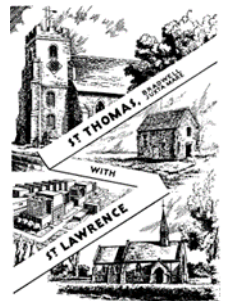

History and restoration of The Forge with David Thorpe



For our October meeting, we were joined by David Thorpe, who gave us captivating talk about the history and restoration process of The Forge in the High Street.

We were shown pictures of the Forge from the early 1900's when it was still being used by skilled Blacksmiths, including the last blacksmith to use it, Stanley Banks. It wasn't too surprising to see that the village hadn't changed that much at all in that time!



David then led us through the highs and lows of the restoration journey, sharing the numerous challenges he faced, including damp, woodworm infestations, and the very real concern of a collapsing roof.

Yet, through all the challenges, it remains clear that the restoration has been a true labour of love. His work on the forge is more than just a restoration; it's a heartfelt gift to the village, preserving a piece of our local history for future generations to enjoy.

The Othona Community

As we leave autumn behind us, leaves are still falling and God's tiny creatures are looking for places to hide themselves away for the winter. At Othona we opt to live in harmony with all creatures great and small - from those cheeky muntjack deer who pop out from the thickets, to the newts spending spring time with the tiniest pond life, but by winter curling up under a damp log alongside the mini beasts on land. Here our Coastal Park stretches

down to the sea where, as you cross the sea wall with its variety of vegetation offering cover for mammals and food for insects, the wonderfully adapted shore plants merge with the sea-weeds, in pools where children love to discover the variety of shells, crabs and tiny fishes. Nature is wonderful, and sometimes needs a bit of help.

In October we had a lively Working Weekend, with Othona regulars and newer faces coming together to do some clearing and tidying - but not too much. Some people were harvesting and preserving, others continuing with the rewilding of much of the 11 acres of former farmland, now a tree-edged flower meadow with a new pond for newts and other natural incomers, created through a scheme for offsetting the carbon footprint of a local business. Nature is not always allowed to get its way, and as cracks in our track started to offer homes for pretty little plants, these were cleared away to avoid major damage, and cold fill tarmac applied. With all this hard work the volunteers were all well sustained with by the delicious cooking, appreciating the creativity of our cooks. Lou and Quentin continue to offer support as volunteers from France, often working in the kitchen, or to support the various other needs of the Community. Autumn continued with a Retreat with Revd. Emma Wylie, on Rest and Reflection, a weekend of Preserve and Sauerkraut making, then our ever-popular Half Term Family Activity Week. "Children and young people need love and stability. Are we doing all we can to uphold and sustain parents and others who carry the responsibility for providing this care?" This is a quote from Quakers "Advices and Queries" and aptly applies to the work of Othona too.

Othona Essex is seeking a new resident cook/caterer now that Phil has moved on; and you may have heard that at our AGM in September Debbie and Richard announced that they would be leaving us in May after several years on the resident team, the last three as Warden/Managers. They will be greatly missed as very dear people, as well as for the gentle but very effective way they have lead Othona out of the Covid era, sustaining and nurturing the Christian ethos of Work,



Worship, Study and Play that unifies our diverse mix of people of all faiths and none. Othona is outward looking, always glad to bring in new people to share Community time, and new groups who have their own needs, from youth groups to new curates, from orchestras to those who seek peace to meditate.

News from RAF Bradwell Bay

Surprisingly the parish cemetery in Bradwell on Sea has only one grave from the airbase RAF Bradwell Bay, we do know the location of other burials and commemorations. The grave in Bradwell Cemetery is that of William Marshall Poupore. William Poupore died on 6th October 1942.

P/O William Poupore was the pilot on an air to sea firing exercise on the Dengie Flats. The Observer, F/O Frederick William Turvey was killed, and the Gunner Daniel Arthur Forestall received injuries, Shock, immersion, and minor injuries.



The mission, authorised by the "A" Flight Commander S/Ldr M.E.Reid. The pilot was detailed to carry out Front Gun practice on a sea marker.

The 418 Operational Record Book entry for the day states:

P/O W.M. Poupore (RCAF – Pilot) and P/O Turvey (RCAF – Navigator) were killed in a crash near to Dengie Flats whilst carrying out air firing practice. Sgt. Forestall (RCAF – Air Gunner) escaped with minor injuries. F/Lt E.T.M. Duggan assumed position of Squadron Adjutant vice F/Lt A.C. Wilson, on leave prior to posting to No. 423 Squadron, R.C.A.F. Normal day flying carried out. No Operations or other practice night flying.

The aircraft was seen to go into a dive and the pilot either was not able to pull out or was too late to pull out. The aircraft crashed into the sea and caught fire. This occurred at 15.20.

A Walrus amphibian air sea rescue aircraft attended the scene and the Station Commander at this time was Wing Commander Russell Faulkner "Digger" Aitken, who had vast experience of air sea rescue said this of the rescue attempts: This was a brilliant piece of rescue work on the part of the Walrus aircraft and the crew. Although the aircraft was on fire managed to save one member of the crew who now alive and well.

I agree with the remarks of the Squadron Commander.

P/O Poupore and P/O Turvey were both dead, they were extracted from the aircraft and taken to RAF Bradwell Bay. Sgt Forestell was taken to the RAF Hospital at Ely, where he made a full recovery.

Sgt Forestell following his recovery was transferred to 278 Squadron which was a search and rescue squadron. Sadly, he was lost on a mission, to search for a downed Spitfire and its pilot, on 4th April 1943 when the Anson of which he was crew failed to return.

P/O Poupore's father was a Squadron Leader in the RCAF W E Poupore of Western Air Command Victoria B.C. Poupore's parents agreed for their son to be buried in Bradwell Cemetery.

P/O Turvey's mother lived in Saskatchewan Canada. The family had relatives in London who claimed the body and he was buried in St. Pancras Cemetery near Paddington London.

The RAF Bradwell Bay Preservation Group seeks to preserve the history of the RAF in Bradwell on Sea. We are planning for a museum near the memorial.

All Souls' Day – a time of reckoning with the past

The early Church was slow to dedicate a liturgical day to offering prayers and masses to commemorate the faithful departed. But in time prayers were offered on behalf of dead monks, that they might attain 'the Beatific Vision' through purification, which the Church later described as Purgatory. Odilo, the powerful abbot of Cluny, (d 1049) decreed that All Souls' Day should follow the feast of All Saints' Day.

At least four ancient English dedications are known, the most famous of which are All Souls College, Oxford and the church in Langham Place in London.

In bygone centuries All Souls' Day was certainly uncomfortable for anyone who had wronged a person who had then died. For it was believed that souls in purgatory could appear on earth on this day, in the form of ghosts, witches or toads, to haunt anyone who had wronged them in life.

On a more cheerful note, it was also believed that you could help the dead on this day by almsgiving in cash or in kind. Some of these beliefs seem to have been caught up in the popular customs of Hallowe'en.

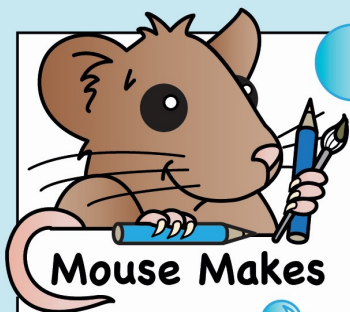

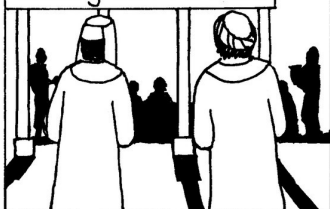
