We will remember them.



Harvesting continues at both Othona Centres; in Dorset, where the ancient walled garden has merged into the newer orchard, and hives of bees provide a flow of



honey - and here in Essex, where squashes are now in store, and grapes from that amazing vine over the stoep are pressed for delicious juice.

Worship together at St Peter's Chapel holds the whole Community together in God's love, spanning time and space: back to the earliest **time** of Christian fellowship in Essex in the seventh century – and **place** to worship in Bradwell, as in the chapel at our sister Community in Dorset, and in the hearts of all who have been touched by the spirit of Othona. Over time, so many people come and go; I am sure you will all remember people you have met in past years, from Wardens to those who have served in the Bradwell Community shop. As summer volunteers have left us, we have been joined by more short-term helpers, our young volunteers Flo and Paul from the French Civic Service, and Jeann and Mikaela, a couple from Brazil: life is never dull at Othona! Long-term volunteers now have improved accommodation, as Plum Corner (formerly the Men's Hut) is renovated to provide two ensuite rooms.

Exactly 50 years ago this month, Othona's founder Norman Motley wrote: "We must be available to help the helpers, to renew the renewers, to be a centre of healing for healers.....to serve some of the casualties of our times- particularly the young..." Othona is a strange blend of "helpers" and "helped" because there are times when those who came to help find themselves receiving help; and those who came in need of help find themselves helping others in the Community.

All are welcome to visit Othona to volunteer, to join in the programmed activities, or just visit for a cuppa. We particularly love to see local people who come and share time, join in the programme as day visitors, or enjoy a meal. As the weather gets chillier and we look towards Christmas, if you or anyone you know would like to join the Community for a warming meal and good company, just ring to let us know when you would like to come, if the Programme says "full" there is always space for non-residential visits – and that includes Christmas Day, celebrating the birth of Jesus together.

All Souls Day 2nd November

The early Church was slow to dedicate a liturgical day to offering prayers and masses to commemorate the faithful departed. But in time prayers were offered on behalf of dead monks, that they might attain 'the Beatific Vision' through purification, which the Church later described as Purgatory. Odilo, the powerful abbot of Cluny, (d 1049) decreed that All Souls' Day should follow the feast of All Saints' Day.

At least four ancient English dedications are known, the most famous of which are All Souls College, Oxford and the church in Langham Place in London.

In bygone centuries All Souls' Day was certainly uncomfortable for anyone who had wronged a person who had then died. For it was believed that souls in purgatory could appear on earth on this day, in the form of ghosts, witches or toads, to haunt anyone who had wronged them in life.

On a more cheerful note, it was also believed that you could help the dead on this day by almsgiving in cash or in kind. Some of these beliefs seem to have been caught up in the popular customs of Hallowe'en.

When the Reformation came, the Protestants disregarded the idea of Purgatory, and this feast day remained with the Roman Catholic Church.

News from RAF Bradwell Bay Remembrance

Across the country on 12th November this year Remembrance services for the fallen will take place. It must be remembered that this includes all wars. Bradwell on Sea has a memorial in the church yard, covering both world wars. There is also a unique memorial on the site of the airfield known as RAF Bradwell Bay. The memorial has 121 names recorded but there are some people that are not on there, yet.

I would also like to remember those who survived but may have been scarred for life, both mentally and physically. There were rest centres where aircrew could be sent for a break. An example of this is in the 418 Squadron Operational Record Book when on 28 August 1942 2 Aircrew were sent for a rest.

Sergeant Chabot and Sergeant Dickie went to Dudbrook Hall Rest Centre under the plan to send all pilots of this Squadron to this centre beginning today.

Dudbrook Hall was a large house near Pilgrims Hatch, just outside Brentwood. It survives today as a care home for elderly people.

Civilians were also injured on the airfield, on 1st September 1943 contractors were working on the site installing the fog landing system know as FIDO. A Mr Schofield



crossed the runway, despite instructions telling him not to. He was hit by a Mosquito aircraft an received what today would be termed life changing injuries. He was severely injured, the four fingers of his left and the thumb had been severed. Two fingers of his right hand were injured, and he was suffering from a head injury and shock.

Post Traumatic Stress Disorder is a

diagnosis only fairly recently used, but the condition has been known for many years in WW1 the term was shell shock, the Chelsea Hospital was built by Charles 11 as a refuge for ex-soldiers. The Othona Community was started by an ex-RAF Chaplain who recognised the stress people had gone through.

The RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group seeks to preserve the history of the RAF in Bradwell on Sea. We are planning for a museum near the memorial. You can help by donating via our website <u>www.rafbradwellbay.co.uk</u>

New Archdeacons of Chelmsford appointed

The Bishop of Chelmsford, the Rt Revd Dr Guli Francis-Dehqani has announced the appointments of the new Archdeacons of Chelmsford.

The Revd Jonathan Croucher will become the new Archdeacon of Chelmsford, succeeding the Venerable Elizabeth Snowden who retired in October last year. Jonathan currently serves in the Diocese of Southwark where he is Vicar of Christ Church Gipsy Hill, Priest in Charge of Emmanuel West Dulwich and Area Dean of Lambeth South.

Commenting on his appointment as Archdeacon of Chelmsford, the Revd Jonathan



Croucher said:

"I am delighted to have been invited by Bishop Guli to serve as Archdeacon of Chelmsford. I grew up, was educated, came to faith and was married in the Bradwell Episcopal Area so I have a real sense of coming home. I am greatly looking forward to working with Archdeacon Mike and Bishop (designate) Adam in serving the clergy and parishes of the Area and particularly getting to know and getting involved with the people and churches across the Chelmsford


Archdeaconry. It has been a privilege and joy to serve the wonderful community of Gipsy Hill for 11 years and to have supported the churches of Lambeth South as Area Dean for the last five years."

Chelmsford Archdeaconry is part of the Bradwell Episcopal Area, where the Venerable Adam Atkinson will become the Bishop of Bradwell in November. Speaking about Jonathan's appointment as Archdeacon of Chelmsford,

A service will be held in November at which Jonathan will be licensed and welcomed to his role as Archdeacons of Chelmsford alongside Adam who will be welcomed as the new Bishop of Bradwell. The intention is for that service to take place on Saturday 4 November. Jonathan will begin his role in November.

About the Revd Jonathan Croucher

The Revd Jonathan Croucher was ordained in 2004 whilst working as a partner and then COO of a European law firm, Taylor Wessing LLP. He served as a self supporting minister at the Church of the Good Shepherd and St Peter, Lee in the Diocese of Southwark between 2004 and 2008 before joining St Michael and All Angels Blackheath Park where he moved into full time parish ministry. He has served as Vicar at Christ Church Gipsy Hill since 2012, with additional responsibility as Priest in Charge of Emmanuel West Dulwich since 2021. Jonathan was Area Dean for Lambeth South for five years from 2018 and is currently the Chair of Trustees of St Augustine's College of Theology. He is married to Yvette and they have four children who are at (or have recently left) university.
