. You can help by donating via our website www.rafbradwellbay.co.uk

Rogation Sunday May 5th

In the Anglican Church, Rogation is celebrated on the fifth Sunday after Easter. Rogation means an asking of God – for blessing on the seed and land for the year ahead. It is appropriate in any emergency, war, plague, drought or foul weather.

The practice began with the Romans, who invoked the help of the gods Terminus and Ambarvalia. In those days a crowd moved in procession around the cornfields, singing and dancing, sacrificing animals, and driving away Winter with sticks. They wanted to rid the cornfields of evil.

In about 465 the Western world was suffering from earthquake, storm and epidemic. So Mamertius, Bishop of Vienne, aware of the popular pagan custom, ordered that prayers should be said in the ruined or neglected fields on the days leading up to Ascension. With his decision, 'beating the bounds' became a Christian ceremonial.



Rogation-tide arrived in England early in the eighth century and became a fixed and perennial asking for help of the Christian God. On Rogation-tide, a little party would set out to trace the boundaries of the parish. At the head marched the bishop or the priest, with a minor official bearing a Cross, and after them the people of the parish, with schoolboys and their master trailing along. Most of them held slender wands of willow.

At certain points along the route – at well-known

landmarks like a bridge or stile or ancient tree, the Cross halted, the party gathered about the priest, and a litany or rogation is said, imploring God to send seasonable wealth, keep the corn and roots and boughs in good health, and bring them to an ample harvest. At some point beer and cheese would be waiting.

In the days when maps were neither common nor accurate, there was much to be said for 'beating the bounds.' It was still very common as late as the reign of Queen Victoria. Certainly, parish boundaries rarely came into dispute, for everyone knew them. (Do you know yours today?)

Come and enjoy our Rogation Rally Service at St Thomas's Church on Sunday 5th May starting at 10.00am from the church.

There will be a short service in the churchyard and then we will move on to a farm. After a short service at the farm we will move onto the Sailing Club for a shortened Communion Service and Refreshments. Please come along . All are welcome.

Pentecost May 19th

You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you and you will be witnesses to me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth" Acts 1:8

We all get tired and battle weary sometimes. The disciples of Jesus had just been through a three-year long roller coaster adventure with Jesus that had culminated in His death, resurrection and ascension into heaven.

The range of emotions would have been hugely taxing in the days leading up to Pentecost, as they remembered Jesus weeping in the garden of Gethsemane, betrayed by Judas, brutally beaten and crucified, and then dead and buried. Then there had been the shock and awe of finding out that He was alive again! But then He had left them again, to return to His Father. By the time the day of Pentecost arrived, the disciples would indeed have welcomed some fresh spiritual fire!

For us today, many of us have felt emotionally drained with the uncertainties caused by Covid 19, the worry of prices rising at an alarming rate, and now the pain and uncertainty of what will happen in the war in Ukraine.

So, what better day to pray for fresh spiritual fire for each of us? As we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and birth of the Church, let us thank God that He will never leave us or forsake us.



We are hoping to have talks on wildflowers and trees in the future.


We meet in the village hall on the fourth Wednesday in the month, starting at 7.30pm.
