# Remembrance Sunday in the parish of Bradwell-on-Sea at St Thomas' Church on 13th November 2022



This year the Rector, Choir, Parishioners and the Motorbikers are gathering at the Bradwell Airfield memorial at 10:20 for the laying of wreaths and prayers.

The choir and parishioners will them walk in procession behind the Crucifer (Cross bearer) to the village to be at the church for 10:50 for the two-minute silence and service, the Motorbikers will stay at the memorial for the silence.

At the end of the service the Motorbikers meet all the church for the final blessing and then sing the national anthem at the parish churchyard memorial.

All are then welcome to stay for a chat and coffee the church.



# Tales from RAF Bradwell Bay

On the 30th of January 1945 a hole appeared in a runway at RAF Bradwell Bay ...... the CO was looking into it.

Joking aside a V2 rocket hit a runway and left a massive crater. Luckily no one was killed or injured. The entry in the Operational Record Book states:

A V2 landed on the NW/SE runway at approximately 1534 hours making a crater 25 yards wide and approximately the same depth. No casualties were caused, and only slight damage to buildings nearby. The Works Flight began immediate repairs and worked through the night under very trying conditions (i.e. wind and snow). P/O GREEN, i/c Works Flight tackled this job in a praiseworthy manner.

All personnel on the Station were engaged in clearing the main runway of snow which was serviceable for night flying at 1630 hours.

RAF Bradwell Bay played a big part in defence from V1 and V2 flying bombs. Both by sending aircraft to intercept and by the AA defences. The operations to intercept the V1 Bombs were known as 'Diver Patrols'. They must have been very nerve racking for the pilots, who had to get their wing underneath the V1 and tip it off its

course towards London.

The hole on runway 2 could not be repaired and eventually trees were planted, which can be seen opposite the sign for runway 2.

This V2 Rocket was brought back from Germany at the end of the Second World War, and after display at the Royal Aircraft Establishment, Farnborough, was transferred to the Museum in 1946. The alcohol and oxygen tanks can be seen, as can the rocket engine itself (note that one half of the outer skin has been fretted to reveal the tanks, and two of the fins have been removed, exposing the engine See www.rafbradwellbay.co.uk

The mobile library visits villages and communities the length and breadth of Essex


every three weeks. Any library member can borrow or return books and other items there.
